A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated, §16-44-1, relating to a responsible parent program pilot project; authorizing Department of Health and Human Resources in conjunction with the Division of Corrections to create the pilot project; providing criteria to participate in the project; providing educational topics for the project; and providing reporting requirements.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

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That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §16-44-1, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 44. RESPONSIBLE PARENT PROGRAM PILOT-PROJECT.

§16-44-1. Authorization of responsible parent program pilotproject.

(a) The Division of Corrections in an affort to improve

11	(C) Have an income that is at two hundred percent or

(D) Are within six months of their release from prison or

have been previously incarcerated, and

- 27 (iii) Resume drafting, completion of a job application,

- 33 (3) Requires the successful completion of a transitional
