19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new section, designated §7-5-2a; and that
22	§8-13-15 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as
23	follows:
24	CHAPTER 7. COUNTY COMMISSIONS AND OFFICERS.
25	ARTICLE 5. FISCAL AFFAIRS.
26	§7-5-2a. Credit cards as form of payment.
27	Notwithstanding any code provision to the contrary, county

 $28\ \text{officers}$ required or authorized to collect fines, fees, taxes or

1 other moneys provided by law may accept credit or check cards as a 2 form of payment. County officers may set a fee to be added to each 3 transaction equal to the charge paid by the county officers for the 4 use of the credit or check card by the payor: Provided, That the 5 county officer is required to obtain three bids and use the lowest, 6 qualified bid received. The county officer shall disclose the 7 amount of the fee to the payor prior to the transaction and no 8 other fees for the use of a credit or check card may be imposed 9 upon the payor. Acceptance of a credit or check card as a form of 10 payment shall be in accordance with the rules and requirements set 11 forth by the credit or check card provider.

12 CHAPTER 8. MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS.

13 ARTICLE 13. TAXATION AND FINANCE.

14 §8-13-15. Collection of municipal taxes, fines and assessments.

Unless otherwise provided, it shall be the duty of the treasurer of the municipality or other individual who may be designated by general law, by charter provisions or by the governing body, to collect and promptly pay into the municipal treasury all taxes, fines, special assessments or other moneys due the municipality. All such taxes, fines, special assessments (except assessments for permanent or semipermanent public improvements) and other moneys due the municipality are hereby declared to be debts owing to the municipality, for which the debtor shall be personally liable, and the treasurer, or other individual so designated, may enforce this liability by appropriate civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction, and is hereby vested with the same rights to distrain for the same as is vested in the sheriff for the collection of taxes. Such treasurer or

1 other individual shall give a bond, conditioned according to law, 2 in such penalty and with such security as the governing body may 3 require: Provided, That nothing in this article shall prohibit the 4 payment of taxes, fines, special assessments or other moneys due 5 the municipality by credit or check card. The municipality may set 6 a fee to be added to each transaction equal to the charge paid by 7 the municipality for the use of the credit or check card by the 8 debtor: Provided, That the municipality is required to obtain three 9 bids and use the lowest, qualified bid received. The municipality 10 shall disclose the amount of the fee to the debtor prior to the 11 transaction and no other fees for the use of a credit or check card 12 may be imposed upon the debtor. Acceptance of a credit or check 13 card as a form of payment shall be in accordance with the rules and 14 requirements set forth by the credit or check card provider. 15 Allowing for the collection of these funds by credit or check card 16 shall be at the discretion of the municipality.
