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11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$17A-3-23$ of the Code of West Virginia,
12	1931, as amended, relating to registration plates for state,
13	county, municipal and other governmental vehicles; authorizing
14	the Commissioner of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue no
15	more than five Class A registration plates to the division for
16	vehicles to be used by investigators for commercial driver
17	examination fraud investigation and driver's license issuance
18	fraud detection and fraud prevention; authorizing the
19	commissioner to issue Class A registration plates to Medicaid
20	Fraud Control Unit and the West Virginia Insurance Fraud Unit;
21	deleting an outdated requirement; and providing penalties.
22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

23 That §17A-3-23 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,

1 be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

2 ARTICLE 3. ORIGINAL AND RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION; ISSUANCE OF 3 CERTIFICATES OF TITLE.

4 §17A-3-23. Registration plates to state, county, municipal and
other governmental vehicles; use for undercover
activities.

7 (a) Any motor vehicle designed to carry passengers, owned or 8 leased by the State of West Virginia, or any of its departments, 9 bureaus, commissions or institutions, except vehicles used by the 10 Governor, Treasurer, three vehicles per elected office of the Board 11 of Public Works, vehicles operated by the State Police, not to 12 exceed five vehicles operated by the Office of the Secretary of 13 Military Affairs and Public Safety, not to exceed five vehicles 14 operated by the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency 15 Management, vehicles operated by natural resources police officers 16 of the Division of Natural Resources, not to exceed ten vehicles 17 operated by the arson investigators of the Office of State Fire 18 Marshal, not to exceed two vehicles operated by the Division of 19 Protective Services, not to exceed sixteen vehicles operated by the Office of the Alcohol Beverage Control 20 inspectors of 21 Commissioner and vehicles operated by probation officers employed 22 under the Supreme Court of Appeals may not be operated or driven by

1 any person unless it has displayed and attached to the front 2 thereof, in the same manner as regular motor vehicle registration 3 plates are attached, a plate of the same size as the regular 4 registration plate, with white lettering on a green background 5 bearing the words "West Virginia" in one line and the words "State 6 Car" in another line and the lettering for the words "State Car" 7 shall be of sufficient size to be plainly readable from a distance 8 of one hundred feet during daylight.

9 The vehicle shall also have attached to the rear a plate 10 bearing a number and any other words and figures as the 11 Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall prescribe. The rear plate 12 shall also be green with the number in white.

(b) On registration <u>Registration</u> plates issued to vehicles 14 owned by counties the color shall be white on red with the word 15 "County" on top of the plate and the words "West Virginia" on the 16 bottom.

17 <u>(c)</u> On any registration <u>Registration</u> plates issued to a city 18 or municipality the color shall be white on blue with the word 19 "City" on top and the words "West Virginia" on the bottom.

20 <u>(d)</u> *Provided*, That after December 31, 2006, registration 21 <u>Registration</u> plates issued to a city or municipality law-22 enforcement department shall include blue lettering on a white 23 background with the word "West Virginia" on top of the plate and

1 shall be further designed by the commissioner to include a law-2 enforcement shield together with other insignia or lettering 3 sufficient to identify the motor vehicle as a municipal law-4 enforcement department motor vehicle. The colors may not be 5 reversed and shall be of reflectorized material. The registration 6 plates issued to counties, municipalities and other governmental 7 agencies authorized to receive colored plates hereunder shall be 8 affixed to both the front and rear of the vehicles. Every 9 municipality shall provide the commissioner with a list of law-10 enforcement vehicles operated by the law-enforcement department of 11 the municipality, unless otherwise provided in this section, and a 12 fee of \$10 for each vehicle submitted by July 1, 2006.

(c) (e) Registration plates issued to vehicles operated by 14 county sheriffs shall be designed by the commissioner in 15 cooperation with the sheriffs' association with the word "Sheriff" 16 on top of the plate and the words "West Virginia" on the bottom. 17 The plate shall contain a gold shield representing the sheriff's 18 star and a number assigned to that plate by the commissioner. 19 Every county sheriff shall provide the commissioner with a list of 20 vehicles operated by the sheriff, unless otherwise provided in this 21 section, and a fee of \$10 for each vehicle submitted by July 1, 22 2002.

