10 A BILL to amend and reenact article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of 11 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating generally to the 12 promulgation of administrative rules by the various executive 13 administrative agencies and the procedures relating mandate or authorization 14 thereto; legislative for 15 promulgation of certain legislative rules; authorizing certain 16 of the agencies to promulgate certain legislative rules in the 17 form that the rules were filed in the State Register; 18 authorizing certain of the agencies to promulgate certain 19 legislative rules with various modifications presented to and 20 recommended by the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee; 21 authorizing certain of the agencies to promulgate certain 22 legislative rules as amended by the Legislature; authorizing 23 certain of the agencies to promulgate certain legislative 24 rules with various modifications presented to and recommended 25 by the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and as amended 26 by the Legislature; authorizing the Board of Dental Examiners 27 to promulgate a legislative rule relating to fees established by the Board; authorizing the Board of Accountancy to 28
