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11	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
12	adding thereto a new article, designated $\$18B-11C-1$ and $\$18B-11C-1$
13	11C-2; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new article,
14	designated \$18B-11D-1, \$18B-11D-2, \$18B-11D-3, \$18B-11D-4,
15	\$18B-11D-5 and $$18B-11D-6$, all relating to higher education
16	centers and institutes generally; setting forth legislative
17	findings and intent; providing definitions; requiring certain
18	reports; creating the Shale Research, Education, Policy and
19	Economic Development Center at West Virginia University;
20	setting forth legislative findings and purposes; requiring
21	certain rules; and providing certain powers and duties of West
22	Virginia University Board of Governors, the center and the
23	center director.
24	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
25	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
26	by adding thereto a new article designated \$18B-11C-1 and \$18B-

- 1 11C-2; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new
- 2 article, designated \$18B-11D-1, \$18B-11D-2, \$18B-11D-3, \$18B-11D-4,
- 3 \$18B-11D-5 and \$18B-11D-6, all to read as follows:
- 4 ARTICLE 11C. COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY CENTERS AND INSTITUTES.
- 5 §18B-11C-1. Findings and purposes; legislative intent.
- 6 (a) The Legislature finds that it is in the best interests of
 7 the citizens of West Virginia for state institutions of higher
 8 education to function within the bounds of the state-established
- o education to function within the bounds of the state-established
- 9 accountability system pursuant to article one-d of this chapter and $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) ^{2}$
- 10 to focus their research efforts diligently on achieving the goals
- 11 and objectives set forth therein and in their institutional
- 12 compacts developed pursuant to section seven, article one-d of this
- 13 chapter.
- 14 (b) The intent of the Legislature in enacting this article is
- 15 to ensure that state institutions of higher education work toward
- 16 furthering the goals of accountability, effectiveness and
- 17 efficiency articulated in the public policy agenda and state
- 18 accountability system, established pursuant to article one-d of
- 19 this chapter; to avoid unnecessary duplication of program
- 20 development and delivery; to ensure that programs and services are
- 21 closely aligned with the mission and approved compact of the
- 22 institution; and to address the public policy agenda.
- 23 \$18B-11C-2. Definition; creation of centers; criteria; proposal
- 24 required.
- 25 (a) For the purposes of this article and article eleven-d of

- 1 this chapter, "center" means any entity created by a state
- 2 institution of higher education with a distinct mission in a
- 3 specific area of research and includes "research centers",
- 4 "research institutes" and "centers of excellence". A center
- 5 consists of an academic team whose stated purposes are to promote
- 6 collaboration and best practices in the targeted research area, to
- 7 further new developments and innovative ways of working and to
- 8 achieve high quality research results.
- 9 (b) Beginning with the effective date of this article, the
- 10 governing board of a state institution of higher education may not
- 11 create a college or university center as defined in subsection (a)
- 12 of this section, regardless of the title by which the center is
- 13 designated, until it first has submitted to the commission or
- 14 council, as appropriate, a proposal to create the center. The
- 15 proposal shall be submitted at least sixty days prior to the
- 16 official creation of the center and shall contain the following
- 17 information:
- 18 (1) Center name and governance structure. -
- 19 (A) The name of the proposed center and an outline showing how
- 20 the center will be governed and operate;
- 21 (B) The name of the director or names of codirectors or, if a
- 22 director has not been selected, the process by which this
- 23 individual will be appointed; and
- 24 (C) Designation of the entity responsibility for developing
- 25 rules and policies for the center.
- 26 (2) Center mission and goals. -

- 1 (A) The mission of the center showing how it differs in focus
- 2 and scope from all other centers established at the institution;
- 3 (B) The need for the new center with supporting documentation
- 4 drawn from the institutional compact, mission statement and public
- 5 policy agenda;
- 6 (C) Demonstration of how the center will contribute in unique
- 7 ways to expanding knowledge, generating new discoveries and
- 8 providing positive societal impacts; and
- 9 (D) An explanation of why a new center is required to complete
- 10 the planned research activities, including a description of
- 11 strengths that establishing a center may bring to the institution
- 12 and the state of West Virginia.
- 13 (3) Staff and resources. -
- 14 (A) The faculty, resources, facilities and peripherals that
- 15 constitute the center and the resources that will be dedicated to
- 16 support of the center and its mission;
- 17 (B) Existence of a critical mass in the specific or
- 18 interdisciplinary area of research, including interdisciplinary
- 19 research activities that provide evidence of the potential for
- 20 collaboration of researchers within the center;
- 21 (C) The researchers, academic rank, department and expected
- 22 contribution to the center to be made by each member, including
- 23 strengths that the researchers bring to the center and a brief
- 24 academic biography of each researcher;
- 25 (D) A record of available funding and the potential for
- 26 attracting external funding to further the goals of the center and

