| 10 | A BILL to amend and reenact $\$20-2-22$ of the Code of West Virginia, |

| 14 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: |
| 15 | That $$20-2-22$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, |
| 16 | be amended and reenacted to read as follows: |
| 17 | ARTICLE 2. WILDLIFE RESOURCES. |
| 18 | §20-2-22. Tagging, removing, transporting and reporting bear, |
| 19 | deer, wild boar and wild turkey. |
| 20 | (a) Each person killing a bear, bobcat, deer, wild boar or |
| 21 | wild turkey found in a wild state shall either attach a completed |
| 22 | game field tag to the animal or remain with the animal and have |
| 23 | upon his or her person a completed game field tag before removing |

- 1 the carcass in any manner from where it was killed.
- 2 (b) While transporting the carcass of a bear, bobcat, deer,
- 3 wild boar or wild turkey from where it was killed, each person
- 4 shall either attach a completed game field tag to the animal or
- 5 have upon his or her person a completed game field tag.
- 6 (c) Upon arriving at a residence, camp, hunting lodge, vehicle
- 7 or vessel each person shall attach a game field tag to the killed
- 8 bear, bobcat, deer, wild boar or wild turkey. The game field tag
- 9 shall remain on the carcass until it is retagged with a game tag by
- 10 a natural resources police officer or an official checking station.
- 11 The game tag shall remain on the carcass until it is dressed for
- 12 consumption.
- 13 (d) If a person who does not possess a game field tag kills a
- 14 bear, bobcat, deer, wild boar or wild turkey, he or she shall make
- 15 a tag. The field tag shall bear the name, address and, if
- 16 applicable, the license number of the hunter and the time, date and
- 17 county of killing.
- 18 (e) The carcass of a wild turkey shall be delivered to a
- 19 natural resources police officer or an official checking station
- 20 for checking and retagging before it is either skinned or
- 21 transported beyond the boundaries of the county adjacent to that in
- 22 which the kill was made.
- 23 (f) The fresh skin and head or carcass of the deer shall be

- 1 delivered to a natural resources police officer or an official
- 2 checking station for checking and retagging before it is
- 3 transported beyond the boundaries of the county adjacent to that in
- 4 which the kill was made.
- 5 (g) A person who kills a bear shall treat the carcass and
- 6 remains in accordance with the provisions of section twenty-two-a
- 7 of this article.
- 8 (h) For each violation of this section a person is subject to
- 9 the penalties provided in this article.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to remove bobcats from the list of species that requires a field tag. This will bring bobcats into consistency with those species of furbearers which are required to be checked at an official game check station (e.g. beaver, fisher and otter) but are not required to be field tagged.
