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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18A-3-1a$ and $\$18A-3-1b$ of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to alternative

13	defining approved education provider; generally reorganizing
14	section, updating terms and eliminating duplicative language;
15	eliminating requirement to post position of alternative
16	program teacher each year prior to rehiring; authorizing
17	alternative methods of instructional delivery and candidate
18	supervision and modifying existing methods; modifying
19	reporting and recommendation requirements; and requiring
20	certain legislative rules.
21	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
22	That $\$18A-3-1a$ and $\$18A-3-1b$ of the Code of West Virginia,
23	1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
24	ARTICLE 3. TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, LICENSING, PROFESSIONAL
25	DEVELOPMENT.

## 1 \$18A-3-1a. Alternative programs for the education of teachers;

- 2 legislative rules required.
- 3 (a) By August 15, 2005, the state board, after consultation
- 4 with the Secretary of Education and the Arts, shall promulgate
- 5 rules in accordance with the provisions of article three-b, chapter
- 6 twenty-nine-a of this code for the approval and operation of
- 7 teacher education programs which are an alternative to the regular
- 8 college or university programs for the education of teachers.
- 9 (a) Definitions. -- For the purposes of this section, the
- 10 following terms have the meaning ascribed to them, unless the
- 11 context in which a term is used clearly requires a different
- 12 meaning:
- 13 (1) "Alternative program teacher certificate" means a
- 14 certificate issued for one year to a candidate who does not meet
- 15 the standard educational requirements for teacher certification;
- 16 (2) "Approved education provider" means a partnership between
- 17 one or more schools, school districts or regional educational
- 18 service agencies and an institution of higher education in this
- 19 state with a regionally accredited program for the education of
- 20 professional educators approved by the state board or an entity
- 21 affiliated with such an institution's approved program, that has
- 22 submitted to the state board a plan and agreement between the
- 23 organizations for the delivery of an alternative program in
- 24 accordance with this section, and the state board has approved the

## 1 plan and agreement; and

- 2 (3) "Area of critical need and shortage" means an opening in
- 3 an established, existing or newly-created position which has been
- 4 posted at least two times in accordance with section seven-a,
- 5 article four of this chapter and for which no fully-qualified
- 6 applicant has been employed.
- 7 (b) Establishment of alternative education programs. -- After
- 8 consultation with the Secretary of Education and the Arts and the
- 9 Chancellor of the Higher Education Policy Commission, the state
- 10 board shall promulgate a legislative rule or rules in accordance
- 11 with article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to
- 12 implement the provisions of this section. The proposed rule or
- 13 rules shall be submitted to the Legislative Oversight Commission on
- 14 Education Accountability for review prior to adoption. The rule or
- 15 rules shall include, but are not limited to, the following issues:
- 16 (1) Separate procedures for the approval and operation of each
- 17 of the alternative teacher education programs as provided in this
- 18 section:
- 19 (A) These programs are an alternative to the regular college
- 20 or university programs for the education of teachers and may only
- 21 be offered by approved education providers; and
- 22 (B) Each program is separate from other programs established
- 23 by this section;
- 24 (2) Procedures for approving an approved education provider as

- 1 defined in this section. Approval is required prior to
- 2 implementation the provider's program leading to certification to
- 3 teach in the public schools of this state;
- 4 (3) Provisions for setting tuition charges to offset program
- 5 costs;
- 6 (4) The recommendation to rehire an alternative education
- 7 program teacher, is subject to satisfactory progress in the
- 8 applicable alternative education program by the holder of the
- 9 alternative program certificate; and
- 10 (5) When making decisions affecting the hiring of a teacher
- 11 authorized to teach under an alternative program certificate as
- 12 provided in this section, a county board shall give preference to
- 13 applicants who hold a valid West Virginia professional teaching
- 14 certificate.
- 15 © Alternative teacher education program. --
- 16 (1) To participate in an approved alternative teacher
- 17 education program, the candidate must hold an alternative program
- 18 teacher certificate issued by the <u>state</u> superintendent and endorsed
- 19 for the instructional field in which the candidate seeks
- 20 certification. An alternative program teacher certificate is a
- 21 certificate issued for one year to a candidate who does not meet
- 22 the standard educational requirements for certification.
- 23 <u>(2)</u> The certificate may be renewed <del>no more than two times</del>
- 24 twice and no individual may hold an alternative program teacher

- 1 certificate for a period exceeding three years. The alternative
- 2 program teacher certificate shall be considered is equivalent to a
- 3 professional teaching certificate for the purpose of the issuance
- 4 of issuing a continuing contract.
- 5 (3) To be eligible for an alternative program teacher
- 6 certificate, an applicant shall meet the following criteria:
- 7 (1) (A) Possess at least a bachelor's degree from a regionally

