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12	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
13	adding thereto a new article, designated \$18B-3F-1, \$18B-3F-2,
14	\$18B-3F-3, \$18B-3F-4, \$18B-3F-5, \$18B-3F-6, \$18B-3F-7, \$18B-
15	3F-8 and §18B-3F-9, all relating to reorganization and
16	consolidation of Bridgemont Community and Technical College
17	and Kanawha Valley Community and Technical College; creating
18	an independent, multi-campus community and technical college
19	on June 30, 2013; abolishing certain boards of governors and
20	providing for appointment of a new board of governors on June
21	30, 2013; setting forth legislative findings; providing
22	definitions; requiring development of a strategic
23	reorganization plan; establishing an administrative planning
24	committee; committee membership, powers and duties;

- 1 termination date; appointing president and other officers;
- 2 specifying certain duties; providing for transfer of assets
- 3 and liabilities, operating budgets, orders, rules and
- 4 procedures; clarifying employee rights and benefits when
- 5 positions are abolished; and requiring notification of
- 6 employment status by certain date under certain circumstances.
- 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 8 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
- 9 by adding thereto a new article, designated \$18B-3F-1, \$18B-3F-2,
- 10 \$18B-3F-3, \$18B-3F-4, \$18B-3F-5, \$18B-3F-6, \$18B-3F-7, \$18B-3F-8
- 11 and §18B-3F-9, all to read as follows:
- 12 ARTICLE 3F. REORGANIZATION OF COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGES.
- 13 §18B-3F-1. Legislative findings.
- (a) The Legislature finds that while certain areas of the state currently lack a sufficient population or employer base to support an independent community and technical college, it is vital to the citizens and businesses of these areas to have access to secondary comprehensive, high-quality community and technical education programs and services that are well articulated with the public schools, baccalaureate institutions and other community and technical colleges; that make the most efficient and effective use of facilities, faculty, staff, equipment and other available resources; that encourage students of all ages, ability levels and economic circumstances to pursue a lifetime of learning; that serve

- 1 as engines of economic development; and that have the ability to 2 adapt quickly to changing needs for workforce training.
- (b) The Legislature further finds that a critical need exists 4 to enhance the role of technical education in every area of the 5 state; to encourage and strengthen collaborative and cooperative 6 relationships between and among institutions in order to provide 7 the highest quality programs and services most effectively; and to 8 make the most efficient use of scarce resources while avoiding, to extent practicable, duplication of administrative 9 the 10 programmatic costs. Establishment of multicampus institutions 11 provides an excellent opportunity to implement more effective and 12 efficient systems of program delivery and to explore alternative 13 organizational and management structures best suited to serving the 14 needs of students, employers and the citizens of a geographic 15 region. Reorganization offers an efficient and effective method to 16 provide high-quality, comprehensive community and technical 17 education in an area where two institutions serve the same 18 community and technical college district or population center. 19 Creating a consolidated multicampus institution will enhance the 20 delivery of comprehensive community and technical college education 21 to that entire geographical region.

22 §18B-3F-2. Definitions.

23 (a) General. - For the purposes of this article, terms have 24 the meaning ascribed to them in section two, article one of this

- 1 chapter, unless the context in which the term is used clearly
- 2 requires a different meaning or a specific definition is provided
- 3 in this section.
- 4 (b) Definitions. -
- 5 (1) "Administrative planning committee" or "planning
- 6 committee" means the advisory group established pursuant to section
- 7 seven of this article to advise the governing board of the
- 8 reorganized multicampus community and technical college and to
- 9 serve as liaison to the council.
- 10 (2) "Affected institution" means a community and technical
- 11 college which is included in a reorganization.
- 12 (3) "Chancellor" means the chief executive officer of the
- 13 council appointed pursuant to section three, article two-b of this
- 14 chapter.
- 15 (4) "Consolidated institution" means a community and technical
- 16 college formed by joining together one or more institutions to
- 17 create a new multicampus college or integrating one or more
- 18 institutions into an existing institution to form one multicampus
- 19 college. An institution that is included in a consolidation or
- 20 integrated into an existing institution ceases to exist as an
- 21 independent institution of higher education.
- 22 (5) "Institution" means any community and technical college
- 23 under the jurisdiction of the council.
- 24 (6) "Multicampus institution" means a college that has more

- 1 than one campus as defined and approved by the Higher Learning
- 2 Commission of the North Central Association of Schools and 3 Colleges.
- 4 (7) "Institutional reorganization" or "reorganization" means
 5 the process of combining institutions to form a consolidated
 6 community and technical college or integrating one institution into
 7 another.
- 8 (8) "Strategic reorganization plan" or "plan" means the 9 document developed in accordance with section eight of this article 10 consisting of strategies, procedures and guidelines to be used in 11 implementing an institutional reorganization.

