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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new section, designated §16-5P-15, relating
12	to establishing an in-home care registry; defining terms;
13	requiring the Bureau of Senior Services to develop and
14	maintain the registry; providing legislative rule-making
15	authority to the bureau; and specifying certain requirements
16	to be provided in the legislative rule.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
19	by adding thereto a new section, designated $\$16-5P-15$ , to read as
20	follows:
21	<u>§16-5P-15. Establishment of In-home Care Registry.</u>
22	(a) There is established within the Bureau of Senior Services
23	an in-home care worker registry which is to be maintained by the
24	bureau. The purpose of the registry is to provide the public a
25	list of in-home care workers who voluntarily agree to be included
26	and their qualifications, who have passed a criminal background

1 <u>check.</u>

2 (b) "In-home care worker" means an unlicensed person who 3 provides personal care or other services and supports to persons 4 with disabilities or to the elderly in order to enhance their 5 well-being and which involves face-to-face direct contact with the 6 person. Functions performed may include but are not limited to 7 assistance and training in activities of daily living, personal 8 care services, and job-related supports.

9 <u>(c) The bureau shall propose rules for legislative approval</u> 10 <u>in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter</u> 11 <u>twenty-nine-a of this code, to establish the following:</u>

12 (1) The registry of in-home care workers;

13 (2) The requirements for inclusion on the registry as an 14 <u>'in-home care worker</u>,' including educational attainment;

15 <u>(3) A fee schedule of proposed rates for those services and</u> 16 <u>supports provided by the in-home care worker based upon</u> 17 <u>qualifications of the in-home care workers such as educational</u> 18 attainment;

19 <u>(4) Requirement of completion and passage of a criminal</u> 20 <u>background check. Should an in-home care worker be included on the</u> 21 <u>list with a criminal history indicated on his or her criminal back</u> 22 <u>ground check, such information will be noted on the registry. A</u> 23 <u>person may not be removed from the registry if the criminal</u> 24 <u>background check reveals any negative information;</u>

25 (5) How a person obtains information from the registry; and,
26 (6) Any other requirement necessary to implement the

1 provisions of this section.