- 15 basic skills and subject matter test or tests required by the state
- 16 board for traditional program candidates to become certified in the
- 17 area for which licensure is being sought;
- 18 (3) © Be a citizen of the Hold United States citizenship; be
- 19 of good moral character and be physically, mentally and emotionally
- 20 qualified to perform the duties of a teacher; and have attained
- 21 (D) Attain the age of eighteen years on or before October 1 of
- 22 the year in which the alternative program teacher certificate is
- 23 issued;
- 24 (4) (E) Have been offered Receive a formal offer of employment

- 1 in an area of critical need and shortage by from a county board
- 2 superintendent; in an area of critical need and shortage and
- 3 (5) (F) Qualify for employment following a criminal history 4 check pursuant to section ten of this article.
- 5 (4) <del>Persons</del> A person who <del>satisfy</del> satisfies the requirements
- 6 set forth in subdivisions (1) through (5) subdivision (3) of this
- 7 subsection shall be granted a formal document which will enable
- 8 them authorizing him or her to work in a public school in West
- 9 Virginia.
- 10 (b) The rules adopted by the board shall include provisions
- 11 for the approval of alternative teacher education programs which
- 12 may be offered by schools, school districts, consortia of schools,
- 13 or regional educational service agency and for the setting of
- 14 tuition charges to offset the program costs. An approved
- 15 alternative teacher education program shall be in effect for a
- 16 school, school district, consortium of schools or regional
- 17 educational service agency before an alternative program teacher
- 18 may be employed in that school, school district, consortium of

- 20 (5) An approved alternative program shall provide provides
- 21 essential knowledge and skills to alternative program teachers

- 23 (1) (A) Instruction. -- The alternative preparation program
- 24 shall provide a minimum of eighteen semester hours of instruction

1 in the areas of student assessment; development and learning; 2 curriculum; classroom management; the use of educational computers 3 and other technology; and special education and diversity. 4 programs shall contain a minimum of three semester hours of 5 instruction in special education and diversity out of the minimum 6 eighteen required semester hours. Subject to the approval of the 7 state board, an approved education provider may provide instruction 8 equivalent to the eighteen semester hours required by this 9 paragraph through nontraditional methods, including, but not 10 limited to, methods such as a series of modules covering the 11 various topics, electronically delivered instruction, summer 12 sessions, professional development and job-embedded mentoring. (2) (B) Phase I. -- Phase I shall consists of a period 13 14 of intensive, on-the-job supervision by an assigned mentor and the 15 school administrator for a period of not less fewer than two weeks 16 and no more than four weeks. The assigned mentor shall meet the 17 requirements for a beginning teacher internship mentor set forth in 18 section two-b of this article and shall be paid the stipend 19 authorized pursuant to that section. During this time, the teacher 20 The state board shall provide, in its rule for the approval and 21 operation of this program, requirements for the frequency and 22 duration of time periods for the person holding an alternative 23 certificate to observe in the classroom of the mentor. The person 24 holding an alternative certificate shall be observed daily by the

- 1 mentor or the school administrator during this phase. This phase
- 2 shall include includes an orientation to the policies, organization
- 3 and curriculum of the employing district. The alternative program
- 4 teacher shall begin to receive formal instruction in those areas
- 5 listed in subdivision (1) paragraph (A) of this subsection

- 7 (3) © Phase II. -- Phase II shall consist consists of a period
- 8 of intensive, on-the-job supervision beginning the first day
- 9 following the completion of Phase I and continuing for a period of

- 11 <u>(I)</u> During Phase II, the alternative program teacher shall be
- 12 <u>is</u> visited and critiqued <del>no less than</del> <u>at least</u> one time per week by
- 13 members of a professional support team, as defined in subsection ©
- 14 subdivision (6) of this <del>section</del> subsection, and <del>shall be</del> is
- 15 observed and formally evaluated by the appropriately certified
- 16 members of the team at the end of five weeks and again at the end
- 17 of ten weeks by the appropriately certified members of the team at
- 18 five-week intervals until the completion of this phase.
- 19 (ii) At the end of the ten-week period completion of this
- 20 phase, the alternative program teacher shall receive a formal
- 21 written progress report from the chairperson of the support team

2 (4) (D) Phase III. -- Phase III shall consist consists of an additional period of continued supervision and evaluation of no 4 less fewer than twenty weeks duration. The professional support 5 team will determine determines the requirements of this phase, with 6 but those requirements shall include at least one formal evaluation 7 being conducted at the completion of the phase by the principal. 8 The alternative program teacher shall continue to receive formal 9 instruction in those areas listed above in paragraph (A) 10 subdivision (1) of this subsection subdivision, and receive shall 11 be given opportunities to observe the teaching of experienced 12 colleagues.

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(A) Training and supervision of alternative program teachers

shall be are provided by a professional support team comprised of

a school principal, or his or her designee, an experienced

classroom teacher who satisfies the requirements for mentor for the

Beginning Educator Internship as specified in pursuant to section

two-b of this article, a college or university education faculty

member a nonpublic education representative of the approved

education provider, and a curriculum supervisor or other central

office administrator with certification and training relevant to

the training and supervision of the alternative program candidate.

