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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-10-7$ and $\$3-10-8$ of the Code of West
11	Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to providing for
12	vacancies in the offices of county commissioner, clerk of the
13	county commission, prosecuting attorney, sheriff, assessor and
14	surveyor; and authorizing the appointment of a temporary
15	successor for no more than thirty days from the date of the
16	vacancy.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That $\$3-10-7$ and $\$3-10-8$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
19	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 10. FILLING VACANCIES.
21	§3-10-7. Vacancies in offices of county commissioner and clerk of
22	county commission.
23	(a) Any vacancy in the office of county commissioner or clerk
24	of county commission shall be filled by the county commission of
25	the county, unless the number of vacancies in a county commission

1 deprive that body of a quorum, in which case the Governor of the 2 state shall fill any vacancy in the county commission necessary to 3 create a quorum thereof. Persons appointed shall be of the same 4 political party as the officeholder vacating the office and shall 5 continue in office until the next general election is certified, or 6 until the completion of the term if the term ends on December 31, 7 following the next general election: Provided, That in the event 8 a quorum of the county commission cannot agree upon a person to 9 fill a vacancy in the office of county commissioner within thirty 10 days of the date the vacancy first occurred, the county executive 11 committee of the vacating county commissioner's political party 12 shall select and name a person to fill the vacancy from the 13 membership of the vacating county commissioner's political party. 14 (b) Notice of the election shall be given by order of the 15 county commission and published as prescribed in section six of 16 this article. Nomination of candidates to fill the office for an 17 unexpired term in the office of county commissioner or clerk of the 18 county commission shall be made in the manner prescribed for making 19 nominations to fill a vacancy in the office of the clerk of the 20 circuit court.

(c) In the event that the election for an unexpired term is 22 held at the same time as the election for a full term for county 23 commissioner, the full term shall be counted first and the 24 unexpired term shall be counted second. If the candidate with the 25 highest number of votes for the unexpired term resides in the same 26 magisterial district as the candidate with the highest number of

- 1 votes for the full term, the candidate for the full term shall be
- 2 seated. The candidate with the next highest number of votes for
- 3 the unexpired term residing in a different magisterial district
- 4 shall be seated for the unexpired term.
- 5 (d) A county commission may on its own motion appoint a
- 6 temporary successor until a permanent appointment has been made,
- 7 but in no event may the temporary successor serve more than thirty
- 8 days from the date of the vacancy.
- 9 §3-10-8. Vacancies in offices of prosecuting attorney, sheriff,
- 10 assessor and surveyor.
- Any vacancy occurring in the office of prosecuting attorney, 11 12 sheriff, assessor or county surveyor shall be filled by the county 13 commission by appointment of a person of the same political party 14 as the officeholder vacating the office. The appointed person 15 shall hold the office until the next general election is certified, 16 or until the completion of the term if the term ends on December 17 31, following the next general election. Notice of an election to 18 fill a vacancy in any of the offices named in this section shall be 19 given by the county commission, or by the president thereof in 20 vacation, and published or posted in the manner prescribed in 21 section six of this article. Nomination of candidates to fill any 22 vacancy shall be made in the manner prescribed in section six of 23 this article for nominating candidates to fill a vacancy in the 24 office of the clerk of the circuit court. A county commission may 25 on its own motion appoint a temporary successor until a permanent 26 appointment has been made, but in no event may the temporary
