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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$30-10-8$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to licensure of veterinarians; and
12	allowing the licensure of certain veterinarians by

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $\$30-10-8$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 10. VETERINARIANS.
18	§30-10-8. Requirements for veterinary license.
19	(a) To be eligible for a license to practice veterinary
20	medicine under the provisions of this article, the applicant must:
21	(1) Be of good moral character;
22	(2) (A) Be a graduate of an accredited school approved by the
23	board; or

- 1 (B) Be a graduate of a foreign veterinary school and hold a
- 2 certificate of competence issued by a foreign veterinary graduate
- 3 educational organization as approved by the board;
- 4 (3) Have passed the examinations required by the board;
- 5 (4) Be at least eighteen years of age;
- 6 (5) Be a citizen of the United States or be eligible for 7 employment in the United States;
- 8 (6) Not have been convicted of a crime involving moral 9 turpitude;
- 10 (7) Not have been convicted of a felony under the laws of any 11 jurisdiction within five years preceding the date of application
- 12 for licensure which conviction remains unreversed; and
- 13 (8) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or a felony under
- 14 the laws of any jurisdiction at any time if the offense for which
- 15 the applicant was convicted related to the practice of veterinary
- 16 medicine or animal abuse or neglect.
- 17 (b) A person seeking a license under the provisions of this
- 18 article shall submit an application on a form prescribed by the
- 19 board and pay all applicable fees.
- 20 (c) An applicant from another jurisdiction shall comply with
- 21 all the requirements of this article.
- 22 (d) A license to practice veterinary medicine issued by the
- 23 board prior to July 1, 2010, shall for all purposes be considered
- 24 a license issued under this article and may be renewed under this

- 1 article.
- 2 (e) An application for a license to practice veterinary
- 3 medicine submitted to the board prior to July 1, 2010, shall be
- 4 considered in conformity with the licensing provisions of this
- 5 article and the rules promulgated thereunder in effect at the time
- 6 of the submission of the application.
- 7 (f) The board, in its discretion, may issue a license by
- 8 endorsement to a qualified applicant who:
- 9 (1) Has submitted a complete application;
- 10 (2) Holds a license issued by another state and is in good
- 11 standing;
- 12 (3) Has successfully passed an examination covering the laws
- 13 and rules pertaining to the practice of veterinary medicine in the
- 14 state; and
- 15 (4) Has actively practiced clinical veterinary medicine for
- 16 three thousand hours during the five years preceding application.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow the licensure of certain veterinarians by endorsement.
