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11	A BILL to repeal $\$30-27-15$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
12	amended; to amend and reenact §30-27-3, §30-27-5, §30-27-8,
13	30-27-11 and $30-27-12$ of said code; and to amend and reenact
14	§30-37-7 of said code, all relating to the Board of Barbers
15	and Cosmetologists; licensing schools of aesthetics,
16	barbering, cosmetology, manicuring and massage; transferring
17	authority to approve licensure for certain schools; clarifying
18	powers and duties of the board; providing requirements for
19	professional licensing, license renewal and work permits;
20	establishing certain student registration requirements; and
21	providing definitions.
22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
23	That §30-27-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
24	be repealed; that §30-27-3, §30-27-5, §30-27-8, §30-27-11 and

1 \$30-27-12 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that \$30-37-72 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

## 3 ARTICLE 27. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS.

4 §30-27-3. Definitions.

5 As used in this article, the following words and terms have 6 the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates 7 otherwise:

8 (a) "Aesthetics" or "esthetics" means any one or any 9 combination of the following acts when done on the human body for 10 compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

(1) Administering cosmetic treatments to enhance or improve 12 the appearance of the skin, including cleansing, toning, performing 13 effleurage or other related movements, stimulating, exfoliating or 14 performing any other similar procedure on the skin of the human 15 body or scalp;

16 (2) Applying, by hand or with a mechanical or electrical 17 apparatus, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders, clays, 18 antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations 19 necessary for the practice of aesthetics to another person's face, 20 neck, back, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and including 21 the knee;

(3) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
23 grooming of another person's face, neck, back, shoulders, hands,
24 elbows and feet up to and including the knee;

(4) The waxing, tweezing and threading of hair on another
 2 person's body;

3 (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body wrap;
4 (6) Applying artificial eyelashes and eyebrows; and
5 (7) The lightening of hair on the body except the scalp.

6 (b) "Aesthetician" or "esthetician" means a person licensed 7 under the provisions of this article who engages in the practice of 8 aesthetics.

9 (c) "Applicant" means a person making application for a 10 professional license, license, certificate, registration, permit or 11 renewal under the provisions of this article.

12 (d) "Barber" means a person licensed under the provisions of 13 this article who engages in the practice of barbering.

14 (e) "Barbering" means any one or any combination of the 15 following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not 16 for the treatment of disease:

17 (1) Shaving, shaping and trimming the beard, or both;

(2) Cutting, singeing, shampooing, arranging, dressing,
19 tinting, bleaching, or applying lotions or tonics on human hair, or
20 a wig or hairpiece; and

(3) Applications, treatments or rubs of the scalp, face, or 22 neck with oils, creams, lotions, cosmetics, antiseptics, powders, 23 or other preparations in connection with the shaving, cutting or 24 trimming of the hair or beard.

1 (f) "Barber crossover" or "cosmetologist crossover" is a 2 person who is licensed to perform barbering and cosmetology.

3 (g) "Barber permanent waving" means the following acts done on 4 the human body for compensation and not for the treatment of 5 disease:

6 (1) The bleaching or tinting of hair; and

7 (2) The permanent waving of hair.

8 (h) "Barber permanent wavist" means a person licensed to 9 perform barbering and barber permanent waving.

10 (i) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Barbers and 11 Cosmetologists.

12 (j) "Certificate" means an instructor certificate to teach in 13 a school under the provisions of this article.

14 (k) "Certificate holder" means a person certified as an 15 instructor to teach in a school under the provisions of this 16 article.

17 (1) "Cosmetologist" means a person licensed under the 18 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of 19 cosmetology.

20 (m) "Cosmetology" means any one or any combination of the 21 following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not 22 for the treatment of disease:

(1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding, weaving,24 dressing, adding extensions, curling, waving, permanent waving,

1 relaxing, straightening, shampooing, cleansing, singeing, 2 bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing, tweezing, or similarly work 3 on human hair, or a wig or hairpiece, by any means, including 4 hands, mechanical or electrical devices or appliances;

5 (2) Nail care;

(3) Applying by hand or with a mechanical or electrical device
7 or appliance, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders, clays,
8 antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations
9 necessary for the practice of aesthetics to another person's face,
10 neck, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and including the
11 knee;

12 (4) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or 13 grooming of another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands, elbows 14 and feet up to and including the knee;

(5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body wrap; and(6) Performing aesthetics.

