11	A BILL to amend and reenact §21-3D-1, §21-3D-2, §21-3D-3, §21-3D-4
12	and §21-3D-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
13	all relating to crane operator certification; redefining the
14	term "crane;" expanding the type of equipment for which
15	certification is required to operate; requiring adherence to
16	standards established by the Occupational Safety and Health
17	Administration of the United States Department of Labor;
18	eliminating the dual classification system as of November 10,
19	2014; authorizing the Commissioner of Labor to issue notices
20	to cease and desist unlawful practices; authorizing the
21	Commissioner of Labor to apply to the circuit court for
22	injunctive relief; limiting reciprocity provisions; and
23	deleting obsolete provisions.
24	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
25	That §21-3D-1, §21-3D-2, §21-3D-3, §21-3D-4 and §21-3D-9 of
26	the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and

1 reenacted, all to read as follows:

2 ARTICLE 3D. CRANE OPERATOR CERTIFICATION ACT.

3 §21-3D-1. Definitions.

4 For purposes of this article:

5 (a) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Division of6 Labor, or his or her authorized representative.

7 (b) "Crane" means a power-operated hoisting machine used in 8 construction, demolition or excavation work, which has a power-9 operated winch and load line and a power-operated boom that moves 10 laterally by the rotation of the machine on a carrier, and which 11 has a manufacturer's rated lifting capacity of five tons or more 12 <u>than two thousand pounds.</u> "Crane" does not mean a forklift, digger 13 derrick truck, bucket truck or any vehicle, aircraft or helicopter, 14 or equipment which does not have a power-operated winch and load 15 line.

16 (c) "Emergency basis" means an occurrence of an event, 17 circumstance or situation that presents an imminent threat to 18 persons or property and constitutes a serious health or safety 19 hazard.

20 (d) "Employer" means any person, firm, corporation or other 21 entity who hires or permits any individual to work.

(e) "Employee" means any individual employed by an employerand also as defined by the commissioner.

(f) "Tower crane" means a crane in which a boom, swinging jib,
or other structural member is mounted on a vertical mast or tower.
(g) "Training or training course" means a course approved by

1 the commissioner which includes some form of testing throughout, or 2 a final written examination or practical test, or both, which 3 ensures, or tends to ensure that learning has occurred and that the 4 objectives of the training have been realized. The commissioner 5 will evaluate whether the approved training adequately demonstrates 6 competency to safely operate cranes.

7 §21-3D-2. Certification required; exemptions.

8 (a) A person may not operate a crane or tower crane without 9 certification issued under this article except for those persons 10 exempted under subsection (b) of this section.

11 (b) A person is not required to obtain certification under 12 this article if the person:

13 (1) Is a member of the <u>Department of Defense or</u> Armed Forces 14 of the United States or an employee of the United States, when such 15 member or employee is engaged in the work of a crane operator 16 exclusively for such governmental unit; or

17 (2) Is primarily an operator of farm machinery who is 18 performing the work of a crane operator as part of an agricultural 19 operation; or

20 (3) Is operating a crane on an emergency basis; or

(4) Is operating a crane for personal use and not for profit22 on the site of real property which the person owns or leases; or

(5) Is <u>an Operator-in-Training</u> under the direct supervision of
 24 a certified crane operator and:

(A) Who is enrolled in an industry recognized in-housetraining course based on the American National Standards Institute

1 Standards for Crane Operators and who is employed by the entity 2 that either taught the training course or contracted to have the 3 training course taught, all of which is approved by the 4 commissioner; or

5 (B) Who is enrolled in an apprenticeship program or training 6 program for crane operators approved by the United States 7 Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training;

8 (6) Is an employee of and operating a crane at the direction 9 of any manufacturing plant or other industrial establishment, 10 including any mill, factory, tannery, paper or pulp mill, mine, 11 colliery, breaker or mineral processing operation, quarry, refinery 12 or well or is an employee of and operating a crane at the direction 13 of the person, firm or corporation who owns or is operating such 14 plant or establishment;

15 (7) Is an employee of a public utility operating a crane to 16 perform work in connection with facilities used to provide a public 17 service under the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission, 18 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission or Federal Communications 19 Commission; or

20 (8) Is operating timbering harvesting machinery associated 21 with the production of timber and the manufacturing of wood 22 products.