- 1 make it self supporting;
- 2 (E) Resources that have been secured from external sources and 3 a rationale for resources requested from the state; and
- 4 (F) Documentation showing how the center's distinct mission 5 and organization eliminate unnecessary competition for resources, 6 students and faculty within the state; drive economic development; 7 generate talent; and create an energized, entrepreneurial 8 environment that retains top quality graduates.
- 9 (c) The center director shall provide a report to the 10 commission or council, as appropriate, annually on the anniversary 11 date of the center's creation giving details of the center's 12 activities for the past year, including funding specifics.
- (d) The commission or council, as appropriate, shall analyze each proposal received and present a summary to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability within sixty days after receiving the institution's proposal. The commission or council also shall summarize the center's annual report and present to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability and the Joint Committee on Government and Finance within thirty days of receiving the report.
- 21 ARTICLE 11D. SHALE RESEARCH, EDUCATION, POLICY AND ECONOMIC
 22 DEVELOPMENT CENTER AT WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY.
- 23 §18B-11D-1. Legislative findings.
- 24 (a) The Legislature finds that advancements in technology have 25 made possible the efficient development of abundant natural gas and

- 1 oil resources contained in underground shales and other geologic
- 2 formations in the State of West Virginia. These resources have the
- 3 potential to generate jobs, stimulate economic activity, ensure
- 4 energy security, reduce carbon and other emissions and provide
- 5 significant revenues to the state.
- 6 (b) The Legislature further finds that creation of a research,
- 7 education, policy and economic development entity at West Virginia
- 8 University for the purpose of pursuing independent, objective,
- 9 research-driven analysis that can improve the effective and
- 10 efficient development of shale resources is in furtherance of the
- 11 university's land grant status. Creation of this entity will allow
- 12 West Virginia to focus on the prudent development and regulation of
- 13 natural gas and liquid hydrocarbon from the shale resources in the
- 14 state and throughout the world.
- 15 §18B-11D-2. Creation of the Shale Research, Education, Policy and
- 16 Economic Development Center at West Virginia University;
- purposes.
- 18 (a) In view of the findings set forth in section one of this
- 19 article, there is created a research, education, policy and
- 20 economic development entity known as the Shale Research, Education,
- 21 Policy and Economic Development Center at West Virginia University.
- 22 This center is not required to file a precreation proposal with the
- 23 commission pursuant to section two, article eleven-c of this
- 24 chapter.
- 25 (b) The purposes for which the center are established include,

- 1 but are not limited to, the following:
- 2 (1) Providing an opportunity for West Virginia University to
- 3 partner with industry and government bodies in the state, the
- 4 nation and around the world to explore opportunities and engage in
- 5 scientific research and development of shale resources;
- 6 (2) Promoting cooperative and collaborative partnerships
- 7 between research universities in the state in order to facilitate
- 8 knowledge sharing that will benefit all areas of West Virginia;
- 9 (3) Generating and documenting best practices in the areas of
- 10 environment, safety, business and health;
- 11 (3) Advancing environmental performance by garnering industry
- 12 and regulatory commitment;
- 13 (4) Improving data and process transparency and developing
- 14 effective outreach and engagement of affected communities;
- 15 (5) Protecting the environment of West Virginia and
- 16 surrounding states by minimizing methane, carbon dioxide and any
- 17 other potential emissions;
- 18 (6) Structuring legal frameworks and promulgating rules to
- 19 promote prudent development of and access to the state's resources.
- 20 (7) Developing and maintaining a flexible structure to
- 21 accommodate the needs of the state and of West Virginia University
- 22 together with its partners in education, government and industry.
- 23 This flexible structure can be achieved by encouraging the
- 24 following actions:
- 25 (A) Investment by state and federal sources in strategic
- 26 research;

- 1 (B) Initiation of research and development programs that are
- 2 focused and cofunded by West Virginia University and its government
- 3 and industry partners;
- 4 (C) Development of applied research that is industry-funded;
 5 and
- 6 (D) Provision of specialized services for government and 7 industry partners.
- 8 (c) West Virginia University shall use its research 9 capabilities in support of the center, including, but not limited 10 to, the following:
- 11 (1) Technologies for efficient resource assessment and 12 efficient extraction. These include various improvements to 13 extraction technologies, earth imaging and other technologies to 14 map, evaluate and assess resources and to understand geoprocesses;
- 15 (2) Models to predict and manipulate multiphase fluid flow 16 including gas, liquid hydrocarbons and hydraulic fracture fluids; 17 and water life cycle analysis from source through staging, use, 18 wastewater recycling and treatment.
- 19 (3) Environmental and economic impacts, such as fuel cycle 20 analysis and construction of statewide baselines for water and air 21 quality, control of emissions and fuel waste in all cycles of 22 energy production and delivery;
- (4) Policy analysis to facilitate cost effective permitting, 24 industry management, regulation and acceptance; and improved 25 gathering, storage, analysis, transparency and access of energy 26 data to serve government, industry and the public.