17 (n) "General supervision" means:

18 (1) For schools, a master or certified instructor is on the19 premises and is quickly and easily available; or

20 (2) For salons, a professional licensee is on the premises and 21 is quickly and easily available.

(o) "Hair braiding" means any one or any combination of the following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease: Braiding, plaiting, twisting,

wrapping, threading, weaving, extending or locking of natural human
 hair by hand or mechanical device.

3 (p) "Hair Styling" means any one or any combination of the 4 following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not 5 for the treatment of disease:

(1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding, weaving,
7 dressing, adding extensions, curling, waving, permanent waving,
8 relaxing, straightening, shampooing, cleansing, singeing,
9 bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing, tweezing, threading or
10 similarly work on human hair, or a wig or hairpiece, by any means,
11 including hands, mechanical or electrical devices or appliances;

12 (2) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or 13 grooming of another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands, elbows 14 and feet up to and including the knee.

15 (q) "Hair Stylist" means a person licensed under the 16 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of hair 17 styling.

18 (r) "License" means a professional license, a salon license or 19 a school license.

20 (s) "Licensed school" means a facility which has been approved
21 by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College
22 Education pursuant to section nine, article two-b, chapter
23 eighteen-b of this code, to educate persons to be licensed or
24 issued certain permits under the provisions of this article.

1 (s) (t) "Licensee" means a person, corporation or firm holding
2 a license issued under the provisions of this article.

3 (t) (u) "Nail care" means any one or any combination of the 4 following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not 5 for the treatment of disease:

6 (1) The cleansing, dressing, or polishing of nails of a 7 person;

8 (2) Performing artificial nail service; and

9 (3) The cosmetic treatment of the feet up to the knee and the 10 hands up to the elbow.

11 (u) (v) "Nail technician" or "manicurist" means a person 12 licensed under the provisions of this article who engages in the 13 practice of nail care.

14 (v) (w) "Permit" means a work permit.

15 (w) (x) "Permitee" means a person holding a work permit.

16 (x) (y) "Professional license" means a license to practice as 17 a aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent wavist, 18 cosmetologist, cosmetologist crossover or nail technician.

19 (y) (z) "Registration" means a registration issued by the 20 board to a person who rents or leases a booth or chair from a 21 licensed salon owner and operator, or both, or a registration 22 issued by the board to a person who is a student in a school.

23 (z) (aa) "Registrant" means a person who holds a registration 24 under the provisions of this article.

1 (aa) (bb) "Salon" means a shop or other facility where a
2 person practices under a professional license.

3 (bb) (cc) "Salon license" means a license to own and operate 4 a salon.

5 (cc) "School" means a facility to educate persons to be 6 licensed under the provisions of this article.

7 (dd) "School license" means a license to own and operate a
8 school.

9 (ee) (dd) "Student registration" means a registration issued 10 by the board to a student to study at a school licensed under the 11 provisions of this article.

12 §30-27-5. Powers and duties of the board.

(a) The board has all the powers and duties set forth in this14 article, by rule, in article one of this chapter and elsewhere in15 law.

16 (b) The board shall:

17 (1) Hold meetings, conduct hearings and administer 18 examinations;

19 (2) Establish requirements for licenses, permits, certificates20 and registrations;

(3) Establish procedures for submitting, approving and 22 rejecting applications for licenses, permits, certificates and 23 registrations;

24 (4) Determine the qualifications of any applicant for

1 licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;

2 (5) Prepare, conduct, administer and grade examinations for3 professional licenses and certificates;

4 (6) Determine the passing grade for the examinations;

5 (7) Maintain records of the examinations the board or a third 6 party administers, including the number of persons taking the 7 examinations and the pass and fail rate;