12 §18B-3F-3. Appointment of institutional board of governors.

- (a) Effective June 30, 2013, Bridgemont Community and Technical College and Kanawha Valley Community and Technical College become one independent, multicampus community and technical college administered by its own governing board under the 17 jurisdiction and authority of the council and subject to all applicable provisions of this chapter and chapter eighteen-c of this code. The boards of governors of Bridgemont Community and Technical College and Kanawha Valley Community and Technical College are abolished on June 30, 2013.
- (1) The consolidated institution is comprised of existing campuses in Montgomery and South Charleston and any other campuses that may be established in the future, in accordance with the

- 1 Higher Learning Commission standards of accreditation.
- 2 (2) The board of governors of the consolidated institution
- 3 shall develop, implement and complete the reorganization by July 1,
- 4 2014.
- 5 (3) Beginning on July 1, 2013, and thereafter, any reference in
- 6 this code to Bridgemont Community and Technical College or Kanawha
- 7 Valley Community and Technical College means the multicampus
- 8 institution created pursuant to this article.
- 9 (b) Initial appointments to the board of governors of the
- 10 reorganized institution are made pursuant to the provisions of
- 11 section one, article two-a of this chapter, except as follows:
- 12 (1) As soon after the effective date of this article as
- 13 practicable, but before July 1, 2013, the Governor shall select lay
- 14 citizen members of the board of governors for the consolidated
- 15 institution from the former lay citizen members of each of the
- 16 boards of governors of the affected institutions. The Governor
- 17 shall apportion the appointments as equally as possible among the
- 18 lay citizen members of the boards of the affected institutions.
- 19 (2) Four of the initial appointments are for terms of four
- 20 years and five of the initial appointments are for terms of three
- 21 years.
- (c) At the end of each initial term, and thereafter, an
- 23 appointment to the board of governors of the consolidated
- 24 institution, either to fill a vacancy or to reappoint a member who

- 1 is eligible to serve an additional term, shall be made in 2 accordance with section one, article two-a of this chapter.
- 3 (d) As soon after the effective date of this article as 4 practicable, but before July 1, 2013, the presidents of the 5 affected institutions shall facilitate separate meetings of their 6 combined faculty members, their combined student bodies and their 7 combined classified employees. The purpose of these meetings is to 8 elect a representative from each group to serve on the consolidated 9 board of governors as required by section one, article two-a of 10 this chapter.
- (e) The chancellor shall call the first meeting of the board 12 of governors as soon after June 30, 2013, as feasible, at which 13 time the members shall elect a chairperson and other officers 14 pursuant to article two-a of this chapter. Thereafter, the board 15 shall hold an annual meeting in June of each year for the purpose 16 of electing officers.

17 §18B-3F-4. Powers and duties of board of governors.

- 18 (a) The actions of the board of governors appointed pursuant
 19 to section three of this article are subject to the terms and
 20 conditions prescribed in article two-a of this chapter. The board
 21 has all the powers and duties provided in section four, article
 22 two-a of this chapter.
- 23 (b) The programs of the consolidated institution are operated 24 under the rules and procedures of the institution's board of

- 1 governors, which, initially, shall adopt rules from one or both of
- 2 the affected institutions until the time when new or revised rules
- 3 are proposed and approved pursuant to section six, article one of
- 4 this chapter.
- 5 (1) The administrative planning committee shall make 6 recommendations to the board of governors regarding which of the

7 rules of the affected institutions should be adopted.