- 1 (5) Human dimensions, such as workforce development, in 2 cooperation with public education and state institutions of higher 3 education in programs specializing in energy and environment 4 fields; analysis of public health risks and promotion of best 5 practices to protect public health and work place health and 6 safety;
- 8 understandings of expectations and awareness of issues and facts
 9 and to assist state agencies in developing a transparent, efficient
 10 and effective environment to manage the oil and natural gas
 11 resources for the benefit of all the state's citizens. These
 12 agencies include the West Virginia Department of Environmental
 13 Protection, West Virginia State Tax Division and the West Virginia
 14 Geologic and Economic Survey. The purposes of the communication
 15 strategies are to ensure that development of these resources is
 16 tracked accurately, that appropriate revenue streams are captured
 17 by the state and that royalties to mineral lessors are protected
 18 appropriately;
- 19 (7) Development of best business practices to assist in 20 creating and maintaining a robust and prudently positioned industry 21 in the state; and
- 22 (8) Tracking and analyzing the economic impact and effect of 23 the industry upon the state.

24 **§18B-11D-3**. Funding.

25 (a) Funding for the center is provided by legislative 26 appropriation and through support received from private industry,

- 1 federal and international sources.
- 2 (b) Nothing in this article requires an appropriation, nor any
- 3 specific level of appropriation, by the Legislature.
- 4 §18B-11D-4. Powers and duties of the board of governors and the
- 5 Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic Development
- 6 Center at West Virginia University.
- 7 (a) West Virginia University Board of Governors. The board
- 8 is authorized to operate the center to further the purposes set
- 9 forth in this article. Powers and duties include, but are not
- 10 limited to, the following:
- 11 (1) Acquisition by purchase, lease, gift or otherwise, of
- 12 necessary lands, and the construction of necessary buildings and
- 13 appropriate industrial operations equipment;
- 14 (2) Expansion, remodeling, altering or equipping necessary
- 15 buildings;
- 16 (3) Making contracts with any state, county or municipal
- 17 agency or private entity necessary and incidental to the
- 18 performance of its powers and duties under this article;
- 19 (4) Providing for equipment, expenses, compensation of
- 20 personnel, operation and maintenance of any facility of an agency
- 21 or institution used for the purposes of this article; and
- 22 (5) Cooperating with other state research universities,
- 23 agencies of the state, county and federal governments.
- 24 (b) The Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic
- 25 Development Center at West Virginia University. Under the

1 supervision of the director, appointed pursuant to section five of

2 this article, and within the scope of the authority granted by this

3 article and by rules duly proposed and adopted by the board of

4 governors pursuant to section six, article one of this chapter, the

5 center may take all actions necessary to fulfill the established

6 purposes including providing the research capabilities set forth in

7 section two of this article.

8 §18B-11D-5. Powers and duties of the center director.

- 9 (a) Subject to rules promulgated by the board of governors
- 10 pursuant to section six of this article, the President of West
- 11 Virginia University shall appoint a director of the center who will
- 12 serve at the will and pleasure of the president.
- 13 (b) The director has the following responsibilities:
- 14 (1) Within thirty days of appointment, provide to the
- 15 commission a proposal for operation of the center containing
- 16 information as set forth in section two, article eleven-c of this
- 17 chapter;
- 18 (2) Manage the day-to-day operations of the center;
- 19 (3) Coordinate the partnerships and act as the liaison between
- 20 education, industry and government bodies and other entities as
- 21 appropriate to address the findings set forth in section one of
- 22 this article;
- 23 (4) Develop and advocate for an annual budget for the center;
- 24 (5) Report to the board of governors annually or as requested
- 25 and provide an analysis of the center's activities together with
- 26 any recommendations for improvement;

- 1 (6) Provide to the commission a report annually on the 2 anniversary date of the center's creation giving details of the 3 center's activities for the past year, including funding specifics; 4 and
- 5 (7) Employ adequate professional, technical and other staff 6 necessary to fulfill the purposes of this article.

7 **§18B-11D-6**. Rules.

- 8 (a) The board of governors shall propose and adopt rules
 9 pursuant to section six, article one of this chapter, for the
 10 establishment, operation, cost reimbursement, fees for services,
 11 maintenance and government control of the center established by
 12 this article.
- 13 (b) The board may propose and adopt rules necessary for 14 cooperation under and compliance with any existing or future 15 federal statutes pertaining to grants-in-aid and any other rules 16 necessary to effectuate the purposes of this article.