8 (8) Set operational standards and requirements for licensed
9 schools;

10 (8) (9) Hire, discharge, establish the job requirements and 11 fix the compensation of the executive director;

12 (9) (10) Maintain an office, and hire, discharge, establish 13 the job requirements and fix the compensation of employees, 14 investigators/inspectors and contracted employees necessary to 15 enforce the provisions of this article: *Provided*, That any 16 investigator/inspector employed by the board on July 1, 2009, shall 17 retain their coverage under the classified service, including job 18 classification, job tenure and salary, until that person retires or 19 is dismissed: *Provided*, *however*, That nothing may prohibit the 20 disciplining or dismissal of any investigator/inspector for cause; 21 (10) (11) Investigate alleged violations of the provisions of 22 this article, legislative rules, orders and final decisions of the 23 board;

24 (11) (12) Establish the criteria for the training of

1 investigators/inspectors;

2 (12) (13) Set the requirements for investigations and 3 inspections;

4 (13) (14) Conduct disciplinary hearings of persons regulated
5 by the board;

(14) (15) Determine disciplinary action and issue orders;
(15) (16) Institute appropriate legal action for the
8 enforcement of the provisions of this article;

9 (17) Report violations of the provisions of this article, and 10 legislative rules promulgated pursuant to this article, alleged to 11 have been committed by a licensed school to the West Virginia 12 Council for Community and Technical College Education: *Provided*, 13 That the board may continue to investigate any alleged violation 14 committed by a licensed school that was received prior to July 1, 15 2013, until the board determines whether probable cause exists that 16 the licensed school did commit the violation: *Provided*, *however*, 17 That if the board finds that probable cause exists that the 18 licensed school did commit the violation alleged, the board shall 19 immediately advise and provide its investigation file to the West 20 Virginia Council for Community and Technical College;

21 (16) (18) Maintain an accurate registry of names and addresses
22 of all persons regulated by the board;

23 (17) (19) Keep accurate and complete records of its 24 proceedings, and certify the same as may be necessary and

1 appropriate;

2 (18) (20) Establish the continuing education requirements for 3 professional licensees and certificate holders;

4 (19) (21) Issue, renew, combine, deny, suspend, revoke or 5 reinstate licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;

6 (20) (22) Establish a fee schedule;

7 (21) (23) Propose rules in accordance with the provisions of 8 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the 9 provisions of this article; and

10 (22) (24) Take all other actions necessary and proper to 11 effectuate the purposes of this article.

12 (c) The board may:

13 (1) Establish joint licenses;

14 (2) Contract with third parties to administer the examinations15 required under the provisions of this article;

16 (3) Sue and be sued in its official name as an agency of this 17 state;

18 (4) Confer with the Attorney General or his or her assistant19 in connection with legal matters and questions.

20 §30-27-8. Professional license requirements.

(a) An applicant for a professional license to practice as a
aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent wavist,
cosmetologist, hair stylist, cosmetologist crossover or nail
technician shall present satisfactory evidence that he or she:

1 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;

2 (2) Is of good moral character;

3 (3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the 4 "ability to benefit test" approved by the United States Department 5 of Education;

6 (4) Has graduated from a <u>licensed</u> school which has been 7 approved by the <u>board</u> <u>West Virginia Council for Community and</u> 8 Technical College Education;

9 (5) Has passed an examination that tests the applicant's 10 knowledge of subjects specified by the board: *Provided*, That the 11 board may recognize a certificate or similar license in lieu of the 12 examination or part of the examination that the board requires;

13 (6) Has paid the applicable fee;

14 (7) Presents a certificate of health from a licensed 15 physician;

16 (8) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for 17 employment in the United States; and

18 (9) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the 19 board.

(b) A license to practice issued by the board prior to July 1, 21 2009, shall for all purposes be considered a professional license 22 issued under this article: *Provided*, That a person holding a 23 license issued prior to July 1, 2009, must renew the license 24 pursuant to the provisions of this article.

