SCHOOL PERSONNEL. 18 §18A-2-9. Duties and responsibilities of school principals; 19 assistant principals. 20 Upon the recommendation of the county superintendent of 21 schools, the county board of education shall employ and assign, 22 through written contract, public school principals who shall 23 supervise the management and the operation of the school or schools

- 1 to which they are assigned. Such The principals shall hold valid 2 administrative certificates appropriate for their assignments.
- Beginning on July 1, 1994, the prerequisites for issuance of 4 an administrative certificate for principals shall include that the 5 person has successfully completed at least six credit hours of 6 approved course work in public school management techniques at an 7 accredited institution of higher education and has successfully 8 completed education and training in evaluation skills through the 9 center for professional development, or equivalent education and 10 training in evaluation skills approved by the state board.
- Under the supervision of the superintendent and in accordance with the rules and regulations of the county board of education, the principal shall assume administrative and instructional supervisory responsibility for the planning, management, operation and evaluation of the total educational program of the school or schools to which he or she is assigned.
- The principal may submit recommendations to the superintendent regarding the appointment, assignment, promotion, transfer and dismissal of all personnel assigned to the school or schools under as aid principal's control. Such The recommendation shall be submitted in writing as prescribed by the superintendent.
- The principal shall perform such other duties as may be a sasigned by the superintendent pursuant to the rules and regulations of the county board of education.

  the county board of education shall, when needed, employ and
  assign, through written contract, an assistant principal at every
  school that has an enrollment equal to or that exceeds three
  hundred fifty students who shall work under the direction of the
  school principal. Such The assistant principals shall hold valid
- On or before July 1, 1989, and continuing thereafter, each county board of education shall assign a certificated principal to each school and no principal may be assigned more than two schools:

  11 Provided, That where enrollment exceeds four hundred students there will be no additional schools assigned to that principal.

7 administrative certificates appropriate for their assignments.

- No  $\underline{A}$  principal assigned to more than one school may <u>not</u> be assigned any teaching duties except on a temporary emergency basis. 15 No  $\underline{A}$  county <u>shall may not</u> have more teaching principalships or the multischool principalships than was present on January 1, 1988.
- On or before July 1, 1993, and continuing thereafter, each county board of education shall employ a full-time supervising principal at each school whose net enrollment equals or exceeds one hundred seventy students. A principal assigned to a school with a principal enrollment equal to or greater than one hundred seventy students may not be assigned any teaching duties except on a temporary emergency basis. When a principal is assigned on a full-time basis to a school whose net enrollment is more than seventy-

1 five students but less than one hundred seventy students, such 2 principal shall have a minimum of twenty hours per week for 3 nonteaching duties. A principal assigned on a full-time basis to 4 a school with seventy-five students or less shall have a minimum of 5 ten hours per week for nonteaching duties: *Provided*, That nothing 6 in this section prohibits a county board of education from 7 assigning a full-time supervising principal to a school with a net 8 enrollment of less than one hundred seventy students.

Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to reduce or limit the rights and privileges of principals and assistant principals as teachers under the provisions of section one, article one, chapter eighteen of the Code of West Virginia as amended; section one, article one, chapter eighteen-a; and other provisions of this code: *Provided*, That on or before July 1, 1993, the State Board of Education shall not deny a county board of education the right to place a principal in a school with less than one hundred seventy students.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the employment of assistant principals at schools with enrollments of three hundred fifty or more students.
