14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That §8-22-25 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

22	§8-22-25. Retirement pensions.
23	(a) Any member of a paid police or fire department who is

1 entitled to a retirement pension hereunder, and who has been in the 2 honorable service of such department for twenty years, may, upon 3 written application to the board of trustees, be retired from all such department without medical examination in 5 disability. On such retirement the board of trustees shall 6 authorize the payment of annual retirement pension benefits 7 commencing upon his the member's retirement or upon his the 8 member's attaining the age of fifty years, whichever is later, 9 payable in twelve monthly installments for each year of the 10 remainder of his the member's life, in an amount equal to sixty 11 percent of such member's average annual salary or compensation 12 received during the three twelve-consecutive-month periods of 13 employment with such department in which such member received his 14 the member's highest salary or compensation while a member of the 15 department, or an amount of \$500 per month, whichever is greater. 16 (b) Any member of any such department who is entitled to a 17 retirement pension under the provisions of subsection (a) of this 18 section and who has been in the honorable service of such 19 department for more than twenty years at the time of his the 20 member's retirement shall receive, in addition to the sixty percent 21 authorized in said subsection (a) of this section:

(1) Two additional percent, to be added to the sixty percent

- 2 (2) One additional percent, to be added to such maximum of 3 seventy percent, for each of the first five additional years of 4 service completed at the time of retirement in excess of 5 twenty-five years of service up to a maximum of seventy-five 6 percent.
- 7 The total additional credit provided for in this subsection 8 may not exceed fifteen additional percent.
- 9 (c) Any member of any such department whose service has been 10 interrupted by duty with the Armed Forces of the United States as 11 provided in section twenty-seven of this article prior to July 1, 12 1981, shall be eligible for retirement pension benefits immediately 13 upon retirement, regardless of his the member's age, if he the 14 member shall otherwise be eligible for such retirement pension 15 benefits.
- Any member or previously retired member of any such department who has served in active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States as described in section twenty-seven of this article, whether prior to or subsequent to becoming a member of a paid police or fire department covered by the provisions of this article, shall receive, in addition to the sixty percent authorized in subsection (a) of this section and the additional percent credit authorized in subsection (b) of this section, one additional percent for each year so served in active military duty, up to a

- 1 maximum of four additional percent. In no event, however, may the
- 2 total benefit granted to any member exceed seventy-five percent of
- 3 the member's annual average salary calculated in accordance with
- 4 subsection (a) of this section.
- (d) Any member of a paid police or fire department shall be 6 retired at the age of sixty-five years in the manner provided in 7 this subsection. When a member of the paid police or fire 8 department reaches the age of sixty-five years, the said board of 9 trustees shall notify the mayor of this fact, within thirty days of 10 such member's sixty-fifth birthday. The mayor shall cause such 11 sixty-five-year-old member of the paid police or fire department to 12 retire within a period of not more than thirty additional days. 13 Upon retirement under the provisions of this subsection, such 14 member shall receive retirement pension benefits payable in twelve 15 monthly installments for each year of the remainder of his the 16 member's life in an amount equal to sixty percent of such member's 17 average annual salary or compensation received during the three 18 twelve-consecutive-month periods of employment with such department 19 in which such member received his the member's highest salary or 20 compensation while a member of the department, or an amount of \$500 21 per month, whichever is greater. If such member has been employed 22 in said department for more than twenty years, the provisions of 23 subsection (b) of this section shall apply.
- 24 (e) It shall be the duty of each member of a paid police or

1 fire department at the time a fund is hereafter established to 2 furnish the necessary proof of his the member's date of birth to 3 the said board of trustees, as specified in section twenty-three of 4 this article, within a reasonable length of time, said length of 5 time to be determined by the said board of trustees. 6 board of trustees and the mayor shall proceed to act in the manner 7 provided in subsection (d) of this section and shall cause all 8 members of the paid police or fire department who are over the age 9 of sixty-five years to retire in not less than sixty days from the 10 date the fund is established. Upon retirement under the provisions 11 of this subsection, (e) such member, whether he the member has been 12 employed in said department for twenty years or not, shall receive 13 retirement pension benefits payable in twelve monthly installments 14 for each year of the remainder of his the member's life in an 15 amount equal to sixty percent of such member's average annual 16 salarv compensation received during the three or 17 twelve-consecutive-month periods of employment with such department 18 in which such member received his the member's highest salary or 19 compensation while a member of the department, or an amount of \$500 20 per month, whichever is greater. If such member has been employed 21 in said department for more than twenty years, the provisions of 22 subsection (b) of this section shall apply.

(f) Notwithstanding any provision in the code to the contrary,

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- 1 sixty-five while continuing to receive retirement benefits.
- 2 However, in such an instance, the retired member is not eligible to
- 3 continue his or her participation as a contributing member of the
- 4 pension fund and shall not continue to accrue any additional
- 5 service credit or benefits in the pension fund related to the
- 6 continued service.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit a retired police officer to be hired as a chief of police and continue to receive retirement benefits. The bill also limits such a person from paying into or to accrue any additional benefits related to the continued service.
