NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to raise the civil penalties that the Public Service Commission can impose for violations of Gas Pipeline Safety Act from the existing \$1,000 for each violation to \$100,000 for each day of violation to a maximum of \$1 million for any related series of violations. This change would mirror the federal regulations.