- 8 (2) Nothing in this section requires the initial rules of the 9 board of governors to be promulgated again under the rule adopted 10 by the council for community and technical college education 11 pursuant to section six, article one of this chapter unless the 12 rules are rescinded, revised, amended or otherwise altered.
- (c) It is the duty of the board of governors of the consolidated institution to adopt rules and procedures that authorize, support and encourage the consolidated institution to fulfill its core mission. It is further the specific duty of the board of governors to facilitate delivery of a comprehensive program of community and technical college education in all the counties that are served by the multicampus consolidated institution. To that end, the board shall expend from the appropriations allocated to the affected institutions such funds as are necessary or expedient to operate and conduct programs, to acquire clear title to any real property and to make necessary capital improvements.

- 1 (d) In addition to the powers and duties set forth in this 2 section and in article two-a of this chapter, the board of 3 governors shall perform the following duties:
- 4 (1) Choose a name for the consolidated multicampus institution 5 from the recommendations submitted by the Administrative Planning 6 Committee pursuant to section seven of this article.
- 7 (2) Choose the president of one of the affected institutions 8 to serve as president of the consolidated institution pursuant to 9 section five of this article;
- 10 (3) Determine which positions of the affected institutions are
 11 to be abolished and notify employees as required by section nine of
 12 this article; and
- 13 (4) Serve as the designated board of advisors for the 14 Advantage Valley Advanced Technology Center created by section 15 fourteen, article three-c of this chapter.

16 §18B-3F-5. Appointment of institutional president; other officers.

(a) The board of governors shall designate the president of 18 one of the affected institutions to serve as president of the 19 consolidated multicampus institution. The other president shall 20 serve as provost or chief executive officer of his or her 21 respective campus. The salary and benefits of an individual who is 22 serving as an institutional president at the time of a 23 reorganization may not be reduced solely as a result of the 24 reorganization. Provosts and chief executive officers report

- 1 directly to the president of the consolidated institution.
- 2 (b) After the initial contract period ends or at the
- 3 expiration of a president's current contract, the board of
- 4 governors of the consolidated multicampus institution shall appoint
- 5 and evaluate the president in accordance with section six, article
- 6 one-b of this chapter.
- 7 §18B-3F-6. Budget; transfer of financial assets, property,
- 8 liability, orders, policies, procedures, etc.
- 9 (a) When a reorganized institution is created, the operating
- 10 budget of each affected institution is integrated under the
- 11 authority and jurisdiction of the board of governors of the
- 12 consolidated institution.
- 13 (b) All financial assets, including state fund balances, and
- 14 liabilities are transferred from the authority of the board of
- 15 governors of each affected institution to the authority of the
- 16 board of governors of the consolidated institution.
- 17 (c) Any capital debt service payment formerly the
- 18 responsibility of an affected institution or the affected
- 19 institution's share of any capital debt service payment of its
- 20 former sponsoring institution continues in the required amount and
- 21 is the responsibility of the board of governors of the consolidated
- 22 institution.
- 23 (d) The titles to all real property, facilities and equipment
- 24 of, as well as each valid agreement and obligation undertaken by,

- 1 the affected institutions are transferred to the board of governors
- 2 of the consolidated institution, which shall exercise general
- 3 determination, control, supervision and management of the
- 4 financial, business and education policies and affairs of the
- 5 consolidated multicampus institution.
- 6 (e) The title to all property purchased for the use of an
- 7 affected institution is vested in the board of governors of the
- 8 consolidated multicampus institution.
- 9 §18B-3F-7. Administrative planning committee; purpose; membership;
- 10 duties; termination.
- 11 (a) On the effective date of this article, or as soon
- 12 thereafter as practicable, the council shall establish an
- 13 administrative planning committee to advise in the reorganization
- 14 of Bridgemont and Kanawha Valley Community and Technical Colleges.
- 15 (b) Membership. The administrative planning committee
- 16 consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) The president of each affected institution;
- 18 (2) The chair of the board of governors of each affected
- 19 institution;
- 20 (3) The chair of the council;
- 21 (4) The vice chancellor for administration, appointed pursuant
- 22 to section two, article four of this chapter, or a designee; and
- 23 (5) The chancellor, who chairs the planning committee.
- 24 (c) The administrative planning committee serves in an