23 §21-3D-3. Powers and duties of commissioner.

24 (a) The commissioner shall:

(a) (1) Propose rules for legislative approval in accordance
 with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this

1 code, which rules at the minimum must include provisions for:

2 (1) (A) A Class A certification of program for individuals who 3 operate cranes or tower cranes in the State of West Virginia, which 4 certification process must include must require both a written 5 examination and a practical demonstration, and which must utilize 6 standards no less restrictive than those prescribed be accredited 7 by the American society of mechanical engineers/American National 8 Standards Institute Safety Code and Institute's Personnel 9 Certification Accreditation standards; as of the effective date of 10 this article: Provided, That the rule governing the practical 11 examination must be a separate rule and provide for the 12 implementation of the practical examination on or before July 1, 13 2001: Provided, however, That the successful completion of a 14 training course approved by the commissioner may be substituted for 15 the written examination and for the practical demonstration as set 16 forth in section four of this article. Program;

17 (B) A Class B certification program for individuals who 18 operate cranes or tower cranes in the State of West Virginia, which 19 must require the successful completion of a training course;

20 (2) (C) Certification categories including lattice boom truck 21 cranes; lattice boom crawler cranes; fixed cab-telescoping boom 22 cranes; swing cab-telescoping boom cranes; and tower cranes: 23 *Provided*, That the holders of a certification for the large 24 telescoping boom crane, upon application for recertification, will 25 be provided with a one time election to either be certified as an 26 operator of a fixed-cab or swing-cab telescoping boom crane, and

1 that holders of a certification for the small telescoping boom 2 crane, upon application for recertification, will be automatically 3 certified as a fixed cab operator;

4 (3) (D) Class A certification renewal requirements of 5 individuals who operate cranes in the State of West Virginia, that 6 may not be more restrictive than those prescribed for the 7 individual's initial certification, but must include a written 8 examination and a current physician's certificate at least every 9 five years; *Provided*, That and

10 <u>(E) Class B certification renewal requirements of individuals</u> 11 who operate cranes in the State of West Virginia, that must include 12 the successful completion of a training course approved by the 13 commissioner; may be substituted for the written examination.

14 (b) (2) Prescribe application forms for original and renewal 15 certification;

16 (c) (3) Set application fees in amounts that are reasonable 17 and necessary to defray the costs of the administration of this 18 article in an amount not to exceed \$75 per year;

19 (d) (4) Set examination and training course fees in an amount 20 not to exceed the actual cost of the examination and the training 21 course;

22 (e) (5) Administer or cause to be administered the written 23 examination, practical demonstrations and the training course as 24 required for certification;

25 (f) (6) Determine the standards for acceptable performance on 26 the written examination, practical demonstration and the required

1 training course: Provided, That the minimum standards must be 2 consistent with national standards, current operating procedures 3 and technology and be transferable to other states where possible; 4 Provided, however, That the commissioner shall develop standards 5 and criteria to establish a dual classification system of 6 certification and implement this dual system of certification no 7 later than January 1, 2001;

8 (g) (7) Provide the option for applicants and crane operators 9 to take examinations that meet or exceed requirements for national 10 crane operator certification; <u>and</u>

11 (h) (8) Take other action as necessary to enforce this 12 article.

13 (b) The commissioner, or his or her designee, upon receipt of 14 information that a person has engaged in or is engaging in an act 15 that constitutes a violation of this article, may issue a notice to 16 the person to cease and desist and may apply to the circuit court 17 for an order enjoining the act. Upon a showing that the person has 18 engaged in or is engaging in an act that constitutes a violation of 19 this article, the court may order an injunction, restraining order 20 or other order as the court considers appropriate.

