18	That \$24B-4-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 4. HEARINGS; BURDEN OF PROOF; ENFORCEMENT.
21	§24B-4-6. Penalties.
22	(a) Any person who violates any provision of this chapter or
23	any valid regulation or order issued thereunder shall be is subject
24	to a civil penalty to be imposed by the commission not to exceed
25	\$1,000 $$200,000$ for each violation for each day the violation

- 1 persists: *Provided*, That the maximum civil penalty shall may not 2 exceed \$200,000 \$2 million for any related series of violations.
- 3 (b) Any civil penalty may be compromised by the commission.
- 4 In determining the amount of penalty, or the amount agreed upon in
- 5 compromise, the appropriateness of the penalty to the size of the
- 6 business of the person charged, the gravity of the violation, and
- 7 the good faith of the person charged in attempting to achieve
- 8 compliance, after notification of the violation, shall be
- 9 considered. The amount of the penalty, when finally determined, or
- 10 the amount agreed upon in compromise, may be deducted from any sums
- 11 owing by the state to the person charged or may be recovered in a
- 12 civil action in the state courts.
- 13 (c) Civil penalties collected under this section shall be paid
- 14 into the State Treasury.
