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12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-2-30$ of the Code of West Virginia,
13	1931, as amended; and to amend said code by adding thereto a
14	new section, designated §59-1-2b, all relating to the
15	preparation and sale of voter registration lists; exempting
16	certain voter data from being provided; clarifying that
17	records are to be kept in electronic form; permitting certain
18	voter lists be obtained for noncommercial purposes from the
19	clerk of the county commission or the Secretary of State;
20	providing certain exemptions allowing the Secretary of State
21	to provide voter information to others; setting forth the fees
22	to be charged for the sale of voter registration lists;
23	setting forth the types of lists and services that are
24	available; requiring the net proceeds from the voter
25	registration list sales be deposited in the State Election
26	Fund; and clarifying that the Secretary of State may share
27	voter information with those authorized to receive the
28	information.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §3-2-30 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, 3 be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding 4 thereto a new section, designated §59-1-2b, all to read as follows:

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CHAPTER 3. ELECTIONS.

6 ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

7 \$3-2-30. Public inspection of voter registration records in the
 office of the clerk of the county commission; providing
 voter lists for noncommercial use; prohibition against
 resale of voter lists for commercial use or profit.

11 (a) Any person may examine the active, inactive, rejected and 12 canceled voter registration records during office hours of the 13 clerk of the county commission in accordance with the provisions of 14 chapter twenty-nine-b of this code. as follows:

(1) When the active and inactive files are maintained on precinct registration books, any person may examine the files under the supervision of the clerk and obtain copies of records except when a precinct book is in temporary use for updating and preparing lists or during the time the books are sealed for use in an election. Other original voter registration records, including canceled voter records, pending applications, rejected applications, records of change requests, reinstatements and other documents, shall be available for inspection upon specific request; and

25 (2) When the Active, inactive, rejected and canceled voter 26 files are <u>to be</u> maintained in <u>electronic</u> data format. Any person 27 may examine voter record information in printed form or in a 28 read-only data format on a computer terminal set aside for public

1 use, if available. The data files available for examination and 2 copying shall include all registration and voting information 3 maintained in the file, but may not include the registrant's 4 telephone number, <u>email address</u>, Social Security number or driver's 5 license number or nonoperator's identification number issued by the 6 Division of Motor Vehicles.

7 (b) Printed lists of registered voters may be purchased for 8 noncommercial use from the clerk of the county commission at a cost 9 of 1¢ per name.

(c) In counties maintaining active and inactive files in digitized data format, (b) The clerk of the county commission shall, upon request, prepare provide printed copies of the lists of voters for each precinct. No list prepared under this section may include the registrant's telephone number, <u>email address</u>, Social Security number or driver's license number or nonoperator's identification number issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles. The clerk shall establish a written policy, posted within public view, listing the options for selection and sorting criteria and available data elements. The data elements shall include, at 20 least:

(1) The name, residence address, political party affiliation22 and status of the registrant;

23 (2) The available formats of the lists; and

(3) The times at which lists will be prepared. A copy of the
25 county policy shall be filed with the Secretary of State no later
26 than January 1 of each even-numbered year.

27 (d) In counties which maintain voter files in a digitized data
 28 format, (c) Lists of registered voters may be obtained for

1 noncommercial purposes in data format on disk <u>or as a printed list</u> 2 provided and prepared by the clerk of the county commission at a 3 cost of 1¢ per name. plus \$10 for each disk required. No data file 4 prepared under this <u>subsection</u> may include the registrant's 5 telephone number, <u>email address</u>, Social Security number or driver's 6 license number or nonoperator's identification number issued by the 7 Division of Motor Vehicles.

8 (e) (d) The fees received by the clerk of the county 9 commission shall be kept in a separate fund under the supervision 10 of the clerk. for the purpose of defraying the cost of the 11 preparation of the voter lists. Any unexpended balance revenue in 12 the fund shall be transferred to the General Fund of the county 13 commission. deposited in the State Election Fund as set forth in 14 subsection b, section forty-eight, article one of this chapter.

