15	counseling related administrative and other counseling related

17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That §18-5-18b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.
21	§18-5-18b. School counselors in public schools.
22	(a) A school counselor means a professional educator who holds
23	a valid school counselor's certificate in accordance with article
24	three, of this chapter chapter eighteen-a of this code.
25	(b) Each county board shall provide counseling services for
26	each pupil enrolled in the public schools of the county.

1 (c) The school counselor shall work with individual pupils and 2 groups of pupils in providing developmental, preventive and 3 remedial guidance and counseling programs to meet academic, social, 4 emotional and physical needs; including programs to identify and 5 address the problem of potential school dropouts. The school 6 counselor also may provide consultant services for parents, 7 teachers and administrators and may use outside referral services, 8 when appropriate, if no additional cost is incurred by the county 9 board.

10 (d) The state board may adopt rules consistent with the 11 provisions of this section that define the role of a school 12 counselor based on the "National Standards for School Counseling 13 Programs" of the American school counselor association. A school 14 counselor is authorized to perform such services as are not 15 inconsistent with the provisions of the rule as adopted by the 16 state board. To the extent that any funds are made available for 17 this purpose, county boards shall provide training for counselors 18 and administrators to implement the rule as adopted by the state 19 board.

20 (e) Each county board shall develop a comprehensive drop-out 21 prevention program utilizing the expertise of school counselors and 22 any other appropriate resources available.

(f) School counselors shall be full-time professional personnel. <u>School counselors</u> shall spend at least <del>seventy-five</del> <u>seventy</u> percent of <u>their</u> work time in a direct <u>or indirect</u> <u>counseling relationship with at-risk students and other pupils</u>, and

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1 shall devote no more than one fourth of the work day to
2 administrative activities: *Provided*, That such activities are
3 counselor related and all remaining work time on only counseling
4 related administrative and other counseling related duties.

5 (g) Nothing in this section prohibits a county board from 6 exceeding the provisions of this section, or requires any specific 7 level of funding by the Legislature.
