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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-1-3a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to the provision of a ballot for
12	the Office of President and Vice President for registered
13	voters moving from the state during the thirty days
14	immediately preceding the election for that office.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §3-1-3a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.
19	§3-1-3a. Persons entitled to vote under federal Voting Rights Act
20	Amendments of 1970; authority of Secretary of State.
21	(1) Any citizen of the United States who is a resident of the
22	state and who applies, not later than thirty days immediately prior
23	to any presidential election for registration or qualification to

1 vote for the choice of electors for president and vice-president, 2 or for president and vice-president, in such election, and who is 3 otherwise qualified to vote, may register to vote, and vote, for 4 the choice of electors for president and vice-president, or for 5 president and vice-president, in such election, as provided by the 6 federal Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970.

7 (2) Any citizen of the United States who has moved his or her 8 residence from this state within thirty days next preceding any 9 election for president and vice-president, and who was otherwise 10 qualified to vote in this state as of the date of his or her change 11 of has satisfied the registration residence and who not 12 requirements of the state to which he or she has moved, may vote 13 for the choice of electors for president and vice-president, or for 14 president and vice-president, in such election, as provided by the 15 federal Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970. cast a vote for the 16 offices of president and vice-president: (i) In person in the 17 precinct where he or she was registered immediately prior to 18 moving; (ii) in person at any designated early voting location 19 serving the precinct from which the voter has moved; or (iii) by 20 absentee ballot. The voter's request for a ballot due to a move 21 out-of-state after the thirtieth day preceding the election shall 22 serve as authorization for removal from the West Virginia voter 23 rolls as provided in the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, 24 42 USC Chapter 20 1973gg-6(a)(3)(A). The request for such ballot

1 shall be on a form prescribed by the Secretary of State and, in the
2 case of an absentee ballot, shall be received by the clerk of the
3 county commission of the last county of residence no later than the
4 sixth day prior to the general election.

5 <u>(3) Any citizen of the United States who is otherwise</u> 6 <u>qualified to vote in any election for president and vice-president</u> 7 <u>shall not be denied the right to vote for such offices due to the</u> 8 <u>failure to comply with any durational residency requirement of the</u> 9 state or political subdivision.

10 <u>(4) No citizen of the United States may be denied the right to</u> 11 vote for electors for president and vice-president, or for 12 president and vice-president, in any election because of failure of 13 the citizen to be physically present in the state or political 14 subdivision at the time of the election if the citizen has complied 15 with the requirements prescribed by the laws of this state for the 16 casting of an absentee ballot in the election.

17 (3) (5) Any citizen of the United States who has attained the 18 age of eighteen years but who has not attained the age of twenty-19 one years by the time of the next ensuing primary or election in 20 which he may vote under section 302 of the federal Voting Rights 21 Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and limited by the United 22 States supreme court, and who is otherwise qualified to vote, may 23 vote in any primary or election for those candidates for whom he <u>or</u> 24 she is entitled to vote under said section 302 of the federal

Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and limited by
 the United States supreme court.

(4) (6) The Secretary of State shall have authority to make, 3 4 amend and rescind such rules, regulations, orders and instructions, 5 and prescribe such registration and voting procedures, forms 6 (including registration, ballot and ballot label forms), lists and 7 records, as may be necessary in order for this state to fully 8 implement, and comply with, the federal voting laws Voting Rights 9 Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and limited by the United 10 States supreme court, and it shall be the duty of all public 11 officers, election officers, boards and commissioners having any 12 authority or responsibility in connection with any election, to 13 comply with all such rules, regulations, orders and instructions, 14 and use, make, follow or comply with all such registration and 15 voting procedures, forms (including registration, ballot and ballot 16 label forms), lists and records as have been prescribed by the 17 Secretary of State under the foregoing authority vested in that 18 office.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to conform West Virginia code to federal requirements for the provision of Presidential office ballots to registered voters moving from the state.
