| 16 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: | |
| 17 | That §11-21-21 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, | |

| 19 | ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL INCOME TAX. | |
| 20 | PART I. GENERAL. | |
| 21 | §11-21-21. Senior citizens' tax credit for property tax paid on | |

3 (a) Allowance of credit. --

4 (1) A low-income person who is allowed a \$20,000 homestead 5 exemption from the assessed value of his or her homestead for ad 6 valorem property tax purposes, as provided in section three, 7 article six-b of this chapter, shall be <u>is</u> allowed a refundable 8 credit against the taxes imposed by this article equal to the 9 amount of ad valorem property taxes paid on up to the first \$10,000 10 of taxable assessed value of the homestead for property tax years 11 that begin on or after January 1, 2003, except as provided in 12 subdivision (2) of this subsection.

13 (2) For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2007, a 14 low-income person who is allowed a \$20,000 homestead exemption from 15 the assessed value of his or her homestead for ad valorem property 16 tax purposes, as provided in section three, article six-b of this 17 chapter, shall be <u>is</u> allowed a refundable credit against the taxes 18 imposed by this article equal to the amount of ad valorem property 19 taxes paid on up to the first \$20,000 of taxable assessed value of 20 the homestead for property tax years that begin on or after 21 January 1, 2007: *Provided*, That for tax years beginning on and 22 after January 1, 2009, any person who is required to pay the 23 federal alternative minimum income tax in the current tax year is 24 disqualified from receiving any tax credit provided under this

1 section.

2 (3) Due to the administrative cost of processing, the 3 refundable credit authorized by this section may not be refunded if 4 less than \$10.

5 (4) The credit for each property tax year shall be claimed by 6 filing a claim for refund within three years after the due date for 7 the personal income tax return upon which the credit is first 8 available.

9 (b) Terms defined. --

10 For purposes of this section:

11 (1) "Low income" means federal adjusted gross income for the 12 taxable year that is one hundred fifty percent or less of the 13 federal poverty guideline for the year in which property tax was 14 paid, based upon the number of individuals in the family unit 15 residing in the homestead, as determined annually by the United 16 States Secretary of Health and Human Services. <u>Beginning on or</u> 17 <u>after July 1, 2012, "low income" means federal adjusted gross</u> 18 <u>income for the taxable year that is three hundred percent or less</u> 19 <u>of the federal poverty guideline for the year in which property tax</u> 20 <u>was paid, based upon the number of individuals in the family unit</u> 21 <u>residing in the homestead, as determined annually by the United</u> 22 <u>States Secretary of Health and Human Services.</u>

(2) (A) For tax years beginning before January 1, 2007, "taxes
24 paid" means the aggregate of regular levies, excess levies and bond

1 levies extended against not more than \$10,000 of the taxable 2 assessed value of a homestead that are paid during the calendar 3 year determined after application of any discount for early payment 4 of taxes but before application of any penalty or interest for late 5 payment of property taxes for a property tax year that begins on or 6 after January 1, 2003, except as provided in paragraph (B) of this 7 subdivision.

8 (B) For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2007, 9 "taxes paid" means the aggregate of regular levies, excess levies 10 and bond levies extended against not more than \$20,000 of the 11 taxable assessed value of a homestead that are paid during the 12 calendar year determined after application of any discount for 13 early payment of taxes but before application of any penalty or 14 interest for late payment of property taxes for a property tax year 15 that begins on or after January 1, 2007.

16 (c) Legislative rule. --

17 The Tax Commissioner shall propose a legislative rule for 18 promulgation as provided in article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of 19 this code to explain and implement this section.

20 (d) Confidentiality. --

21 The Tax Commissioner shall <u>utilize</u> <u>use</u> property tax 22 information in the statewide electronic data processing system 23 network to the extent necessary for the purpose of administering 24 this section, notwithstanding any provision of this code to the

1 contrary.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to change the qualifier for low income to three hundred percent or less of the federal poverty guideline from one hundred fifty percent or less of the federal poverty guideline for a senior citizens' homestead tax credit.
