15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

18	ARTICLE 2. LIMITATION OF ACTIONS AND SUITS.
19	§55-2-6a. Deficiencies, injuries or wrongful death resulting from
20	any improvements to or survey of real property;
21	limitation of actions and suits.
22	No action, whether in contract or in tort, for indemnity or

1 otherwise, nor any action for contribution or indemnity to recover 2 damages for any deficiency in the planning, design, surveying, 3 observation or supervision of any construction or the actual 4 construction of any improvement to real property, or the actual 5 surveying of real property, or, to recover damages for any injury 6 to real or personal property, or, for an injury to a person or for 7 bodily injury or wrongful death arising out of the defective or 8 unsafe condition of any improvement to real property, or the survey 9 of real property, may be brought more than ten years after the 10 performance or furnishing of such the services or construction. 11 Provided, That However, the above period shall be is tolled 12 according to the provisions of section twenty-one of this article. 13 The period of limitation provided in this section shall does not 14 commence until the improvement to the real property, or the survey 15 of the real property in question has been occupied or accepted by 16 the owner of the real property, whichever occurs first.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to impose a ten year statute of limitations on any civil action derived from the actual surveying of real property, starting after the performance or furnishing of the services.
