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12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$7-7-1$ and $\$7-7-4$ of the Code of West
13	Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to compensation of
14	elected county officials and county commissioners for each
15	class of county; legislative findings; and authorizing
16	increasing this compensation after July 1, 2012.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That $\$7-7-1$ and $\$7-7-4$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
19	amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 7. COMPENSATION OF ELECTED COUNTY OFFICIALS.
21	§7-7-1. Legislative findings and purpose.
22	(a) The Legislature finds that it has, since January 1, $\frac{2003}{1}$
23	2007, consistently and annually imposed upon the county
24	commissioners, sheriffs, county and circuit clerks, assessors and
25	prosecuting attorneys in each county board, new and additional

- 1 duties by the enactment of new provisions and amendments to this 2 code. The new and additional duties imposed upon the aforesaid 3 county officials by these enactments are such that they would 4 justify the increases in compensation as provided in section four 5 of this article, without violating the provisions of section 6 thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West Virginia.
- 7 (b) The Legislature further finds that there are, from time to 8 time, additional duties imposed upon all county officials through 9 the acts of the Congress of the United States and that such acts 10 constitute new and additional duties for county officials and, as 11 such, justify the increases in compensation as provided by section 12 four of this article, without violating the provisions of section 13 thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West Virginia.
- (c) The Legislature further finds that there is a direct 14 15 correlation between the total assessed property valuations of a 16 county on which the salary levels of the county commissioners, 17 sheriffs, county and circuit clerks, assessors and prosecuting 18 attorneys are based, and the new and additional duties that each of 19 these officials is required to perform as they serve the best 20 interests of their respective counties. Inasmuch as the reappraisal the property valuations in each county has 22 accomplished, the Legislature finds that a change in classification 23 of counties by virtue of increased property valuations will occur 24 on an infrequent basis. However, it is the further finding of the 25 Legislature that when such change in classification of counties 26 does occur, that new and additional programs, economic

- developments, requirements of public safety and the need for new services provided by county officials all increase, that the same constitute new and additional duties for county officials as their respective counties reach greater heights of economic development, as exemplified by the substantial increases in property valuations and, as such, justify the increases in compensation provided in section four of this article, without violating the provisions of section thirty-eight, article VI of the Constitution of West Virginia.
- 10 (d) The Legislature further finds and declares that the 11 amendments enacted to this article are intended to modify the 12 provisions of this article so as to cause the same to be in full 13 compliance with the provisions of the Constitution of West Virginia 14 and to be in full compliance with the decisions of the Supreme 15 Court of Appeals of West Virginia.
- 16 §7-7-4. Compensation of elected county officials and county

 17 commissioners for each class of county; effective

 18 date.
- 19 (1) The increased salaries to be paid to the county 20 commissioners and the other elected county officials described in 21 this subsection on and after July 1, 2006, are set out in 22 subdivisions (5) and (7) of this subsection. Every county 23 commissioner and elected county official in each county, whose term 24 of office commenced prior to or on or after July 1, 2006, shall 25 receive the same annual salary by virtue of legislative findings of

- 1 extra duties as set forth in section one of this article.
- 2 (2) Before the increased salaries, as set out in subdivisions
- 3 (5) and (7) of this subsection, are paid to the county
- 4 commissioners and the elected county officials, the following
- 5 requirements must be met:
- 6 (A) The Auditor has certified that the proposed annual county
- 7 budget for the fiscal year beginning the first days of July, 2006,
- 8 has increased over the previous fiscal year in an amount sufficient
- 9 for the payment of the increase in the salaries, set out in
- 10 subdivisions (5) and (7) of this subsection, and the related
- 11 employment taxes: Provided, That the Auditor may not approve the
- 12 budget certification for any proposed annual county budget
- 13 containing anticipated receipts which are unreasonably greater or
- 14 lesser than that of the previous year. For purposes of this
- 15 subdivision, the term "receipts" does not include unencumbered fund
- 16 balance or federal or state grants; and
- 17 (B) Each county commissioner or other elected official
- 18 described in this subsection in office on the effective date of the
- 19 increased salaries provided by this subsection who desires to
- 20 receive the increased salary has prior to that date filed in the
- 21 office of the clerk of the county commission his or her written
- 22 agreement to accept the salary increase. The salary for the person
- 23 who holds the office of county commissioner or other elected
- 24 official described in this subsection who fails to file the written
- 25 agreement as required by this paragraph shall be the salary for
- 26 that office in effect immediately prior to the effective date of

- 1 the increased salaries provided by this subsection until the person
- 2 vacates the office or his or her term of office expires, whichever
- 3 first occurs.
- 4 (3) If there is an insufficient projected increase in revenues
- 5 to pay the increased salaries and the related employment taxes,
- 6 then the salaries of that county's elected officials and
- 7 commissioners shall remain at the level in effect at the time
- 8 certification was sought.
- 9 (4) In any county having a tribunal in lieu of a county
- 10 commission, the county commissioners of that county may be paid
- 11 less than the minimum salary limits of the county commission for
- 12 that particular class of the county.

- 8 prior to or on or after July 1, 2012, shall receive the same annual
- 9 salary by virtue of legislative findings of extra duties as set
- 10 forth in section one of this article.
- 11 (10) Before the increased salaries, as set out in subdivisions
- 12 (13) and (15) of this subsection, are paid to the county
- 13 commissioners and the elected county officials, the following
- 14 requirements must be met:
- 15 (A) The Auditor has certified that the proposed annual county
- 16 budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, has increased
- 17 over the previous fiscal year in an amount sufficient for the
- 18 payment of the increase in the salaries, set out in subdivisions
- 19 (13) and (15) of this subsection, and the related employment taxes:
- 20 Provided, That the Auditor may not approve the budget certification
- 21 for any proposed annual county budget containing anticipated
- 22 receipts which are unreasonably greater or lesser than that of the
- 23 previous year. For purposes of this subdivision, the term
- 24 <u>"receipts" does not include unencumbered fund balance or federal or</u>
- 25 state grants; and
- 26 (B) Each county commissioner or other elected official

- 1 described in this subsection in office on the effective date of the
- 2 increased salaries provided by this subsection who desires to
- 3 receive the increased salary has prior to that date filed in the
- 4 office of the clerk of the county commission his or her written
- 5 agreement to accept the salary increase. The salary for the person
- 6 who holds the office of county commissioner or other elected
- 7 official described in this subsection who fails to file the written
- 8 agreement as required by this paragraph shall be the salary for
- 9 that office in effect immediately prior to the effective date of
- 10 the increased salaries provided by this subsection until the person
- 11 vacates the office or his or her term of office expires, whichever
