15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That $\$48-15-201$ and $\$48-15-209$ of the Code of West Virginia,
17	1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 15. ENFORCEMENT OF SUPPORT ORDER THROUGH ACTION AGAINST
19	LICENSE.
20	§48-15-201. Licenses subject to action.
21	The following licenses are subject to an action against a
22	license as provided for in this article:
23	(1) A business registration certificate issued under article
24	twelve, chapter eleven of this code authorizing a person to
25	transact business in the State of West Virginia:

- 16 §48-15-209. Hearing on denial, nonrenewal, suspension or
- 17 restriction of license.
- 18 (a) The court shall order a licensing authority to deny,
- 19 refuse to renew, suspend or restrict a license if it finds that:
- 20 (1) All appropriate enforcement methods have been exhausted or
- 21 are not available;
- 22 (2) The person is the holder of a license or has an
- 23 application pending for a license;
- 24 (3) The requisite amount of child support or medical support

- 1 arrearage exists or health insurance for the child has not been
- 2 provided as ordered or the person has failed to comply with a
- 3 subpoena or warrant relating to a paternity or child support
- 4 proceeding;
- 5 (4) No motion to modify the child support order, filed prior
- 6 to the date that the notice was sent by the Bureau for Child
- 7 Support Enforcement, is pending before the court; and
- 8 (5) There is no equitable reason, such as involuntary
- 9 unemployment, disability or compliance with a court-ordered plan
- 10 for the periodic payment of the child support arrearage amount, for
- 11 the person's noncompliance with the child support order.
- 12 (b) If the court is satisfied that the conditions described in
- 13 subsection (a) of this section exist, it shall first consider
- 14 suspending or restricting a driver's license prior to professional
- 15 license. If the person fails to appear at the hearing after being
- 16 properly served with notice, the court shall order the suspension
- 17 of all licenses identified in section two-hundred-one of this
- 18 <u>article</u> held by the person.
- 19 (c) If the court finds that a license suspension will result
- 20 in a significant hardship to the person, to the person's legal
- 21 dependents under eighteen years of age living in the person's
- 22 household, to the person's employees or to persons, businesses or
- 23 entities to whom the person provides goods or services, the court
- 24 may allow the person to pay a percentage of the past-due child

1 support amount as an initial payment, and establish a payment

2 schedule to satisfy the remainder of the arrearage within one year

3 and require that the person comply with any current child support

4 obligation. If the person agrees to this arrangement, no

5 suspension or restriction of any licenses shall may be ordered.

6 Compliance with the payment agreement shall be monitored by the

7 Bureau for Child Support Enforcement.

8 (d) If a person has good cause for not complying with the 9 payment agreement within the time permitted, the person shall 10 immediately file a motion with the court and the Bureau for Child 11 Support Enforcement requesting an extension of the payment plan. 12 The court may extend the payment plan if it is satisfied that the 13 person has made a good faith effort to comply with the plan and is 14 unable to satisfy the full amount of past-due support within the 15 time permitted due to circumstances beyond the person's control. 16 If the person fails to comply with the court-ordered payment 17 schedule, the court shall, upon receipt of a certification of 18 noncompliance from the Bureau for Child Support Enforcement, and 19 without further hearing, order the immediate suspension or 20 restriction of all licenses held by the person.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to remove driver and commercial driver licenses from the identified licenses which may be revoked when in arrearage on child support payments.
