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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$21-5A-1$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to wages for construction of public
12	improvements; and exempting Volunteer Fire Departments from
13	the definition of "public authority" if they are constructing
14	a facility to replace another one that has been destroyed.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §21-5A-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 5A. WAGES FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.
19	§21-5A-1. Definitions.
20	(1) The term "public authority," as used in this article,
21	shall mean means any officer, board or commission or other agency
22	of the State of West Virginia, or any political subdivision
23	thereof, authorized by law to enter into a contract for the

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1 construction of a public improvement, including any institution 2 supported ,in whole or in part, by public funds of the State of 3 West Virginia or its political subdivisions, and this article shall 4 apply applies to expenditures of such institutions made , in whole 5 or in part, from such public funds: <u>Provided</u>, That the term 6 <u>"public authority" does not include any volunteer fire department</u> 7 that contracts to construct a volunteer fire department facility: 8 <u>Provided</u>, however, That the volunteer fire department facility 9 contracted to be constructed is replacing a facility that has been 10 destroyed.

11 (2) The term "construction," as used in this article, shall 12 mean <u>means</u> any construction, reconstruction, improvement, 13 enlargement, painting, decorating, or repair of any public 14 improvement let to contract. The term "construction" shall <u>does</u> 15 not be construed to include temporary or emergency repairs.

16 (3) The term "locality" means the county where the 17 construction is to be performed, except that if there is not 18 available in the county a sufficient number of competent skilled 19 laborers, workmen and mechanics to perform such construction 20 efficiently and properly, and may include one or more counties in 21 this state adjacent to the one in which the construction is to be 22 performed and from which such skilled laborers, workmen and 23 mechanics may be obtained in sufficient numbers to perform the 24 construction. With respect to construction of public improvements

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1 with the State Road Commission, "locality" may be construed to 2 include one or more counties in this state adjacent to the one in 3 which the construction or public improvement is to be performed and 4 from which skilled laborers, workmen and mechanics may be 5 accessible for work on such construction on public improvements.

6 (4) The term "public improvement," as used in this article, 7 shall include <u>means</u> all buildings, roads, highways, bridges, 8 streets, alleys, sewers, ditches, sewage disposal plants, 9 waterworks, airports, and all other structures upon which 10 construction may be let to contract by the State of West Virginia 11 or any political subdivision thereof.

12 (5) The term "construction industry," as used in this article, 13 shall mean <u>means</u> that industry which is composed of employees and 14 employers engaged in construction of buildings, roads, highways, 15 bridges, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches, sewage disposal plants, 16 waterworks, airports, and all other structures or works whether 17 private or public on which construction work as defined in 18 subsection (2) of this section is performed.

19 (6) The term "board" shall mean <u>means</u> the minimum wage board 20 as constituted in this article.

(7) The term "employee," for the purposes of this article, shall <u>does</u> not be construed to include such persons as are employed or hired by the public authority on a regular or temporary basis or engaged in making temporary or emergency repairs.

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NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to exempt volunteer fire departments from the definition of "public authority" if they are constructing a facility to replace one that has been destroyed.
