18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That §24B-4-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
20	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
21	ARTICLE 4. HEARINGS; BURDEN OF PROOF; ENFORCEMENT.
22	§24B-4-6. Penalties.
23	(a) Any person who violates any provision of this chapter or
24	any valid regulation or order issued thereunder shall be <u>is</u> subject

to a civil penalty to be imposed by the commission not to exceed \$\frac{\$1,000}{\$200,000}\$ for each violation for each day the violation persists: Provided, That the maximum aggregate civil penalty shall may not exceed \$\frac{\$200,000}{\$2}\$ \$\frac{\$11100}{\$200,000}\$ for any related series of

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violations.

Any civil penalty may be compromised by the commission. 6 7 In determining the amount of penalty, or the amount agreed upon in 8 compromise, the commission shall consider the appropriateness of 9 the penalty to the size of the business of the person charged, the 10 gravity of the violation, and the good faith of the person charged 11 in attempting to achieve compliance after notification of the 12 violation. shall be considered The amount of the penalty, when 13 finally determined, or the amount agreed upon in compromise, may be 14 deducted from any sums owing by the state to the person charged or

may be recovered in a civil action in the state courts.

- (c) Civil penalties collected <u>by the commission</u> under this section shall be <u>paid into the State Treasury</u> <u>submitted to the</u>
 Treasurer for deposit into the General Revenue Fund.
- (d) No civil penalty paid under this section may be considered by the commission in support of any application for a rate increase submitted by the violator.
