2 (a) (1) No person, except those hereinafter expressly 3 exempted, may drive any motor vehicle upon a street or highway in 4 this state or upon any subdivision street used by the public 5 generally unless the person has a valid driver's license issued 6 pursuant to this code for the type or class of vehicle being 7 driven.

8 (2) Any person licensed to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to 9 this code may exercise the privilege thereby granted in the manner 10 provided in this code and, except as otherwise provided by law, is 11 not required to obtain any other license to exercise the privilege 12 by any county, municipality or local board or body having authority 13 to adopt local police regulations.

(b) The division, upon issuing a driver's license, shall indicate on the license the type or general class or classes of vehicles the licensee may operate in accordance with this code, federal law or rule. Licenses shall be issued in different colors for those drivers under age eighteen, those drivers age eighteen to wenty-one and adult drivers. The commissioner is authorized to select and assign colors to the licenses of the various age groups. (c) Driver's licenses issued by the division shall be classified in the following manner:

(1) A Class A, B or C license shall be issued to those personseighteen years of age or older with two years of driving experience

1 who have qualified for the commercial driver's license established 2 by chapter seventeen-e of this code and the federal Motor Carrier 3 Safety and Improvement Act of 1999 and subsequent rules, and have 4 paid the required fee.

(2) A Class D license shall be issued to those persons 5 6 eighteen years and older with one year of driving experience who 7 operate motor vehicles other than those types of vehicles which 8 require the operator to be licensed under the provisions of chapter 9 seventeen-e of this code and federal law and rule and whose primary 10 function or employment is the transportation of persons or property 11 for compensation or wages and have paid the required fee. For the 12 purpose of regulating the operation of motor vehicles, wherever the 13 term "chauffeur's license" is used in this code, it shall be 14 construed to mean the Class A, B, C or D license described in this 15 section or chapter seventeen-e of this code or federal law or rule: 16 Provided, That anyone not required to be licensed under the 17 provisions of chapter seventeen-e of this code and federal law or 18 rule and who operates a motor vehicle registered or required to be 19 registered as a Class A motor vehicle, as that term is defined in 20 section one, article ten, chapter seventeen-a of this code, with a 21 gross vehicle weight rating of less than eight thousand one pounds, 22 is not required to obtain a Class D license.

(3) A Class E license shall be issued to those persons who24 have qualified for a driver's license under the provisions of this

1 chapter and who are not required to obtain a Class A, B, C or D 2 license and who have paid the required fee. The Class E license 3 may be endorsed under the provisions of section seven-b of this 4 article for motorcycle operation. The Class E or (G) license for 5 any person under the age of eighteen may also be endorsed with the 6 appropriate graduated driver license level in accordance with the 7 provisions of section three-a of this article.

8 (4) A Class F license shall be issued to those persons who 9 successfully complete the motorcycle examination procedure provided 10 by this chapter and have paid the required fee, but who do not 11 possess a Class A, B, C, D or E driver's license.

12 (5) A Class G driver's license or instruction permit shall be 13 issued to a person using bioptic telescopic lenses who has 14 successfully completed an approved driver training program and 15 complied with all other requirements of article two-b of this 16 chapter.

17 (d) All licenses issued under this section may contain 18 information designating the licensee as a diabetic, organ donor, as 19 deaf or hard-of-hearing or as having any other handicap or 20 disability, according to criteria established by the division, if 21 the licensee requests this information on the license.

(e) No person, except those hereinafter expressly exempted, 23 may drive any motorcycle upon a street or highway in this state or 24 upon any subdivision street used by the public generally unless the 1 person has a valid motorcycle license, a valid license which has 2 been endorsed under section seven-b of this article for motorcycle 3 operation or a valid motorcycle instruction permit.

4 (f) (1) An identification card may be issued to any person 5 who:

6 (A) Is a resident of this state in accordance with the 7 provisions of section one-a, article three, chapter seventeen-a of 8 this code;

9 (B) Has reached the age of two years. The division may also 10 issue an identification card to a person under the age of two years 11 for good cause shown;

12 (C) Has paid the required fee of \$2.50 per year: *Provided*, 13 That the fee is not required if the applicant is sixty-five years 14 or older or is legally blind; and

15 (D) Presents a birth certificate or other proof of age and 16 identity acceptable to the division with a completed application on 17 a form furnished by the division.

(2) The identification card shall contain the same information 19 as a driver's license except that the identification card shall be 20 clearly marked as an identification card. However, the division 21 may issue an identification card with less information to persons 22 under the age of sixteen. An identification card may be renewed 23 annually on application and payment of the fee required by this 24 section. 1 (A) Every identification card issued to a person who has 2 attained his or her twenty-first birthday shall expire on the 3 licensee's birthday in those years in which the licensee's age is 4 evenly divisible by five. Except as provided in paragraph (B) of 5 this subdivision, no identification card may be issued for less 6 than three years or for more than seven years and expires on the 7 licensee's birthday in those years in which the licensee's age is 8 evenly divisible by five.

9 (B) Every identification card issued to a person who has not 10 attained his or her twenty-first birthday shall expire thirty days 11 after the licensee's twenty-first birthday.

12 (C) Every identification card issued to persons under the age 13 of sixteen shall be issued for a period of two years and shall 14 expire on the last day of the month in which the applicant's 15 birthday occurs.

16 (3) The division may issue an identification card to an 17 applicant whose privilege to operate a motor vehicle has been 18 refused, canceled, suspended or revoked under the provisions of 19 this code.

20 <u>(g) All licenses and identification cards issued under this</u> 21 <u>section may contain information designating the licensee as a</u> 22 <u>military veteran, according to criteria established by the</u> 23 <u>division, if the individual is in fact a veteran and requests this</u> 24 information be included on the license or identification card. In 1 the event a veteran makes this request before the expiration date
2 of his or her current license or card, all fees relating to a
3 replacement of a current license or card otherwise required by this
4 code, including, but not limited to, paragraph (C), subdivision
5 (1), subsection (f) of this section and section eight of this
6 article, are waived.

7 (g) (h) Any person violating the provisions of this section is 8 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not 9 more than \$500; and upon a second or subsequent conviction, shall 10 be fined not more than \$500 or confined in jail not more than six 11 months, or both fined and confined.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit licenses and identification cards issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles to identify the individual as a veteran if the individual is in fact a veteran and requests this information be included on the license or identification card. The bill also permits a veteran to be issued a replacement license or card without charge if the request is made before the expiration date of the current license or card.
