11	1931, as amended; and to amend said code by adding thereto a
12	new section, designated $\S59-1-2b$ , all relating to the
13	preparation and sale of voter registration lists; establishing
14	the fees to be collected; requiring the fees to be deposited
15	in the State Election Fund; and permitting a county clerk to
16	collect an additional fee for list preparation.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That $$3-2-30$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding
20	thereto a new section, designated §59-1-2b, all to read as follows:
21	CHAPTER 3. ELECTIONS.
22	ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.
2 2	\$3-2-30 Public inspection of woter registration records in the

- office of the clerk of the county commission; providing
  voter lists for noncommercial use; prohibition against
  resale of voter lists for commercial use or profit.
- 4 (a) Any person may examine the active, inactive, rejected and 5 canceled voter registration records during office hours of the 6 clerk of the county commission in accordance with the provisions of 7 chapter twenty-nine-b of this code. as follows:
- (1) When the active and inactive files are maintained on precinct registration books, any person may examine the files under the supervision of the clerk and obtain copies of records except when a precinct book is in temporary use for updating and preparing lists or during the time the books are sealed for use in an election. Other original voter registration records, including canceled voter records, pending applications, rejected applications, records of change requests, reinstatements and other documents, shall be available for inspection upon specific request, and
- (2) When the active Active, inactive, rejected and canceled voter files are to be maintained in electronic data format. any 20 Any person may examine voter record information in printed form or 21 in a read-only data format on a computer terminal set aside for 22 public use, if available. The data files available for examination 23 and copying shall include all registration and voting information 24 maintained in the file, but may not include the registrant's

- 1 telephone number, e-mail address, social security number or
- 2 driver's license number or nonoperator's identification number
- 3 issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles.
- 4 (b) Printed lists of registered voters may be purchased for
- 5 noncommercial use from the clerk of the county commission at a cost
- 6 of 1¢ per name established in section two-b, article one, chapter
- 7 fifty-nine of this code.
- 8 (c) In counties maintaining active and inactive files in
- 9 digitized data format, the The clerk of the county commission
- 10 shall, upon request, prepare provide printed copies of the lists of
- 11 voters for each precinct. No list prepared under this section may
- 12 include the registrant's telephone number, e-mail address, social
- 13 security number or driver's license number or nonoperator's
- 14 identification number issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles.

11 (e) The fees income received by the clerk of the county
12 commission shall be kept placed in a separate fund under the
13 supervision of the clerk for the purpose of defraying the cost of
14 the preparation of the voter lists. Any unexpended balance in the

supervision of the clerk for the purpose of defraying the cost of
the preparation of the voter lists. Any unexpended balance in the
fund shall be transferred to the General Fund of the county
commission or remitted directly to the Secretary of State for
placement in the State Election Fund as set forth in subsection
(b), section forty-eight, article one of this chapter. For the
purpose of this subsection, "income" means the portion of fees
remaining after moneys for the costs of producing the voter lists
have been expended. Any balance in the fund under the supervision
of the clerk, along with any interest earned, shall be transferred
at least annually to the State Election Fund no later than July 31
of each year.

(f) The Secretary of State may make voter lists and other 1 2 reports extracted from the statewide voter registration system 3 available for sale subject to the limitations as provided in this 4 section for counties. The cost costs shall be as established by 5 section two b, article one, chapter fifty-nine of this code. for a 6 partial list shall be one and one-half cents per name plus \$10 for 7 each disk required; the cost for a complete statewide list shall be 8 one-half cent per name and a flat fee of \$1,000. One cent per name 9 for each voter from a particular county on each partial list and 10 one-half cent per name for each voter from a particular county on 11 each statewide list sold shall be reimbursed to the appropriate 12 county. The disk fee and one-half cent per name associated with a 13 partial list and the flat fee of \$1,000 associated with a complete 14 statewide list shall be deposited to a special revenue account for 15 purpose of defraying the cost of preparing the lists. The fees 16 associated with the purchase of a partial list, or associated with 17 a complete statewide list, shall be deposited to the State Election 18 Fund as set forth in subsection (b), section forty-eight, article 19 one of this chapter. 20 (g) An update to a previously purchased list may be provided 21 by the Secretary of State or the clerk of the county commission at 22 a prorated cost based on the amount of additional information 23 provided. The additional rates charged by the clerk of the county 24 commission shall be specified in the policy established pursuant to

- (a) Except as may be otherwise provided in this code, the

6	(9) The current hourly rate shall be determined by the
7	Secretary of State, or in the case of a county-generated list by
8	the clerk of the county commission, and shall be provided to the
9	purchaser before a list is prepared and supplied.
10	(b) Clerks of county commissions providing voter lists in
11	pursuant to subsection (d), section thirty, article two, chapter
12	three of this code shall charge the fees established by this
13	section. Clerks may additionally charge a reasonable and necessary
14	fee to defray the costs associated with list preparation and
15	distribution.
16	(c) Proceeds from the sale of data originating in the
17	statewide voter registration system, along with any interest on
18	those funds, shall be deposited into the State Election Fund as set
19	forth in subsection (b), section forty-eight, article one, chapter
20	three of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill concerns the preparation and sale of voter registration lists. The bill establishes the fees to be collected and requires those fees be deposited in the State Election Fund. The bill also permits a county clerk to collect an additional fee for list preparation.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

\$59-1-2b. is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.

This bill was recommended for introduction and passage during the Regular Session of the Legislature by the Secretary of State.
