11	A BILL to repeal §3-2-24 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
12	amended; and to amend and reenact $\$3-2-5$ , $\$3-2-6$ , $\$3-2-7$ and
13	§3-2-11 of said code, all relating to electronic registration
14	of voters; repealing outdated code regarding manual voter
15	registration systems; authorizing Secretary of State to
16	promulgate procedures to permit persons to register to vote
17	through a secure electronic voter registration system;
18	providing an exception to address requirements on registration
19	for participants in the address confidentiality program;
20	permitting transmission of electronically stored signatures
21	for registration in certain instances; allowing acceptance of

registration with or without an email address; requiring

electronic registration be received by close of business on

the day of the registration deadline; permitting people to

- 1 register to vote through approved electronic voter
- 2 registration systems at certain locations; authorizing the
- 3 Division of Motor Vehicles to release certain information to
- 4 the Secretary of State upon notice and consent of the
- 5 registered voter; and making certain clarifications of current
- 6 code.
- 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 8 That §3-2-24 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
- 9 be repealed; and that \$3-2-5, \$3-2-6, \$3-2-7 and \$3-2-11 of said
- 10 code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 11 ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.
- 12 §3-2-5. Forms for application for registration; information
- required and requested; types of application forms;
- notices.
- (a) (1) All state forms for application for voter registration shall be prescribed by the Secretary of State and shall conform with the requirements of 42 U. S. C. §1973gg, et seq., the National Noter Registration Act of 1993 and the requirements of the provisions of this article. Separate application forms may be prescribed for voter registration conducted by the clerk of the county commission, registration by mail, registration in conjunction with an application for motor vehicle driver's license and registration at designated agencies. These forms may consist

24 of one or more parts, may be combined with other forms for use in

- 1 registration by designated agencies or in conjunction with driver
- 2 licensing and may be revised and reissued as required by the
- 3 Secretary of State to provide for the efficient administration of
- 4 voter registration.
- 5 (2) Notwithstanding any provisions of subdivision (1) of this
- 6 subsection to the contrary, the federal postcard application for
- 7 voter registration issued pursuant to 42 U. S. C. §1973, et seq.,
- 8 the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act of 1986 and
- 9 the mail voter registration application form prescribed by the
- 10 Federal Election Commission pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §1973gg, et
- 11 seq., the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, shall be are
- 12 accepted as a valid form valid forms of application for
- 13 registration pursuant to the provisions of this article.
- 14 (3) The Secretary of State is authorized to promulgate
- 15 procedures to permit persons to register to vote through a secure
- 16 electronic voter registration system.
- 17 (b) Each application form for registration shall include:
- 18 (1) A statement specifying the eligibility requirements for
- 19 registration and an attestation that the applicant meets each
- 20 eligibility requirement;
- 21 (2) Any specific notice or notices required for a specific
- 22 type or use of application by 42 U. S. C. §1973gg, et seq., the
- 23 National Voter Registration Act of 1993;
- 24 (3) A notice that a voter may be permitted to vote the

- 1 partisan primary election ballot of a political party only if the
- 2 voter has designated that political party on the application for
- 3 registration unless the political party has determined otherwise;
- 4 (4) The applicant's driver's license number or an
- 5 identification number issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles. If
- 6 the applicant does not have a driver's license or an identification
- 7 card issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles, then the last four
- 8 digits of the applicant's Social Security number; and
- 9 (5) Any other instructions or information essential to 10 complete the application process.
- 11 (c) Each application form shall require that the following be
- 12 provided by the applicant, under oath, and any an application which
- 13 does not contain each of the following shall be considered is
- 14 incomplete:
- 15 (1) The applicant's legal name, including the first name,
- 16 middle or maiden premarital name, if any, and last name;
- 17 (2) The month, day and year of the applicant's birth;
- 18 (3) The applicant's residence address including the number and
- 19 street or route and city and county of residence except:
- 20 (A) In the case of a person eligible to register under the
- 21 provisions of 42 U. S. C. §1973ff, et seq., the Uniformed and
- 22 Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, the address at which he or
- 23 she last resided before leaving the United States or entering the
- 24 uniformed services, or if a dependent child of such a person, the

- 1 address at which his or her parent last resided; and
- 2 (B) In the case of a homeless person having no fixed residence
- 3 address who nevertheless resides and remains regularly within the
- 4 county, the address of a shelter, assistance center or family
- 5 member with whom he or she has regular contact or other specific
- 6 location approved by the clerk of the county commission for the
- 7 purposes of establishing a voting residence; and or
- 8 (C) In the case of a participant in the Address
- 9 Confidentiality Program administered by the Secretary of State in
- 10 accordance with section one hundred three, article twenty-eight
- 11 (a), chapter forty-eight of this code, the designated address
- 12 assigned to the participant by the Secretary of State; and
- 13 (4) The applicant's signature, under penalty of perjury as
- 14 provided in section thirty-six of this article, to the attestation
- 15 of eligibility to register to vote and to the truth of the
- 16 information given. The clerk may accept the electronically
- 17 transmitted signature kept on file with another approved state
- 18 database for an applicant who applies to register to vote using an
- 19 approved electronic voter registration system in accordance with
- 20 procedures promulgated by the Secretary of State.
- 21 (d) The applicant shall be requested to provide the following
- 22 information but no application shall may be rejected for lack of
- 23 this information:
- 24 (1) An indication whether the application is for a new

