DANGEROUS WEAPONS. 19 §61-7-4. License to carry deadly weapons; how obtained. 20 (a) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this section, any 21 person desiring to obtain a state license to carry a concealed 22 deadly weapon shall apply to the sheriff of his or her county for 23 the license, and shall pay to the sheriff, at the time of

- 1 application, a fee of \$75, of which \$15 of that amount shall be
- 2 deposited in the Courthouse Facilities Improvement Fund created by
- 3 section six, article twenty-six, chapter twenty-nine of this code.
- 4 Concealed weapons permits may only be issued for pistols or
- 5 revolvers. Each applicant shall file with the sheriff, a complete
- 6 application, as prepared by the Superintendent of the West Virginia
- 7 State Police, in writing, duly verified, which sets forth only the
- 8 following licensing requirements:
- 9 (1) The applicant's full name, date of birth, social security
- 10 number and a description of the applicant's physical features;
- 11 (2) That, on the date the application is made, the applicant
- 12 is a bona fide resident of this state and of the county in which
- 13 the application is made and has a valid driver's license or other
- 14 state-issued photo identification showing the residence;
- 15 (3) That the applicant is twenty-one years of age or older:
- 16 Provided, That any individual who is less than twenty-one years of
- 17 age and possesses a properly issued concealed weapons license as of
- 18 the effective date of this article shall be licensed to maintain

- 20 of this section requiring new applicants to be at least twenty-one
- 21 years of age: Provided, however, That upon a showing of any

- 11 (6) That the applicant has not been convicted of a
- 12 misdemeanor offense of assault or battery either under the
- 13 provisions of section twenty-eight, article two of this chapter or
- 14 the provisions of subsection (b) or (c), section nine, article two
- 15 of this chapter in which the victim was a current or former spouse,
- 16 current or former sexual or intimate partner, person with whom the
- 17 defendant has a child in common, person with whom the defendant
- 18 cohabits or has cohabited, a parent or guardian, the defendant's
- 19 child or ward or a member of the defendant's household at the time
- 20 of the offense; or a misdemeanor offense with similar essential

- 22 (7) That the applicant is not under indictment for a felony
- 23 offense or is not currently serving a sentence of confinement,
- 24 parole, probation or other court-ordered supervision imposed by a

- 1 court of any jurisdiction or is the subject of an emergency or
- 2 temporary domestic violence protective order or is the subject of
- 3 a final domestic violence protective order entered by a court of
- 4 any jurisdiction;
- 5 (8) That the applicant is physically and mentally competent to 6 carry the weapon;
- 7 (9) That the applicant has not been adjudicated to be mentally 8 incompetent;
- 9 (10) That the applicant has qualified under the minimum
- 10 requirements set forth in subsection (d) of this section for
- 11 handling and firing the weapon: Provided, That this requirement
- 12 shall be waived in the case of a renewal applicant who has
- 13 previously qualified;
- 14 (11) That the applicant authorizes the sheriff of the county,
- 15 or his or her designee, to conduct an investigation relative to the
- 16 information contained in the application.
- 17 (b) The sheriff shall conduct an investigation including a
- 18 nationwide criminal background check, consisting of the National
- 19 Crime Information Center (NCIC), Interstate Identification Index
- 20 (III), National Instant Criminal Background Checks System (NICS)
- 21 and West Virginia criminal history record responses, in order to
- 22 verify that the information required in subdivisions (1), (2), (3),
- 23 (5), (6), (8) and (9), subsection (a) of this section is true and
- 24 correct.

- 1 (c) Sixty Fifty dollars of the application fee and any fees
 2 for replacement of lost or stolen licenses received by the sheriff
 3 shall be deposited by the sheriff into a concealed weapons license
 4 administration fund. The fund shall be administered by the sheriff
 5 and shall take the form of an interest bearing account with any
 6 interest earned to be compounded to the fund. Any funds deposited
 7 in this concealed weapon license administration fund are to be
 8 expended by the sheriff to pay for the costs associated with
 9 issuing concealed weapons licenses. Any surplus in the fund on
 10 hand at the end of each fiscal year may be expended for other law11 enforcement purposes or operating needs of the sheriff's office, as
 12 the sheriff may consider appropriate.
- 13 (d) All persons applying for a license must complete a
 14 training course in handling and firing a handgun. The successful
 15 completion of any of the following courses fulfills this training
 16 requirement:
- 17 (1) Any official National Rifle Association handgun safety or 18 training course;
- (2) Any handgun safety or training course or class available to the general public offered by an official law-enforcement organization, community college, junior college, college or private or public institution or organization or handgun training school utilizing instructors duly certified by the institution;
- 24 (3) Any handgun training or safety course or class conducted

- 1 by a handgun instructor certified as such by the state or by the
- 2 National Rifle Association;
- 3 (4) Any handgun training or safety course or class conducted
- 4 by any branch of the United States Military, Reserve or National
- 5 Guard.
- A photocopy of a certificate of completion of any of the
- 7 courses or classes or an affidavit from the instructor, school,
- 8 club, organization or group that conducted or taught said course or
- 9 class attesting to the successful completion of the course or class
- 10 by the applicant or a copy of any document which shows successful
- 11 completion of the course or class shall constitute evidence of
- 12 qualification under this section.
- 13 (e) All concealed weapons license applications must be
- 14 notarized by a notary public duly licensed under article four,
- 15 chapter twenty-nine of this code. Falsification of any portion of
- 16 the application constitutes false swearing and is punishable under
- 17 the provisions of section two, article five, chapter sixty-one of
- 18 this code.
- 19 (f) If the information in the application is found to be true
- 20 and correct, the sheriff shall issue a license. The sheriff shall
- 21 issue, reissue or deny the license within forty-five days after the
- 22 application is filed if all required background checks authorized
- 23 by this section are completed.
- 24 (g) Before any approved license shall be issued or become

