18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That §47-11B-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
20	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
21	ARTICLE 11B. CLOSING-OUT SALES, FIRE SALES AND DEFUNCT BUSINESS

23	§47-11B-9. Bond required.
24	$rac{No}{\Delta}$ license $rac{shall}{\Delta}$ may not be issued unless the applicant
25	files with the commissioner a bond with corporate surety payable to

1 the State of West Virginia conditioned upon the faithful observance 2 of all the provisions of this article, the payment to any 3 municipality or the state of all taxes due and owing or which may 4 become due and the indemnifying of any purchaser at such the sale 5 who suffers any loss by reason of misrepresentation made in 6 connection with such the sale: Provided, That the aggregate 7 liability of the surety for all breaches of the conditions of the 8 bond shall in no event may not exceed the amount of said the bond. 9 The amount of said the bond shall be determined based on the 10 inventory required to be filed with the commissioner pursuant 11 section four of this article, and calculated as follows: Five 12 percent of the first \$100,000 of the retail value of all the goods, 13 wares and merchandise to be offered at such the sale, two percent 14 of the next \$400,000 and one percent of the balance. Said The bond 15 shall be approved as to form and sufficiency by the prosecuting 16 attorney or his assistant of the county in which such sale is to be 17 <del>conducted</del> commissioner.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to modify the bonding requirement for closing-out sales by clarifying the calculation of the face amount and changing the approval authority to the commissioner of labor.
