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11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$30-7-1$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
12	1931, as amended; to amend said code by adding thereto a new	
13	section, designated §30-7-1a; and to amend and reenact	
14	30-7-15a, $30-7-15b$ and $30-7-15c$ of said code, all relating	
15	to replacing the term "advanced nurse practitioner" with	
16	"advanced practice registered nurse"; providing a new	
17	definition; making technical corrections; providing a	
18	grandfather clause; permitting the West Virginia Board of	
19	Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses to set an	
20	application fee; and providing rule-making authority.	
21	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
22	That §30-7-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
23	be amended and reenacted; that said code be amended by adding	

1 thereto a new section, designated \$30-7-1a; and that \$30-7-15a, 2 \$30-7-15b and \$30-7-15c of said code be amended and reenacted, all 3 to read as follows:

4 ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSES.

5 §30-7-1. Definitions.

6 As used in this article the term:

7 (a) The practice of "advanced practice registered nurse" is 8 a registered nurse who has acquired advanced clinical knowledge and 9 skills preparing him or her to provide direct and indirect care to 10 patients, who has completed a board approved graduate-level 11 education program and who has passed a board approved national 12 certification examination. An advanced practice registered nurse 13 shall meet all the requirements set forth by the board by rule for 14 an advance practice registered nurse which shall include, at a 15 minimum, a valid license to practice as a certified registered 16 nurse anesthetist, a certified nurse midwife, a clinical nurse 17 specialist or a certified nurse practitioner.

18 (a) (b) "Board" shall mean means the West Virginia Board of 19 Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses;

20 (b) (c) The practice of "registered professional nursing" 21 shall mean means the performance for compensation of any service 22 requiring substantial specialized judgment and skill based on 23 knowledge and application of principles of nursing derived from the

1 biological, physical and social sciences, such as responsible 2 supervision of a patient requiring skill in observation of symptoms 3 and reactions and the accurate recording of the facts, or the 4 supervision and teaching of other persons with respect to such 5 principles of nursing, or in the administration of medications and 6 treatments as prescribed by a licensed physician or a licensed 7 dentist, or the application of such nursing procedures as involve 8 understanding of cause and effect in order to safeguard life and 9 health of a patient and others;

10 (c) (d) "Temporary permit" means a permit authorizing the 11 holder to practice registered professional nursing in this state 12 until such permit is no longer effective or the holder is granted 13 a license by the West Virginia State Board of Examiners for 14 Registered Professional Nurses.

15 §30-7-1a. Eligibility fo licensure by meeting requirements which 16 existed prior to the legislative enactments during the 2012 17 legislative session.

An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered 19 nurse as set forth in section one of this article who completed an 20 advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified in 21 advance practice by West Virginia or another state before September 22 30, 2011, may apply for and receive an advanced practice registered 23 nurse license if that applicant meets the requirements that were in

1 place in West Virginia at the time the applicant qualified for 2 initial advanced practice licensure.

Prescriptive authority for prescription drugs; 3 **§30-7-15a**. 4 collaborative relationship with physician 5 requirements; promulgation of rules; classification of drugs to 6 be prescribed; 7 coordination with other boards; coordination with 8 Board of Pharmacy.

9 (a) The board may, in its discretion, authorize an advanced 10 nurse practitioner advanced practice registered nurse to prescribe 11 prescription drugs in a collaborative relationship with a physician 12 licensed to practice in West Virginia and in accordance with 13 applicable state and federal laws. An authorized advanced nurse 14 practitioner advanced practice registered nurse may write or sign 15 prescriptions or transmit prescriptions verbally or by other means 16 of communication.

17 (b) For purposes of this section an agreement to a 18 collaborative relationship for prescriptive practice between a 19 physician and an advanced nurse practitioner advanced practice 20 registered nurse shall be set forth in writing. Verification of 21 such agreement shall be filed with the board by the advanced nurse 22 practitioner advanced practice registered nurse. The board shall

1 forward a copy of such verification to the board of Medicine and 2 the board of Osteopathic Medicine. Collaborative agreements shall 3 include, but not be limited to, the following:

4 (1) Mutually agreed upon written guidelines or protocols for
5 prescriptive authority as it applies to the advanced nurse
6 practitioner's advanced practice registered nurse's clinical
7 practice;

8 (2) Statements describing the individual and shared 9 responsibilities of the advanced nurse practitioner <u>advanced</u> 10 <u>practice registered nurse</u> and the physician pursuant to the 11 collaborative agreement between them;

12 (3) Periodic and joint evaluation of prescriptive practice;13 and

14 (4) Periodic and joint review and updating of the written 15 guidelines or protocols.

