L 5	person who is an honorably discharged veteran of any branch of
L 6	the armed forces of the United States; and redefining
L 7	"previously licensed" as an applicant who has held at least a
L 8	level two or similar driver's licensing level or class.
L 9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That $\$17B-2-1$ and $\$17B-2-6$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
21	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
22	ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL.
2.3	\$17B-2-1. Drivers must be licensed; types of licenses; licensees

- need not obtain local government license; motorcycle
- 2 driver license; identification cards.
- (a) A person, except those hereinafter expressly exempted, may 4 not drive any motor vehicle upon a street or highway in this state 5 or upon any subdivision street, as used in article twenty-four, 6 chapter eight of this code, when the use of the subdivision street 7 is generally used by the public unless the person has a valid 8 driver's license under the provisions of this code for the type or 9 class of vehicle being driven.
- Any person licensed to operate a motor vehicle as provided in 11 this code may exercise the privilege thereby granted as provided in 12 this code and, except as otherwise provided by law, is not required 13 to obtain any other license to exercise the privilege by any 14 county, municipality or local board or body having authority to 15 adopt local police regulations.
- (b) The division, upon issuing a driver's license, shall indicate on the license the type or general class or classes of the vehicle or vehicles the licensee may operate in accordance with the provisions of this code, federal law or rule. Licenses shall be issued in different colors for those drivers under age eighteen, those drivers age eighteen to twenty-one and adult drivers. The commissioner is authorized to select and assign colors to the licenses of the various age groups.

- 1 (c) Driver's licenses issued by the division shall be 2 classified in the following manner:
- 3 (1) Class A, B or C license shall be licenses are issued to 4 those persons eighteen years of age or older with two years' 5 driving experience and who have qualified for the commercial 6 driver's license established by chapter seventeen-e of this code 7 and the federal Motor Carrier Safety and Improvement Act of 1999 8 and subsequent rules, and have paid the required fee.
- 10 persons eighteen years and older with one year of driving
 11 experience who operate motor vehicles other than those types of
 12 vehicles which require the operator to be licensed under the
 13 provisions of chapter seventeen-e of this code and federal law and
 14 rule and whose primary function or employment is the transportation

 17 of a motor vehicle, wherever the term chauffeur's license is used

 20 code or federal law or rule. Provided, That Anyone who is not
 21 required to be licensed under the provisions of chapter seventeen-e
 22 of this code and federal law or rule and who operates a motor
 23 vehicle which is registered or which is required to be registered

- 3 weight rating of less than eight thousand one pounds, is not 4 required to obtain a Class D license.

The Class E license may be endorsed 9 under the provisions of section seven-b of this article for 10 motorcycle operation. The Class E license for any person under the 11 age of eighteen may also be endorsed with the appropriate graduated 12 driver license level in accordance with the provisions of section

- 2 (d) A person, except those hereinafter expressly exempted, may
- 3 not drive any motorcycle upon a street or highway in this state or

- 1 (2) The identification card shall contain the same information 2 as a driver's license except that the identification card shall be 3 clearly marked as identification card. However, The division may 4 issue an identification card with less information to persons under 5 the age of sixteen It which may be renewed on application and 6 payment of the fee required by this section.
- (A) Every identification card issued to persons who have attained their twenty-first birthday shall expire expires on the day of the month designated by the commissioner in which the applicant's birthday occurs in those years in which the applicant's age is evenly divisible by five. Except as provided in paragraph (B) of this subdivision, no identification card may be issued for last than three years nor more than seven years and shall be is valid for a period of five years expiring in the month in which the applicant's birthday occurs and in a year in which the applicant's age is evenly divisible by five.
- 17 (B) Every identification card issued to persons who have not 18 attained their twenty-first birthday shall expire expires on the 19 day of the month designated by the commissioner in the year in 20 which the applicant attains the age of twenty-one years.
- (C) Every identification card issued to persons under the age 22 of sixteen shall expire expires on the day of the month designated 23 by the commissioner in which the applicant's birthday occurs and

- 11 §17B-2-6. Application for license or instruction permit; fee to
- 12 accompany application.
- (a) Every application for an instruction permit or for a
- 14 driver's license shall be made upon a form furnished by the
- 15 division. Every application shall be accompanied by the proper fee
- 16 and payment of the fee shall entitle entitles an applicant under
- 17 the age of eighteen to not more than two attempts at the written
- 18 test or not more than three attempts to pass the road skills test.
- 19 An applicant age eighteen years or older is entitled to not more
- 20 than two attempts at the written test or not more than three
- 21 attempts to pass the road skills test within a period of ninety
- 22 days from the date of issuance of the instruction permit. An
- 23 applicant who fails either the written test or the road skills test

1 may not be tested twice within a period of one week.

 11 address of the applicant and briefly describe the applicant. and

 13 theretofore been a licensed driver and, if so, when and by what

 14 state or country and whether any such the license has ever been

 15 suspended or revoked within the five years next preceding within

 16 five years of the date of application. or whether an application

 17 The application shall state whether an application has ever been

 18 refused and, if so, the date of and reason for the suspension,

 19 revocation or refusal. The application will indicate whether the

 20 applicant desires a notation on the driver's license indicating

 21 that the applicant is an organ donor, in accordance with article

 22 one-b of this chapter a or diabetic, deaf, or hard of hearing, or

 23 has any other handicap or disability or is an honorably discharged

- 1 veteran of any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States and
- 2 such other pertinent information as the commissioner may require.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that drivers licenses may contain information designating the licensee as a person who is an honorably discharged veteran of any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, if requested. The bill also redefines 'previously licensed' as an applicant who has held at least a level two or comparable driver's license.