23 (d) (f) The commissioner is authorized to designate the colors

1 and design of any other registration plates that are issued without 2 charge to any other agency in accordance with the motor vehicle 3 laws.

4 (e) (g) Upon application, the commissioner is authorized to 5 issue a maximum of five Class A license plates per applicant to be 6 used by county sheriffs and municipalities on law-enforcement 7 vehicles while engaged in undercover investigations.

8 (h) The commissioner is authorized to issue a maximum of five 9 Class A license plates to be used on vehicles assigned to the 10 Division of Motor Vehicle investigators for commercial driver 11 examination fraud investigation and driver's license issuance fraud 12 detection and fraud prevention.

13 (f) (i) The commissioner is authorized to issue an unlimited 14 number of license plates per applicant to authorized drug and 15 violent crime task forces in the State of West Virginia when the 16 chairperson of the control group of a drug and violent crime task 17 force signs a written affidavit stating that the vehicle or 18 vehicles for which the plates are being requested will be used only 19 for official undercover work conducted by a drug and violent crime 20 task force.

21 (g) (j) The commissioner is authorized to issue twenty Class
22 A license plates to the Criminal Investigation Division of the
23 Department of Revenue for use by its investigators.

1 (h) (k) The commissioner may issue a maximum of ten Class A 2 license plates to the Division of Natural Resources for use by 3 natural resources police officers. The commissioner shall 4 designate the color and design of the registration plates to be 5 displayed on the front and the rear of all other state-owned 6 vehicles owned by the Division of Natural Resources and operated by 7 natural resources police officers.

8 (i) (1) The commissioner is authorized to issue an unlimited 9 number of Class A license plates to the Commission on Special 10 Investigations for state-owned vehicles used for official 11 undercover work conducted by the Commission on Special 12 Investigations.

13 (m) The commissioner is authorized to issue a maximum of two 14 Class A plates to the Division of Protective Services for state-15 owned vehicles used by the Division of Protective Services in 16 fulfilling its mission.

17 (n) The commissioner is authorized to issue Class A 18 registration plates for vehicles used by the Medicaid Fraud Control 19 Unit created by section seven, article seven, chapter nine of this 20 <u>code.</u>

(o) The commissioner is authorized to issue Class A
 registration plates for vehicles used by the West Virginia
 Insurance Fraud Unit created by section eight, article forty-one,

1 chapter thirty-three of this code.

2 (j) (p) No other registration plate may be issued for, or 3 attached to, any state-owned vehicle.

4 (k) (g) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall have a 5 sufficient number of both front and rear plates produced to attach 6 to all state-owned cars. The numbered registration plates for the 7 vehicles shall start with the number five hundred and the 8 commissioner shall issue consecutive numbers for all state-owned 9 cars.

10 (1) (r) It is the duty of each office, department, bureau, 11 commission or institution furnished any vehicle to have plates as 12 described herein affixed thereto prior to the operation of the 13 vehicle by any official or employee.

(m) (s) The commissioner may issue special registration plates for motor vehicles titled in the name of the Division of Public Transit or in the name of a public transit authority as defined in this subsection and operated by a public transit authority or a public transit provider to transport persons in the public interest. For purposes of this subsection, "public transit authority" means an urban mass transportation authority created pursuant to the provisions of article twenty-seven, chapter eight of this code or a nonprofit entity exempt from federal and state

1 to provide mass transportation to the public at large. The special 2 registration plate shall be designed by the commissioner and shall 3 display the words "public transit" or words or letters of similar 4 effect to indicate the public purpose of the use of the vehicle. 5 The special registration plate shall be issued without charge.

6 (n) (t) Any person who violates the provisions of this section 7 is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 8 fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$100. Magistrates have 9 concurrent jurisdiction with circuit courts for the enforcement of 10 this section.

<sup>(</sup>NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Commissioner of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue no more than five Class A registration plates to the division for vehicles to be used by investigators for commercial driver examination fraud investigation and driver's license issuance fraud detection and fraud prevention. The bill authorizes the commissioner to issue Class A registration plates to Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the West Virginia Insurance Fraud Unit. The bill deletes the outdated requirement that municipalities provide the commissioner with lists of vehicles used by their law-enforcement departments. The bill also provides for penalties.