- 1 registration, change of address, change of name or change of party 2 affiliation;
- 3 (2) The applicant's choice of political party affiliation, if 4 any, or an indication of no affiliation. *Provided*, That any An 5 applicant who does not enter any a choice of political party 6 affiliation shall be is listed as having no party affiliation on 7 the voting record;
- 8 (3) The applicant's residence mailing address if different 9 than the residence street address;
- 10 (4) The last four digits of the applicant's Social Security
  11 number;
- 12 (5) The applicant's telephone number;
- 13 (6) The applicant's e-mail address;
- 14 (6) (7) The address at which where the applicant was last 15 registered to vote, if any, for the purpose of canceling or 16 transferring the previous registration; and
- 17  $\frac{(7)}{(8)}$  (8) The applicant's gender.
- 18 (e) The Secretary of State shall prescribe the printing 19 specifications of each type of voter registration application and 20 the voter registration application portion of any form which is 21 part of a combined agency form.
- (f) Application forms prescribed in this section may refer to 23 various public officials by title or official position but in no 24 case may the actual name of any an officeholder be printed on the

- 1 voter registration application or on any portion of a combined
  2 application form.
- 3 (g) No later than July 1 of each odd-numbered year, the
  4 Secretary of State shall submit the specifications of the voter
  5 registration application by mail for statewide bidding for a
  6 contract period beginning September 1 of each odd-numbered year and
  7 continuing for two calendar years. The successful bidder shall
  8 produce and supply the required mail voter registration forms at
  9 the contract price to all purchasers of the form for the period of
  10 the contract.

## 11 §3-2-6. Time of registration application before an election.

- 12 (a) Voter registration before an election shall close closes
  13 on the twenty-first day before the election or on the first day
  14 thereafter which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.
- 15 (b) An application for voter registration, transfer of 16 registration, change of name or change of political party 17 affiliation submitted by an eligible voter by the close of voter 18 registration shall be is effective for any subsequent primary, 19 general or special election if the following conditions are met:
- 20 (1) The application contains the information required by 21 subsection (c), section five of this article. *Provided*, That 22 Incomplete applications for registration containing information 23 which are submitted within the required time may be corrected 24 within four business days after the close of registration if the

- 1 applicant provides the required information; and
- 2 (2) The application is received by the appropriate clerk of
- 3 the county commission no later than the hour of the close of
- 4 registration or is otherwise submitted by the following deadlines:
- 5 (A) If mailed, the application shall be addressed to the
- 6 appropriate clerk of the county commission and is postmarked by the
- 7 postal service no later than the date of the close of registration.
- 8 Provided, That If the postmark is missing or illegible, the
- 9 application shall be is presumed to have been mailed no later than
- 10 the close of registration if it is received by the appropriate
- 11 clerk of the county commission no later than the third day
- 12 following the close of registration;
- 13 (B) If accepted by a designated agency or motor vehicle
- 14 licensing office, the application is received by that agency or
- 15 office no later than the close of registration;
- 16 (C) If accepted through a registration outreach program, the
- 17 application is received by the clerk, deputy clerk or registrar no
- 18 later than the close of registration; and
- 19 (D) If accepted through an approved electronic voter
- 20 registration system, the application is received by the clerk of
- 21 the county commission or other entity designated by the Secretary
- 22 of State no later than the close of business on the final day of
- 23 registration; and
- 24 (3) The verification notice by the provisions of section

- 1 sixteen of this article mailed to the voter at the residence
- 2 indicated on the application is not returned as undeliverable.
- 3 §3-2-7. Hours and days of registration in the office of the clerk
- 4 of the county commission; in-person application for
- 5 voter registration; identification required.
- 6 (a) The clerk of the county commission shall provide voter 7 registration services at all times when the office of the clerk is 8 open for regular business.
- 9 (b) Any An eligible voter who desires to apply for voter 10 registration in person at the office of the clerk of the county 11 commission shall complete a voter registration application on the 12 prescribed form and shall sign the oath required on that 13 application in the presence of the clerk of the county commission 14 or his or her deputy: Provided, That an individual may apply for 15 voter registration using an approved electronic voter registration 16 system if available at the office of the clerk. Such system may 17 electronically transfer the voter's signature stored in the 18 database of another state agency in accordance with procedures 19 promulgated by the Secretary of State. The applicant shall present 19 valid identification and proof of age. except that The clerk may 19 waive the proof of age requirement if the applicant is clearly over 19 the age of eighteen.
- 23 (c) The clerk shall attempt to establish whether the residence 24 address given is within the boundaries of an incorporated

- 1 municipality and, if so, make the proper entry required for
- 2 municipal residents to be properly identified for municipal voter
- 3 registration purposes.
- 4 (d) Upon receipt of the completed registration application,
- 5 the clerk shall either:
- 6 (1) Provide a notice of procedure for verification and notice
- 7 of disposition of the application and immediately begin the
- 8 verification process prescribed by the provisions of section
- 9 sixteen of this article; or
- 10 (2) Upon presentation of a current driver's license or
- 11 state-issued identification card containing the residence address
- 12 as it appears on the voter registration application, issue the
- 13 receipt of registration.