## 21 §21-3D-4. Minimum certification requirements.

22 (a) The commissioner shall certify an applicant who:

23 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;

(2) Meets the application requirements as prescribed by rule;
(3) Passes the written examination; *Provided*, That any
person who documents at least two thousand hours of on-the-job

1 experience operating a crane during the four years immediately
2 preceding filing for application, or successfully completes a
3 training course approved by the commissioner, and applies for
4 certification no later than September 1, 2001, and meets all other
5 requirements and pays all applicable fees, is entitled to
6 certification without a written examination;

7 (4) Passes the practical demonstration: Provided, That the 8 practical demonstration approved by the commissioner may be 9 administered on-site by a qualified company representative; 10 Provided, however, That any person who documents at least two 11 thousand hours of on-the-job experience operating a crane during 12 the preceding four years next prior to filing for application or 13 the successful completion of a training course approved by the 14 commissioner is entitled to certification without a practical 15 demonstration under this article if the person applies for 16 certification no later than September 1, 2001, meets all other 17 requirements and pays applicable application and examination fees; 18 (5) Presents the original, or a photographic copy, of a 19 physician's certificate that he or she is physically qualified to 20 drive a commercial motor vehicle as required by 49 C.F.R. §391.41, 21 as of the effective date of this article or an equivalent 22 physician's certificate as approved by the commissioner; and

23 (6) Pays the appropriate fees.

(b) Certification issued under this article is valid 25 throughout the state and is not assignable or transferable, and is 26 valid for one year from the date on which it was issued.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the
 Division of Labor may issue a temporary certification, to expire on
 January 1, 2001, to an applicant who: (1) Documents at least two
 thousand hours of on-the-job experience during the preceding four
 years; (2) submits scores for the written examination; and (3)
 provides proof of attendance at an approved crane safety training
 course, in an application for certification filed not later than
 July 1, 2000.

9 (d) (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article to 10 the contrary, the commissioner shall establish a dual 11 classification system of certification <del>no later than January 1,</del> 12 <del>2001.</del> as follows:

13 (1) One classification <u>Class A certification</u>, which will 14 provide eligibility for national certification, and <u>for which</u> the 15 applicant must achieve a passing score of seventy on the national 16 commission for the certification of crane operators written 17 examination;

18 (2) To be classified for West Virginia certification Class B 19 certification, for which the commissioner may accept a lesser score 20 on the national commission for the certification of crane operators 21 written examination: *Provided*, That this score may not be less 22 than sixty for state Class B certification. *Provided*, *however*, 23 That the successful completion of a training course approved by the 24 commissioner may be substituted for the written examination and for 25 the practical demonstration if the applicant applies for 26 certification no later than September 1, 2001. The commissioner

1 shall propose a legislative rule as to the dual classification
2 system no later than July 1, 2000.

3 (d) On and after November 10, 2014:

4 (1) All individuals who operate cranes in the State of West
5 Virginia which are governed by the provisions of the Occupational
6 Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of
7 Labor, 29 C.F.R §1926.1400, Subpart CC, are required to hold a
8 Class A certification; and

9 <u>(2) All individuals who operate cranes in the State of West</u> 10 <u>Virginia which are not governed by any provision of the</u> 11 <u>Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States</u> 12 <u>Department of Labor are required to hold a Class B certification.</u> 13 **§21-3D-9. Reciprocity.** 

To the extent that other states provide for the certification of crane operators for similar action, the <u>The</u> commissioner, in his or her discretion, may grant certification <del>of the same or</del> <del>equivalent classification</del> to persons certified by other states, without examination or without the required training upon satisfactory proof furnished to the commissioner that the qualifications for the applicants are equal to the qualifications the holders of similar certification in this state: and upon payment of the required application fee <u>Provided</u>, That the other states extend similar reciprocity privileges to persons certified by this state.