(B) Districts or schools which do not employ curriculum

- 1 supervisors or have been unable to establish a relationship with a
- 2 college or university shall provide for comparable expertise on the
- 3 team.
- 4 © The school principal, or his or her designee, shall serve
- 5 serves as chairperson of the team.
- 6 (D) The duration of each of the three phases of the program
- 7 specified in paragraphs (B), © and (D), subdivision (5) of this
- 8 subsection, in excess of the minimum durations provided in those
- 9 paragraphs, shall be determined by the professional support team
- 10 within guidelines provided by the state board in its rule for the
- 11 approval and operation of this program.

- 11 may, subject to the approval of the state board, provide for the

- 14 support, supervision and mentoring of beginning teachers:
- 15 Provided, That all final decisions on the progress of the
- 16 alternative program teacher and recommendations upon program

- 18 (e) (8) A school, school district, consortium of schools, or
- 19 regional educational service agency An approved education provider
- 20 seeking to employ approval for an alternative certification program
- 21 teacher must shall submit a plan to the state board. and receive

- 23 (A) No alternative certification program may be implemented
- 24 prior to receiving state board approval.

- 1 (B) Each plan shall describe how the proposed training program
- 2 will accomplish the key elements of an alternative program for the
- 3 education of teachers as set forth in this section. Each school,
- 4 school district, consortium of schools or regional educational
- 5 service agency shall show evidence in its plan of having sought
- 6 joint sponsorship of their training program with institutions of

- 8 (f) The state board shall promulgate a rule in accordance with
- 9 article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for the
- 10 approval and operation of alternative education programs to prepare
- 11 highly qualified special education teachers that
- 12 <u>(d) Alternative highly qualified special education teacher</u>
- 13 <u>education program. --</u>
- 14 (1) These programs are separate from the programs established
- 15 under the other provisions of this section and are applicable only
- 16 to teachers who have at least a bachelor's degree in a program for
- 17 the preparation of teachers from a regionally accredited
- 18 institution of higher education.
- 19 (2) These programs are subject to the other provisions of this
- 20 section only to the extent specifically provided for in the rule.
- 21 (3) These programs may be an alternative to the regular
- 22 college and university programs for the education of special
- 23 education teachers and also may address the content area
- 24 preparation of certified special education teachers.

- 1 (4) The programs shall incorporate professional development to
- 2 the maximum extent possible to help teachers who are currently
- 3 certified in special education to obtain the required content area
- 4 preparation.
- 5 (5) Participation in an alternative education program pursuant

- 1 (2) These programs are subject to the other provisions of this 2 section only to the extent specifically provided for in this the 3 rule.
- 4 (3) These programs may be an alternative to the regular 5 college and university programs for the education of special 6 education teachers and also may address the content area 7 preparation of such these persons. The state board shall report to 8 the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability on 9 the programs authorized under this subsection during the July, 10 2005, interim meetings or as soon thereafter as practical prior to
- (h) For the purposes of this section, "area of critical need and shortage" means an opening in an established, existing or newly created position which has been posted in accordance with the provisions of section seven-a, article four of this chapter, and for which no fully qualified applicant has been employed.

- (I) The recommendation to rehire an alternative education program teacher, pursuant to section eight-a, article two of this chapter is subject to the position being posted and no fully qualified applicant being employed: Provided, That this provision does not apply to teachers who hold a valid West Virginia professional teaching certificate and who are employed under a program operated pursuant to subsection (f).

- 4 §18A-3-1b. Recommendation for certification of alternative
- 5 program teachers.
- 6 At the conclusion of an alternative teacher education program,
- 7 the principal chairperson of the professional support team,
- 8 approved education provider shall prepare a comprehensive
- 9 evaluation report on the alternative program teacher's performance.
- 10 This report shall be submitted directly to the State Superintendent
- 11 of Schools and shall contain a recommendation as to whether or not
- 12 a professional certificate should be issued to the alternative
- 13 program teacher. The report shall be made on standard forms
- 14 developed by the State Superintendent.
- The comprehensive evaluation report shall include one of the
- 16 following recommendations:
- 17 (1) Approved: Recommends issuance of a professional

- 19 (2) Insufficient: Recommends that a professional certificate

5 The <del>chairperson of the professional support team</del> approved

6 <u>education provider</u> shall provide the alternative program teacher

7 with a copy of the alternative program teacher's written evaluation

8 report and certification recommendation before submitting it to the

9 state superintendent. If the alternative program teacher disagrees

10 with the chairperson's provider's recommendation, the alternative

11 program teacher may, within fifteen days of receipt, request an

12 appeal in accordance with the certification appeals process

13 established by the State Board of Education.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow an entity affiliated with an institution of higher education in this state with a regionally accredited program for the education of professional educators to provide alternative certification programs for teachers.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

This bill was recommended for introduction and passage during the 2012 Regular Session of the Legislature by the Joint Standing Committee on Education Subcommittee B.
