PURCHASING DIVISION. 21 §5A-3-3. Powers and duties of Director of Purchasing. The director, under the direction and supervision of the 22 23 secretary, shall be is the executive officer of the Purchasing

- 2 (1) Direct the activities and employees of the Purchasing 3 Division:
- 4 (2) Ensure that the purchase of or contract for commodities
- 5 shall be are based, whenever possible, on competitive bid;
- 6 (3) <u>Purchasing Purchase</u> or contract for, in the name of the 7 state, the commodities and printing required by the spending units 8 of the state government;
- 9 (4) Apply and enforce standard specifications established in 10 accordance with section five of this article as hereinafter 11 provided;
- 12 (5) Transfer to or between spending units or sell commodities
 13 that are surplus, obsolete or unused as hereinafter provided;
- 14 (6) Have charge of central storerooms for the supply of 15 spending units, as the director deems considers advisable;
- 16 (7) Establish and maintain a laboratory for the testing of 17 commodities and make use of existing facilities in state 18 institutions for that purpose as hereinafter provided, as the 19 director deems considers advisable;

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require vendors, contractors, subcontractors and their employees to submit to a criminal background check if they will be at a state facility or have access to sensitive or critical information.
