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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new article, designated \$16-1C-1, \$16-1C-2,
12	\$16-1C-3, \$16-1C-4, \$16-1C-5, \$16-1C-6 and \$16-1C-7, all
13	relating generally to requiring health care providers to wear
14	identification badges; setting forth legislative findings and
15	purpose; providing definitions; establishing identification
16	badge requirement; setting forth exemptions; addressing
17	enforcement; providing for applicability; and granting
18	rule-making authority.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new article, designated \$16-1C-1, \$16-1C-2,
22	\$16-1C-3, $$16-1C-4$, $$16-1C-5$, $$16-1C-6$ and $$16-1C-7$, all to read as
23	follows:
24	CHAPTER 16. PUBLIC HEALTH.

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25 ARTICLE 1C. HEALTH CARE PROVIDER TRANSPARENCY ACT.

1 §16-1C-1. Legislative findings and purpose.

- 2 (a) The Legislature finds that:
- 3 (1) Patients receiving health care in this state need
- 4 increased clarity and transparency with regard to the
- 5 qualifications of employees of health care providers.
- 6 (2) There are widespread differences regarding the training
- 7 and qualifications earned by employees of health care providers.
- 8 These differences often concern the training and skills necessary
- 9 to correctly detect, diagnose, prevent and treat serious health
- 10 conditions.
- 11 (3) The reliability of the health care system is undermined
- 12 and patients are put at risk when patients are confused or mislead
- 13 about the qualifications of employees of health care providers to
- 14 provide specific patient care.
- 15 (b) The purpose of this article is to require employees of
- 16 health care providers to wear identification badges, clearly
- 17 informing patients of their name and title.

18 §16-1C-2. Definitions.

- 19 (a) "Direct patient care" means health care that provides for
- 20 the physical, diagnostic, emotional or rehabilitational needs of a
- 21 patient or health care that involves examination, treatment or
- 22 preparation for diagnostic tests or procedures.
- 23 (b) "Employee" means an employee of a health care provider who
- 24 delivers direct patient care.
- 25 (c) "Health care provider" means an individual, partnership,
- 26 corporation, facility, hospital or institution licensed or

- 1 certified or authorized by law to provide professional health care
- 2 service in this state to a patient during that patient's medical,
- 3 remedial or behavioral health care, treatment or confinement.
- 4 (d) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the West Virginia
- 5 Department of Health and Human Resources. The secretary may define
- 6 in rules any term or phrase used in this article which is not
- 7 expressly defined.

8 §16-1C-3. Identification badge requirements.

- 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, an employee
- 10 shall wear an identification badge when providing direct patient
- 11 care. The identification badge shall be worn in a conspicuous
- 12 manner so as to be visible and apparent.

13 **§16-1C-4**. **Exceptions**.

- 14 (a) Notwithstanding section three of this article, the
- 15 following shall apply:
- 16 (1) An employee shall not be required to wear an
- 17 identification badge while delivering direct patient care if it is
- 18 not clinically feasible.
- 19 (2) The last name of the employee may be omitted or concealed
- 20 from an identification badge when delivering direct patient care if
- 21 the employee is concerned for his or her safety.
- 22 (b) An employee may petition the secretary for an exemption
- 23 from the requirements of this article for reasons that are not set
- 24 forth in this section.

25 §16-1C-5. Enforcement.

- 1 Upon complaint that an employee is not complying with the
- 2 requirements of this article, a health care provider professional
- 3 licensing board shall investigate the complaint for the purpose of
- 4 considering disciplinary action.

5 **§16-1C-6**. Rules.

- The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Resources,
- 7 in consultation with appropriate health care provider professional
- 8 licensing boards, shall propose rules for legislative approval in
- 9 accordance with the provisions of chapter twenty-nine-a of this
- 10 code to implement the provisions of this article. These rules
- 11 shall include, at a minimum:
- 12 (1) The contents of the identification badge, which shall at
- 13 least include the name of the employee and title of the employee;
- 14 (2) The title to be used to identify employee licensure
- 15 information;
- 16 (3) The appearance of the identification badge, which shall
- 17 have the title of the employee as large as possible in block type;
- 18 (4) The process and procedure for seeking an exemption from
- 19 the requirements of this article; and
- 20 (5) Such other rules as may be deemed necessary to effectuate
- 21 the purposes of this article.

22 §16-1C-7. Applicability.

23 The provisions of section three of this article apply to

24 employees of health care providers, as of July 1, 2015.
