(BY DELEGATES MORGAN, DOYLE AND LAWRENCE)

[Introduced January 17, 2012; referred to the Committee on Government Organization.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §30-27-3 and §30-27-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931 as amended, all relating to professions and occupations; Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists; and creating a license to practice hair styling.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-27-3 and §30-27-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 27. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS.

§30-27-3. Definitions.

- 1 As used in this article, the following words and terms have
- 2 the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates

- 4 (a) "Aesthetics" or "esthetics" means any one or any
- 5 combination of the following acts when done on the human
- 6 body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
- 7 (1) Administering cosmetic treatments to enhance or
- 8 improve the appearance of the skin, including cleansing,
- 9 toning, performing effleurage or other related movements,
- 10 stimulating, exfoliating or performing any other similar
- procedure on the skin of the human body or scalp;
- 12 (2) Applying, by hand or with a mechanical or electrical
- 13 apparatus, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders, clays,
- 14 antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations
- 15 necessary for the practice of aesthetics to another person's
- 16 face, neck, back, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and
- including the knee;
- 18 (3) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
- 19 grooming of another person's face, neck, back, shoulders,
- 20 hands, elbows and feet up to and including the knee;
- 21 (4) The waxing, tweezing and threading of hair on
- 22 another person's body;

- 23 (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body wrap;
- 24 (6) Applying artificial eyelashes and eyebrows; and
- 25 (7) The lightening of hair on the body except the scalp.
- 26 (b) "Aesthetician" or "esthetician" means a person 27 licensed under the provisions of this article who engages in
- 28 the practice of aesthetics.
- (c) "Applicant" means a person making application for a
 professional license, license, certificate, registration, permit
 or renewal under the provisions of this article.
- 32 (d) "Barber" means a person licensed under the 33 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of 34 barbering.
- 35 (e) "Barbering" means any one or any combination of the 36 following acts when done on the human body for 37 compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
- 38 (1) Shaving, shaping and/or trimming the beard, or both;
- 39 (2) Cutting, singeing, shampooing, arranging, dressing,
- 40 tinting, bleaching or applying lotions or tonics on human
- 41 hair, or a wig or hairpiece; and

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- 42 (3) Applications, treatments or rubs of the scalp, face or
- 43 neck with oils, creams, lotions, cosmetics, antiseptics,
- 44 powders or other preparations in connection with the shaving,
- 45 cutting or trimming of the hair or beard.
- 46 (f) "Barber crossover" or "cosmetologist crossover" is a
- 47 person who is licensed to perform barbering and
- 48 cosmetology.
- 49 (g) "Barber permanent waving" means the following acts
- done on the human body for compensation and not for the
- 51 treatment of disease:
- 52 (1) The bleaching or tinting of hair; and
- 53 (2) The permanent waving of hair.
- 54 (h) "Barber permanent wavist" means a person licensed
- 55 to perform barbering and barber permanent waving.
- (i) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Barbers and
- 57 Cosmetologists.
- 58 (j) "Certificate" means an instructor certificate to teach in
- a school under the provisions of this article.

- 60 (k) "Certificate holder" means a person certified as an
- 61 instructor to teach in a school under the provisions of this
- 62 article.
- (1) "Cosmetologist" means a person licensed under the
- 64 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of
- 65 cosmetology.
- (m) "Cosmetology" means any one or any combination
- of the following acts when done on the human body for
- 68 compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
- 69 (1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding,
- 70 weaving, dressing, adding extensions, curling, waving,
- 71 permanent waving, relaxing, straightening, shampooing,
- 72 cleansing, singeing, bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing,
- 73 tweezing, or similarly work on human hair, or a wig or
- 74 hairpiece, by any means, including hands, mechanical or
- 75 electrical devices or appliances;
- 76 (2) Nail care;
- 77 (3) Applying by hand or with a mechanical or electrical
- device or appliance, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders,

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- 79 clays, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical
- 80 preparations necessary for the practice of aesthetics to
- another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands, elbows and
- 82 feet up to and including the knee;
- 83 (4) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
- grooming of another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands,
- 85 elbows and feet up to and including the knee;
- 86 (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body
- 87 wrap; and
- 88 (6) Performing aesthetics.
- 89 (n) "General supervision" means:
- 90 (1) For schools, a master or certified instructor is on the
- 91 premises and is quickly and easily available; or
- 92 (2) For salons, a professional licensee is on the premises
- and is quickly and easily available.
- 94 (o) "Hair braiding" means any one or any combination of
- 95 the following acts when done on the human body for
- ompensation and not for the treatment of disease: Braiding,
- 97 plaiting, twisting, wrapping, threading, weaving, extending

98	or locking of natural human hair by hand or mechanical

100	(p) "Hair Styling" means any one or any combination of
101	the following acts when done on the human body for
102	compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

113	(q) "Hair Stylist" means a person licensed under the

- (u) (w) "Permitee" means a person holding a work

- (z) (bb) "Salon license" means a license to own and 147

- 149 (aa) (cc) "School" means a facility to educate persons to
- be licensed with professional licenses under the provisions of 150
- 151 this article.

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- 152 (bb) (dd) "School license" means a license to own and

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- operate a school.
- (cc) (ee) "Student registration" means a registration
- issued by the board to a student to study at a school licensed
- under the provisions of this article.

§30-27-8. Professional license requirements.

- 1 (a) An applicant for a professional license to practice as
- 2 a aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent
- 3 wavist, cosmetologist, hair stylist, cosmetologist crossover or
- 4 nail technician shall present satisfactory evidence that he or
- 5 she:
- 6 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;
- 7 (2) Is of good moral character;
- 8 (3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the
- 9 "ability to benefit test" approved by the United States
- 10 Department of Education;
- 11 (4) Has graduated from a school which has been
- 12 approved by the board;

(5) Has passed an examination that tests the applicant's

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- 14 knowledge of subjects specified by the board: Provided, That the board may recognize a certificate or similar license 15 in lieu of the examination or part of the examination that the 16 17 board requires; 18 (6) Has paid the applicable fee; 19 (7) Presents a certificate of health from a licensed physician; 20 (8) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for 21 employment in the United States; and 22 (9) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the 23 board.
- (b) A license to practice issued by the board prior to July
 1, 2009, shall for all purposes be considered a professional
 license issued under this article: *Provided*, That a person
 holding a license issued prior to July 1, 2009, must renew the
 license pursuant to the provisions of this article.

NOTE: The purpose of the bill is to create a hair stylist license.