15 (f) (e) The Secretary of State may shall make voter lists 16 available for sale subject to the limitations as provided in 17 subsection (a) of this section. for counties. The cost for a 18 partial list shall be one and one-half cents per name plus \$10 for 19 each disk required; the cost for a complete statewide list shall be 20 one-half cent per name and a flat fee of \$1,000. One cent per name 21 for each voter from a particular county on each partial list and 22 one-half cent per name for each voter from a particular county on 23 each statewide list sold shall be reimbursed to the appropriate 24 county. The fees for the voter lists shall be as prescribed in 25 section two-b, article one, chapter fifty-nine of this code. The 26 disk fee and one-half cent per name revenue associated with 27 purchase of a partial list and the flat fee of \$1,000 or associated 28 with a complete statewide list shall be deposited to a special

1 revenue account for purpose of defraying the cost of preparing the
2 lists in the State Election Fund as set forth in subsection (b),
3 section forty-eight, article one of this chapter.

(g) An update to a previously purchased list may be provided
by the Secretary of State or the clerk of the county commission at
a prorated cost based on the amount of additional information
provided. The additional rates charged by the clerk of the county
commission shall be specified in the policy established pursuant to
subsection (c) of this section.

10 (h) (f) No voter registration lists or data files containing 11 voter names, addresses or other information derived from voter data 12 files obtained pursuant to the provisions of this article may be 13 used for commercial or charitable solicitations or advertising, 14 sold or reproduced for resale.

15 <u>(g) This section may not be interpreted to prevent the</u> 16 <u>Secretary of State from sharing data files containing voter</u> 17 <u>information with authorized service providers or sharing data</u> 18 <u>across state lines with any state or local election official for</u> 19 <u>the purpose of voter registration and election administration in</u> 20 <u>accordance with this chapter or applicable federal law.</u>

23 ARTICLE 1. FEES AND ALLOWANCES.

24 §59-1-2b. Purchase of voter registration lists and election data; 25 fees.

26 (a) Except as may be otherwise provided in this code, the 27 Secretary of State shall charge the following fees for data 28 originating in the statewide voter registration system to be paid

1 by the person for whom the service is rendered at the time it is 2 performed:

12	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "Election Cycle	
13 Subscription Service" includes:			

(1) Statewide Registered Voter List updated monthly throughout
15 the year and updated daily starting thirty days prior to election
16 day through election day;

17 (2) Master Voter History List Export following certification18 of the primary, general and odd-year elections;

(3) Statewide All Mail-in Absentee Request List and Statewide 20 Public Received Mail-in Absentee List for the primary, general and 21 odd-year elections, updated daily starting thirty days prior to 22 election day through ten days following election day; and

(4) Statewide Early Voters List for the primary, general and 24 odd-year elections, updated daily starting on the first day of 25 early voting through election day.

(c) At the time that a request is made under subdivisions (7), (8) or (9) of subsection (a) of this section, the current hourly 28 rate, as determined by the Secretary of State, shall be

1 communicated to the prospective purchaser along with an estimate of 2 the number of hours needed to fulfill the request before any list 3 is compiled.

4 (d) Net proceeds from the sale of data originating in the 5 statewide voter registration system, along with any interest on 6 such funds, shall be deposited into the State Election Fund as set 7 forth in subsection (b), section forty-eight, article one, chapter 8 three of this code.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

\$59-1-2b is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.)

⁽NOTE: The purpose of this bill concerns the preparation and sale of voter registration lists. The bill exempts certain voter data from being provided. The bill permits voter lists be obtained for noncommercial purposes. The bill sets forth the fees to be charged for the sale of voter registration lists. The bill sets forth the types of lists and services that are available. The bill requires the net proceeds from the sales of voter registration lists be deposited in the State Election Fund. The bill clarifies that the Secretary of State may share voter information with those authorized to receive the information.
