A BILL to amend and reenact §18-10A-2a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to changing the basis for the county salary supplement equivalent pay rate for division of rehabilitation teachers from the amount paid to teachers by the board of education of the county in which facility in which the teacher works is located to the amount paid to teachers by the board of education of the county in which the division of rehabilitation administrative headquarters are located.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18-10A-2a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 10A. REHABILITATION SERVICES.

§18-10A-2a. Rehabilitation teachers.

18 be construed as follows:

1	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to

3	rehabilitation teachers shall be paid at the equivalent rate of

14	increase in salary, pursuant to section seventeen, article four,

16	continue to receive the increased salary level.

19 (a) (1) "Rehabilitation teacher" means any person 20 employed by the division and who meets the certification 21 requirements of section two-a, article three, chapter eighteen-22 a of this code, or who has been certified to teach by a state or 23 nationally recognized organization, as approved by the office 24 of the secretary of education and the arts. Such The teachers 25 shall maintain current certification in their teaching areas in order to remain employed Such persons also shall and may 26 27 teach only in the areas in which they are certified: Provided, 28 That teachers who were employed on or before April 1, 1995, 29 shall be are exempt from the following requirements: 30 (1) (A) Certification pursuant to section two-a, article three, chapter eighteen-a of this code; 31 32 (2) (B) Maintenance of current certification in their 33 teaching areas in order to remain employed; and

(3) (C) Teaching only in the areas in which they are certified.

(b) (2) "Equivalent rate of pay" means an annualized rate

based on a two hundred forty-day teaching schedule and

includes pay for vacation and legal state holidays.