- 1 advisory capacity to the board of governors in developing the
- 2 strategic reorganization plan and serves as liaison to the council
- 3 during the reorganization period.
- 4 (d) The administrative planning committee shall submit to the
- 5 board of governors a list of at least three names from which the
- 6 board shall choose a name for the consolidated, multicampus
- 7 community and technical college at their first meeting as soon
- 8 after June 30, 2013, as feasible.
- 9 (e) The planning committee shall report to the council at
- 10 least quarterly, or more often if requested, on development of the
- 11 strategic reorganization plan and the progress of the board of
- 12 governors in implementing the reorganization.
- 13 (f) The administrative planning committee is created
- 14 specifically to assist in the reorganization of Bridgemont and
- 15 Kanawha Valley Community and Technical Colleges and ceases to exist
- 16 on July 1, 2014, or on the date when the council determines the
- 17 reorganization has been completed, whichever occurs first.
- 18 §18B-3F-8. Strategic reorganization plan.
- 19 (a) The board of governors, with the advice of the
- 20 administrative planning committee, shall develop a strategic
- 21 reorganization plan for Bridgemont and Kanawha Valley Community and
- 22 Technical Colleges, including all campuses and instruction sites of
- 23 each institution. The board of governors shall develop, implement
- 24 and complete the reorganization by July 1, 2014.

- 1 (b) The reorganization plan includes, but is not limited to, 2 the following elements:
- 3 (1) A time line showing specific steps for completing the 4 reorganization by July 1, 2014;
- 5 (2) A procedure to assure that all employees of the affected 6 institutions are notified of their employment status pursuant to 7 section nine of this article;
- 8 (3) A statement of assurance showing specific steps to be
 9 taken to safeguard the rights, privileges and benefits of faculty,
 10 classified employees and nonclassified employees of the affected
 11 institutions including provisions for fulfilling contracts and
 12 protecting earned benefits;
- 13 (4) A description of the instructional benefits expected from 14 the reorganization including a detailed explanation of enhancements 15 to academic program offerings, workforce development programs for 16 employers and services to students;
- (5) A description of the fiscal benefits expected from the reorganization including a detailed explanation of management 9 efficiencies, enhanced leadership skills, better coordination of 20 instruction and student support services and efficiencies in 21 expenditures per full-time equivalent student;
- 22 (6) A statement of assurance that student access to high-23 quality education programming will be enhanced and/or maintained; 24 and

- 1 (7) A strategy to secure regional accreditation of the 2 reorganized institution by July 1, 2014.
- 3 §18B-3F-9. Rights and benefits of employees of affected
- 4 institutions; positions to be abolished; notice of employment
- 5 status by certain date required.
- 6 (a) By December 31, 2013, the board of governors of the 7 consolidated institution, in consultation with the president, shall 8 determine which, if any, positions existing at the affected 9 institutions on the effective date of this article are to be 10 abolished.
- 11 (1) In the case of positions which the board chooses to
 12 retain, but which exist at both affected institutions, when there
 13 is an overlap of duties and responsibilities of employees who
 14 occupy those positions, the board of governors, in consultation
 15 with the president, shall determine which position or positions
 16 shall be abolished.
- 17 (2) A classified employee who holds a position scheduled to be 18 abolished is afforded all rights and benefits provided by this 19 article and by section three, article seven of this chapter.
- 20 (b) Official notification to employees. -
- 21 (1) The president shall provide official notice of employment 22 status to each classified employee, faculty member and 23 nonclassified employee of the affected institutions not later than 24 thirty days after the board's decision. For an employee whose

- 1 position is to be abolished, the official notice shall specify his
- 2 or her date of termination. The termination date shall be within
- 3 three to six months following the date of official notification.
- 4 (2) Any person who was employed full time by an affected
- 5 institution on the effective date of this article and whose
- 6 employment continues in any capacity with the board of governors of
- 7 the consolidated institution is considered to have no break in
- 8 service for calculation of years of service, seniority,
- 9 participation in health and retirement plans or continued
- 10 employment by the state.
- 11 (3) The board of governors, created pursuant to this article,
- 12 is an organization as defined in section two, article nine-a of
- 13 this chapter and is subject to all the terms and conditions that
- 14 apply to higher education organizations as provided in this chapter
- 15 and chapter eighteen-c of this code. Specifically, the board is
- 16 subject to section three, article seven, of this chapter when
- 17 making reductions in force of classified employees.
