10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$61-8D-4$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to the sale of medication

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That §61-8D-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 8D. CHILD ABUSE.
18	§61-8D-4. Child neglect resulting in injury; child neglect
19	creating risk of injury; criminal penalties.
20	(a) If any parent, guardian or custodian shall neglect
21	neglects a child and by such the neglect cause said the child
22	bodily injury, as such the term is defined in section one, article
23	eight-b of this chapter, then such the parent, guardian or
24	custodian shall be is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction
25	thereof, shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$1000 or

- 2 imprisoned in a state correctional facility not less than one nor
- 3 more than three years or, in the discretion of the court, be
- 4 confined in the county jail for not more than one year, or both

- 7 (b) If any parent, guardian or custodian shall neglect
- 8 neglects a child and by such the neglect cause said the child
- 9 serious bodily injury, as such the term is defined in section one,
- 10 article eight-b of this chapter, then such the parent, guardian or
- 11 custodian shall be is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction
- 12 thereof, shall be fined not less than \$300 nor more than \$3000 or
- 13 committed to the custody of the Division of Corrections for
- 14 <u>imprisoned in a state correctional facility</u> not less than one nor
- 15 more than ten years, or both such fine and imprisonment. fined and

- 17 (c) The provisions of this section $\frac{1}{2}$ do not apply if the
- 18 neglect by the parent, guardian or custodian is due primarily to a
- 19 lack of financial means on the part of such parent, guardian or
- 20 custodian.
- 21 (d) (1) The provisions of this section shall do not apply to
- 22 any a parent, quardian or custodian who fails or refuses, or allows
- 23 another person to fail or refuse, to supply a child under the care,
- 24 custody or control of such the parent, guardian or custodian with

- 1 necessary medical care when such the medical care conflicts with
- 2 the tenets and practices of a recognized religious denomination or
- 3 order of which $\frac{\text{the}}{\text{such}}$ parent, guardian or custodian is an

- 5 (2) A parent, guardian or custodian who converts any
- 6 medication or controlled substance prescribed to a child by a
- 7 physician or other licensed medical professional for the purpose of
- 8 vending the medication to a third party or who allows another
- 9 person to convert any medication or controlled substance prescribed
- 10 to a child by a physician or other licensed medical professional
- 11 for the purpose of vending the medication to a third party, is
- 12 guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not
- 13 more than \$2000 and imprisoned in a state correctional facility for
- 14 not less than two nor more than five years.
- 15 (e) Any person who grossly neglects a child and by the gross
- 16 neglect creates a substantial risk of serious bodily injury or of
- 17 death to the child is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction
- 18 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$3000 and confined to the
- 19 custody of the Division of Corrections imprisoned in a state
- 20 <u>correctional facility</u> for not less than one nor more than five
- 21 years.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create penalties for parents or guardians who sale or who allow to be sold any medication prescribed to a child.