- 1 effective, the applicant shall pay to the sheriff a fee in the
- 2 amount of \$15 \$25 which the sheriff shall forward to the
- 3 Superintendent of the West Virginia State Police within thirty days
- 4 of receipt. The license shall be valid for five years throughout
- 5 the state, unless sooner revoked.
- 6 (h) All persons holding a current and valid concealed weapons
- 7 license as of December 16, 1995, shall continue to hold a valid
- 8 concealed weapons license until his or her license expires or is
- 9 revoked as provided in this article: Provided, That all
- 10 reapplication fees shall be waived for applications received by
- 11 January 1, 1997, for any person holding a current and valid
- 12 concealed weapons license as of December 16, 1995, which contains
- 13 use restrictions placed upon the license as a condition of issuance
- 14 by the issuing circuit court. Any licenses reissued pursuant to
- 15 this subsection will be issued for the time period of the original
- 16 license.
- 17 (i) Each license shall contain the full name, date of birth
- 18 and address of the licensee and a space upon which the signature of
- 19 the licensee shall be signed with pen and ink. The issuing sheriff
- 20 shall sign and attach his or her seal to all license cards. The
- 21 sheriff shall provide to each new licensee a duplicate license
- 22 card, in size similar to other state identification cards and
- 23 licenses, suitable for carrying in a wallet, and the license card
- 24 is considered a license for the purposes of this section.

- 1 (j) The Superintendent of the West Virginia State Police shall 2 prepare uniform applications for licenses and license cards showing 3 that the license has been granted and shall do any other act 4 required to be done to protect the state and see to the enforcement 5 of this section.
- (k) If an application is denied, the specific reasons for the denial shall be stated by the sheriff denying the application. Any person denied a license may file, in the circuit court of the county in which the application was made, a petition seeking review of the denial. The petition shall be filed within thirty days of the denial. The court shall then determine whether the applicant is entitled to the issuance of a license under the criteria set forth in this section. The applicant may be represented by counsel, but in no case may the court be required to appoint counsel for an applicant. The final order of the court shall include the court's findings of fact and conclusions of law. If the final order upholds the denial, the applicant may file an appeal in accordance with the Rules of Appellate Procedure of the Supreme Court of Appeals.
- 20 (1) If a license is lost or destroyed, the person to whom the 21 license was issued may obtain a duplicate or substitute license for 22 a fee of \$5 by filing a notarized statement with the sheriff 23 indicating that the license has been lost or destroyed.
- 24 (m) The sheriff shall, immediately after the license is

- 1 granted as aforesaid, furnish the Superintendent of the West
- 2 Virginia State Police a certified copy of the approved application.
- 3 The sheriff shall furnish to the Superintendent of the West
- 4 Virginia State Police at any time so requested a certified list of
- 5 all licenses issued in the county. The Superintendent of the West
- 6 Virginia State Police shall maintain a registry of all persons who
- 7 have been issued concealed weapons licenses.
- 8 (n) All licensees must carry with them a state-issued photo
- 9 identification card with the concealed weapons license whenever the
- 10 licensee is carrying a concealed weapon. Any licensee who fails to
- 11 have in his or her possession a state-issued photo identification
- 12 card and a current concealed weapons license while carrying a
- 13 concealed weapon is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 14 thereof, shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$200 for
- 15 each offense.
- 16 (o) The sheriff shall deny any application or revoke any
- 17 existing license upon determination that any of the licensing
- 18 application requirements established in this section have been
- 19 violated by the licensee.
- 20 (p) A person who is engaged in the receipt, review or in the
- 21 issuance or revocation of a concealed weapon license does not incur
- 22 any civil liability as the result of the lawful performance of his
- 23 or her duties under this article.
- 24 (q) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this

1 section, with respect to application by a former law-enforcement 2 officer honorably retired from agencies governed by article 3 fourteen, chapter seven of this code; article fourteen, chapter 4 eight of this code; article two, chapter fifteen of this code; and 5 article seven, chapter twenty of this code, an honorably retired 6 officer is exempt from payment of fees and costs as otherwise 7 required by this section, and the application of the honorably 8 retired officer shall be granted without proof or inquiry by the 9 sheriff as to those requirements set forth in subdivision (9), 10 subsection (a) of this section, if the officer meets the remainder 10 of the requirements of this section and has the approval of the 12 appropriate chief law-enforcement officer.

(r) Except as restricted or prohibited by the provisions of this article or as otherwise prohibited by law, the issuance of a concealed weapon permit issued in accordance with the provisions of this section authorizes the holder of the permit to carry a concealed pistol or revolver on the lands or waters of this state.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to update and require additional information to be provided when an individual applies for a dangerous weapons license and establishes an increase in the fee payable to State Police for processing.
