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12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\S 25-1-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,
13	1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the Commissioner of
14	Corrections to contract with nonprofit and charitable entities
15	for the operation of work-release and transitional housing for
16	inmates in the commissioner's custody; requiring that any
17	facilities which participate meet standards and criteria set
18	by the commissioner; allowing for direct placement of inmates
19	in work-release and transitional housing by order of the
20	circuit court; and providing for certain payment of costs to
21	offset the expenses of the Division of Corrections.
22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
23	That $\S 25-1-3$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,

- 1 ARTICLE 1. ORGANIZATION, INSTITUTIONS AND CORRECTIONS MANAGEMENT.
- 2 §25-1-3. Institutions managed by Commissioner of Corrections;
- 3 certain institutions transferred to Department of
- 4 Health and Human Resources; establishment of work and
- 5 study release units; contracting with certain
- 6 entities for reentry and direct placement services.
- 7 (a) The Commissioner of Corrections shall manage, direct,
- 8 control and govern the following penal or correctional institutions
- 9 and any others placed under his or her jurisdiction or control:
- 10 Mount Olive Correctional Complex;
- 11 Huttonsville Correctional Center;
- 12 Anthony Correctional Center;
- 13 Denmar Correctional Center;
- 14 Pruntytown Correctional Center;
- Northern West Virginia Correctional Center;
- 16 St. Marys Correctional Center;
- 17 Lakin Correctional Center:
- 18 Ohio County Correctional Center;
- 19 Beckley Correctional Center; and
- 20 Martinsburg Correctional Center.
- 21 <u>(b)</u> The Commissioner of Corrections is authorized to may
- 22 contract with the county commission of McDowell County to house and
- 23 incarcerate inmates at the Stevens Correctional Center consistent
- 24 with all requirements and standards governing the Division of

- 1 Corrections.
- 2 (c) Jurisdiction of and title to the West Virginia Children's
- 3 Home at Elkins are hereby transferred to the Department of Health
- 4 and Human Resources, which is the custodian of all deeds and other
- 5 muniments of title to the property and shall record those that are
- 6 susceptible of recordation to be recorded in the proper offices.
- 7 Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, the
- 8 West Virginia Children's Home shall be managed and controlled by a
- 9 superintendent appointed by the Commissioner of the Division of
- 10 Human Services.
- 11 (d) The commissioner is authorized to may establish work and
- 12 study release units as extensions and subsidiaries of those state
- 13 institutions under his or her control and authority. The work and
- 14 study release units may be coeducational and shall be managed,
- 15 directed and controlled as provided in this article.
- 16 (e) The commissioner may contract with nonprofit or charitable
- 17 entities, including but not limited to nonprofit community mental
- 18 health clinics operating half-way houses or transitional housing
- 19 facilities for the placement of persons in the commissioner's
- 20 custody, whether confined or under parole supervision, as long as
- 21 such facilities meet standards and criteria established by the
- 22 commissioner.
- 23 <u>Circuit courts may</u>, as an alternative to confinement in a jail
- 24 or correctional facility, order a convicted person to serve his or

- 1 her sentence in a facility authorized by the provisions of this
- 2 <u>subsection</u> as a condition of probation: Provided, That the
- 3 <u>Division of Corrections is not responsible for the costs associated</u>
- 4 with housing a person in a half-way house or transitional housing
- 5 facility in any case in which an individual has been ordered by a
- 6 circuit court to serve his or her sentence or any part thereof in
- 7 <u>a half-way house or transitional housing facility.</u>
- 8 Nothing in this section prohibits the Division of Corrections
- 9 from charging any inmate it places within half-way houses or
- 10 transitional housing a reasonable sum calculated to offset all or
- 11 part of the costs of placement in a half-way house or transitional
- 12 housing: Provided, That the division finds the inmate has the
- 13 ability to pay the amount charged.
- 14 (f) Any person employed by the Office of Public Institutions
- 15 who on the effective date of this article is a classified civil
- 16 service employee shall, within the limits contained in section two,
- 17 article six, chapter twenty-nine of this code, remain in the civil
- 18 service system as a covered employee.
