19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That §22-5-19 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
21	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
22	ARTICLE 5. AIR POLLUTION CONTROL.
23	§22-5-19. Inventory of greenhouse gases.
24	(a) The secretary is authorized to propose legislative rules
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1 for promulgation in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-2 nine-a of this code, establishing a net greenhouse gas inventory to 3 determine whether West Virginia is a net sink or emitter of 4 greenhouse gas and whether greenhouse gas can be developed as an 5 asset for economic development by establishing an inventory using 6 reasonable estimates of current and future greenhouse gas 7 emissions. The inventory shall include all significant emissions, 8 reductions, capture and sequestration of greenhouse gases from 9 stationary, area and mobile sources, such as power plants, waste 10 combustors, natural gas/oil systems, landfills, and waste water 11 treatment facilities, highway and nonroad sources, agricultural 12 sources and shall consider direct (geologic) and indirect 13 (terrestrial) carbon sequestration. Stationary sources are not 14 required to but may submit to the secretary estimates of carbon 15 sequestration activities.

1 thirty-two and six tenths tons per year for nitrous oxide, eight 2 hundred fifty-five thousandths tons per year for 3 hydrofluorocarbons, one and nine hundredths tons per year for 4 perfluorocarbons and forty-two hundredths tons per year for sulfur 5 hexafluoride. Stationary sources shall only be required to report 6 the annual quantities of nonmobile source, anthropogenic emissions 7 of greenhouse gases, and shall not be required to report naturally 8 occurring emissions of greenhouse gases. Only those stationary 9 sources who are otherwise required to report emissions of regulated 10 air pollutants under rules promulgated by the secretary pursuant to 11 section four of this article, shall be required to report their 12 greenhouse gas emissions under this section. Stationary sources 13 which are not required to report air emissions under this section 14 and are regulated by the secretary under the provisions of article 15 three, chapter twenty-two of this code are not required to, but may 16 voluntarily, report such emissions. The reporting entities will be 17 permitted to provide existing and ongoing documented inventories, 18 such as those provided to the Environmental Protection Agency's 19 Climate Leaders Program, Chicago Climate Exchange Registry, the 20 International Organization for Standardization, the SF6 Emissions 21 Reduction Partnership for Electric Power Systems or other widely 22 recognized and verified greenhouse gas inventory programs to 23 completely fulfill their West Virginia program reporting 24 requirements.

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1 (c) The secretary shall establish a voluntary program under 2 which the department registers voluntary reductions in emissions of 3 greenhouse gases for reductions made before mandated by law. The 4 voluntary program shall include, but not be limited to, developing 5 criteria for establishing baseline emissions, quantifying emission 6 reductions and providing public recognition. The department shall 7 consider the information recorded in the voluntary emission 8 reduction registry when determining baselines and reduction 9 requirements under future emission reduction programs implemented 10 under federal law.

(d) To inventory greenhouse gas reductions, the secretary shall consult and coordinate with other state agencies and higher education institutions, the citizenry and other entities such as industry trade groups that have knowledge or information relating to greenhouse gas emissions, measurement protocols, greenhouse gas reductions and sequestration including, but not limited to, the Department of Agriculture, the Division of Forestry, Marshall University, West Virginia University and the Department of Transportation. These governmental entities shall enter into interagency agreements with the secretary and shall cooperate by: (i) Providing information relating to greenhouse gas emissions, reductions and sequestration; and (ii) providing any necessary assistance to the secretary in effectuating the purposes of this article. The secretary shall determine the form and format of the

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1 information submitted by these entities.

(e) In establishing the net greenhouse gas inventory program,
the department shall make the program as consistent as possible
with other state and federal programs designed to monitor, quantify
and register reductions in emissions of greenhouse gases as
referenced in subsection (b) of this section. are subject to
mandatary federal greenhouse gases reporting requirements. Before
imposing additional greenhouse gas reporting requirements on these
sources the secretary shall obtain available emissions data
directly from the appropriate federal entity, including the United
States Environmental Protection Agency.
(f) (b) As used in this section, "greenhouse gas" means carbon
dioxide, methane, nitrous oxide, hydroflurocarbons,

14 perfluorocarbons and sulfur hexafluoride.

⁽NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to modify the Department of Environmental Protection's requirements to inventory emissions of greenhouse gases and eliminate unneeded provisions. It allows reporting of greenhouse gases under the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Mandatory Reporting of Greenhouse Gases Rule to satisfy greenhouse gas reporting requirements in West Virginia.
