12	creating a criminal offense of possession of burglar's tools; and

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by
16	adding thereto a new section, designated §61-3-11a, to read as
17	follows:
18	ARTICLE 3. CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY.
19	<pre>§61-3-11a. Possession of burglar's tools; penalties.</pre>
20	(a) A person is guilty of possession of burglar's tools when he
21	or she, individually or in concert with another, possesses any
22	tool, instrument or other thing adapted, designed or commonly
23	used for committing or facilitating the commission of an offense
24	involving forcible entry into premises or theft by a physical
25	taking under circumstances which leave no reasonable doubt as to

1	his or her:
2	(1) Intention to use the tool or tools in the commission of an
3	offense involving forcible entry into the property of another
4	without the permission of the owner or owners thereof; and
5	(2) Knowledge that the person individually, or in concert with
6	another, intends to use the same in the commission of an offense
7	involving forcible entry as described in subdivision (1) of this
8	subsection.
9	(b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty
10	of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not
11	more than \$1,000 or confined in jail for not more than one year,
12	or both.