## 14 §3-2-11. Registration in conjunction with driver licensing.

- 15 (a) The Division of Motor Vehicles or <del>any</del> other division or
- 16 department that may be established by law to perform motor vehicle
- 17 driver licensing services shall provide each qualified registrant,
- 18 as an integral and simultaneous part of every process of
- 19 application for the issuance, renewal or change of address of any
- 20 a motor vehicle driver's license or official identification card
- 21 pursuant to the provisions of article two, chapter seventeen-b of
- 22 this code, a voter registration application as prescribed in
- 23 section five of this article when the division's regional offices
- 24 are open for regular business. An individual may apply for voter

- 1 registration using an approved electronic voter registration system
- 2 if available at a Division of Motor Vehicles regional office.
- 3 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
- 4 contrary, the Division of Motor Vehicles is required to release the
- 5 first name, middle name, last name, premarital name, if applicable,
- 6 complete residence address, complete date of birth of an applicant
- 7 and the applicant's electronic signature, entered in the division's
- 8 records for driver license or nonoperator identification purposes
- 9 upon notice and written consent of the applicant. The notice and
- 10 consent is a required component of an electronic voter registration
- 11 application made available to the general public by the Secretary
- 12 of State. The release of an applicant's signature by the Division
- 13 of Motor Vehicles to the Office of the Secretary of State applies
- 14 to any voter registration application approved through an
- 15 electronic voter registration system approved by the Secretary of
- 16 State regardless of the location of the online user and provided
- 17 the user grants written consent.
- (b) Any (c) A person who fails to sign the voter registration
  19 application or who fails to return the voter registration
  20 application to a driver licensing facility or to an appropriate
  21 voter registration office shall be is considered to have declined
  22 to register. Information regarding any a person's failure to sign
  23 the voter registration application is confidential and may not be
- 24 used for any purpose other than to determine voter registration.

- (c) Any (d) A qualified voter who submits the application for registration pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a) of this section in person at a driver licensing facility at the time of applying for, obtaining, renewing or transferring his or her driver's license or official identification card and who presents identification and proof of age at that time shall not be is not required to make his or her first vote in person or to again present identification in order to make that registration valid.
- 9 (d) Any (e) A qualified voter who submits by mail or by
  10 delivery by a third party an application for registration on the
  11 form used in conjunction with driver licensing shall be is required
  12 to make his or her first vote in person and present identification
  13 as required for other mail registration in accordance with the
  14 provisions of subsection (g), section ten of this article.
  15 Provided, That If the applicant has been previously registered in
  16 the jurisdiction and the application is for a change of address,
  17 change of name, change of political party affiliation or other
  18 correction, the presentation of identification and first vote in
  19 person is not required.
- (e) Any (f) An application for voter registration submitted pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be considered as updating any updates a previous voter registration by the applicant and shall authorize authorizes the cancellation of registration in any other county or state in which the applicant was previously registered.
- 25 (f) Any (g) A change of address from one residence to another 26 within the same county which is submitted for driver licensing or

- 1 nonoperator's identification purposes in accordance with applicable
- 2 law shall also serve serves as a notice of change of address for
- 3 voter registration purposes unless the individual indicates on the
- 4 form that the change of address is not for voter registration
- 5 purposes. if requested by the applicant after notice and written
- 6 consent of the applicant.
- 7 <del>(g)</del> (h) Completed applications for voter registration or
- 8 change of address for voting purposes received by any an office
- 9 providing driver licensing services shall be forwarded to the
- 10 Secretary of State within five days of receipt unless other means
- 11 are available for a more expedited transmission. The Secretary of
- 12 State shall remove and file any forms which have not been signed by
- 13 the applicant and shall forward completed, signed applications to
- 14 the clerk of the appropriate county commission within five days of
- 15 receipt.
- 16 (h) (i) Voter registration application forms containing voter
- 17 information which are returned to a driver licensing office
- 18 unsigned shall be collected and maintained for two years according
- 19 to procedural rules promulgated by the Division of Motor Vehicles,
- 20 submitted to the Secretary of State and maintained by the Secretary
- 21 of State's office according to the retention policy adopted by the
- 22 Secretary of State.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide an electronic

voter registration system allowing for greater utilization of the Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS), to allow for use of a designated address for voter registration purposes for participants in the Address Confidentiality Program, to establish an offense and related penalty for tampering with or copying voter registration information collected by third-party registration drives, to delete obsolete language related to manual voter registration systems, to shorten the period of time during which county clerks may enter voter history data into the statewide voter registration system, to clarify certain record-keeping requirements related to confirmation mailings required by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 and to restrict the public release of voter e-mail addresses.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.)