(c) The board shall promulgate legislative rules in accordance 17 with the provisions of chapter twenty-nine-a of this code governing 18 the eligibility and extent to which an advanced nurse practitioner 19 advanced practice registered nurse may prescribe drugs. Such rules 20 shall provide, at a minimum, a state formulary classifying those 21 categories of drugs which shall not be prescribed by advanced nurse 22 practitioners advanced practice registered nurses, including, but 23 not limited to, Schedules I and II of the Uniform Controlled

1 Substances Act, anticoagulants, antineoplastics, radio-2 pharmaceuticals and general anesthetics. Drugs listed under 3 schedule III shall be limited to a seventy-two hour supply without 4 refill.

5 (d) The board shall consult with other appropriate boards for6 the development of the formulary.

7 (e) The board shall transmit to the Board of Pharmacy a list
8 of all advanced nurse practitioners <u>advanced practice registered</u>
9 <u>nurse</u> with prescriptive authority. The list shall include:

10 (1) The name of the authorized advanced nurse practitioner 11 advanced practice registered nurse;

12 (2) The prescriber's identification number assigned by the13 board; and

14 (3) The effective date of prescriptive authority.

15 §30-7-15b. Eligibility for prescriptive authority; application; 16 fee.

17 An advanced nurse practitioner <u>advanced practice registered</u> 18 nurse who applies for authorization to prescribe drugs shall:

(a) Be licensed and certified in West Virginia as an advanced
nurse practitioner holding a baccalaureate degree in science or the
arts advanced practice registered nurse;

22 (b) Not be less than eighteen years of age;

23 (c) Provide the board with evidence of successful completion

1 of forty-five contact hours of education in pharmacology and 2 clinical management of drug therapy under a program approved by the 3 board, fifteen hours of which shall be completed within the two-4 year period immediately before the date of application;

5 (d) Provide the board with evidence that he or she is a person 6 of good moral character and not addicted to alcohol or the use of 7 controlled substances; and

8 (e) Submit a completed, notarized application to the board,
9 accompanied by a fee of \$125 as established by the board by rule.
10 \$30-7-15c. Form of prescriptions; termination of authority;
11 renewal; notification of termination of authority.
12 (a) Prescriptions authorized by an advanced nurse practitioner
13 advanced practice registered nurse must comply with all applicable
14 state and federal laws; must be signed by the prescriber with the
15 initials "A.N.P." "A.P.R.N." or the designated certification title
16 of the prescriber; and must include the prescriber's identification
17 number assigned by the board or the prescriber's national provider
18 identifier assigned by the National Provider System pursuant to 45

19 C.F.R §162.408.

(b) Prescriptive authorization shall be terminated if the
advanced nurse practitioner advanced practice registered nurse has:
(1) Not maintained current authorization as an advanced nurse
practitioner advanced practice registered nurse; or

1 (2) Prescribed outside the advanced nurse practitioner's 2 <u>advanced practice registered nurse's</u> scope of practice or has 3 prescribed drugs for other than therapeutic purposes; or

4 (3) Has not filed verification of a collaborative agreement 5 with the board.

6 (c) Prescriptive authority for an advanced nurse practitioner 7 <u>advanced practice registered nurse</u> must be renewed biennially. 8 Documentation of eight contact hours of pharmacology during the 9 previous two years must be submitted at the time of renewal.

10 (d) The board shall notify the Board of Pharmacy, and the 11 board of Medicine <u>and the board of Osteopathic Medicine</u> within 12 twenty-four hours after termination of, or change in, an advanced 13 nurse practitioner's <u>advanced practice registered nurse's</u> 14 prescriptive authority.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to replace the term "advanced nurse practitioner" with "advanced practice registered nurse". The bill provides a new definition and makes technical corrections. The bill provides a grandfather clause. The bill eliminates the current application fee of \$125 and permits the West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses to establish a new fee. The bill also provides rule-making authority.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

\$30-7-1a is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.

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
