L 9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new article, designated §16-44-1, to read as
22	follows:
23	ARTICLE 44. RESPONSIBLE PARENT PROGRAM PILOT-PROJECT.
24	§16-44-1. Authorization of responsible parent program pilot-
25	project.
26	(a) The Division of Corrections in an effort to improve child

- 2 and resources needed to succeed as parents and as family providers,
- 3 may implement a twenty-four month pilot project to establish a
- 4 responsible parent program that:
- 5 (1) Identifies for enrollment in the program persons who:
- 6 (A) Are parents of one or more children;
- 7 (B) Are present or former recipients of Temporary Aid to Needy
- 8 Families or have one or more children who are receiving Temporary
- 9 Aid to Needy Families;
- 10 (C) Have an income that is at two hundred percent or below the
- 11 <u>federal poverty level; or</u>
- 12 (D) Are within six months of their release from prison or have
- 13 been previously incarcerated, and
- 14 (E) Currently reside or will reside in Kanawha, Cabell,
- 15 Raleigh, Mason, Mercer, McDowell, Wood or Randolph Counties.
- 16 (2) Includes a course of instruction, which may include, but
- 17 not be limited to:
- (A) Healthy marriage/relationship skills.
- 19 (B) Parenting skills;
- 20 (C) Job seeking training that includes:
- 21 (i) Knowledge of personal aptitudes, skills and preferences;
- 22 <u>(ii) Knowledge of different types of employment opportunities;</u>
- 23 (iii) Resume drafting, completion of a job application,
- 24 <u>drafting a cover letter and follow-up letter; and</u>

- 5 (b) If a pilot project is implemented by the Division of
- 6 Corrections, that agency shall submit an annual report on the
- 7 results of the pilot project to the Interim Joint Committee on
- 8 Judiciary each year during implementation of the pilot project. The
- 9 results shall include at a minimum:
- 10 (1) Key process measures, including,
- 11 (A) The number of participants served;
- 12 (B) The demographics of participants;
- (C) Attendance/participation in training elements;
- 14 (D) The knowledge acquired by participants;
- 15 <u>(E) Participant behavior changes as a result of program</u>
- 16 participation;
- 17 (F) The number of participants gaining employment and their
- 18 wages earned;
- 19 (G) The number of participants completing vocational training;
- 20 (H) The number of participants successfully completing
- 21 transitional job assignments;
- 22 <u>(I) The number of participants demonstrating workforce</u>
- 23 readiness; and
- 24 (J) The recidivism rate of participants.

- 26 participants and similarly situated persons not in the program.