## 1 §30-27-11. Work permit.

2 (a) The board may issue a work permit to practice to an 3 applicant who meets the following conditions:

4 (1) Has graduated from a <u>licensed</u> school approved by the <del>board</del> 5 <del>or has completed the course requirements in a specific field;</del> <u>West</u> 6 Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education;

7 (2) Is waiting to take the examination;

8 (3) Has employment in the field in which he or she applied to 9 take the examination and is working under the general supervision 10 of a professional licensee;

11 (4) Has paid the work permit fee;

12 (5) Has presented a certificate of health issued by a licensed13 physician;

14 (6) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for 15 employment in the United States; and

16 (7) Meets all the other requirements specified by the board. 17 (b) A work permit expires at the end of the month after 18 issuance following the next examination in the specific field. A 19 work permit may be renewed once.

20 (c) While in effect, a work permitee is subject to the 21 restrictions and requirements imposed by this article.

22 §30-27-12. Student registration.

(a) Prior to commencing studies in a <u>licensed</u> school, <del>licensed</del>
 24 under the provisions of this article</del> a student shall acquire a

1 student registration issued by the board.

2 (b) An applicant for a student registration shall present 3 satisfactory evidence that he or she <u>meets the following</u> 4 conditions:

5 (1) Is <u>enrolled as</u> a student in <del>an approved</del> <u>a licensed</u> school;
6 <del>or enrolled in an approved course;</del>

7 (2) Is of good moral character;

8 (3) Has paid the required fee;

9 (4) Has presented a certificate of health issued by a licensed 10 physician; and

11 (5) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for 12 employment in the United States.

13 (c) The student registration is good during the prescribed 14 period of study for the student.

15 (d) The student may perform acts constituting barbering, 16 barber permanent waving, cosmetology, aesthetics or nail care in a 17 school under the general supervision of a master or certified 18 instructor.

19 ARTICLE 37. MASSAGE THERAPISTS.

20 §30-37-7. Requirements for licensure; renewal of licenses;
21 reinstatement; penalties.

(a) The board shall propose rules for legislative approval in
accordance with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code,
establishing a procedure for licensing of massage therapists.

1 License requirements shall include the following:

2 (1) Completion of a program of massage education at a school 3 approved by the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission 4 <u>Council for Community and Technical College Education pursuant to</u> 5 <u>section nine, article two-b, chapter eighteen-b of this code</u> or by 6 a state agency in another state, the District of Columbia or a 7 United States territory which approves educational programs and 8 which meets qualifications for the National Certification Exam 9 administered through the National Certification Board for 10 Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork. This school shall require a 11 diploma from an accredited high school, or the equivalent, and 12 require completion of at least five hundred hours of supervised 13 academic instruction;

14 (2) Successful completion of the National Certification for
15 Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork (NCTMB) examination, or other
16 board approved examination; and

(3) Payment of a reasonable fee every two years required by 18 the board which shall compensate and be retained by the board for 19 the costs of administration.

(b) A license to practice massage therapy issued by the board prior to July 1, 2006, shall for all purposes be considered a license issued under this section: *Provided*, That a person holding a license to practice massage therapy issued prior to July 1, 2006, must renew the license pursuant to the provisions of this article:

1 Provided, however, That a person whose license was issued by the 2 board prior to July 1, 2006, and whose license subsequently lapses 3 may, in the discretion of the board, be subject to the licensing 4 requirements of this section.

5 (c) In addition to provisions for licensure, the rules shall 6 include:

7 (1) Requirements for completion of continuing education hours8 conforming to NCTMB guidelines; and

9 (2) Requirements for issuance of a reciprocal license to 10 licensees of states with requirements which may include the 11 successful completion of the NCTMB examination or other board 12 approved examination.

13 (d) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this 14 section, the board may deny an application for renewal for any 15 reason which would justify the denial of an application for initial 16 licensure.

(e) Any person practicing massage therapy during the time his not her license has lapsed is in violation of this article and is subject to the penalties provided in this article.

20 (f) A massage therapist who is licensed by the board shall be 21 issued a certificate and a license number. The current, valid 22 license certificate shall be publicly displayed and available for 23 inspection by the board and the public at a massage therapist's 24 work site.
