20	It is the duty of the <u>The</u> county commission of every county,	
21	from time to time, to <u>shall</u> appoint a coroner for the county, who	
22	shall hold the office during the pleasure of the commission and	
23	shall take the oath of office prescribed for other county officers.	

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1 The county coroners shall be certified in medicolegal 2 investigations, be continually available to perform the duties 3 required under this article and shall be paid such fees or amounts 4 for the services as may be fixed by the chief medical examiner. 5 <u>The county commission of every county may designate a local funeral</u> 6 <u>home or EMS to transport a body to a medical examiner for an</u> 7 <u>examination required under the provisions of section eight of this</u> 8 article in order to expedite examinations.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize county commissions to designate a local funeral home or EMS to transport bodies when a postmortem examination is required.
