21	ARTICLE 2. CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON.
22	§61-2-31. Unlawful impersonation over Internet; penalty;
23	definitions; supplemental to other laws.

- 1 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person may
- 2 not knowingly and without consent impersonate another person
- 3 through or on an Internet website or by other electronic means for
- 4 purposes of harming, intimidating, threatening or defrauding
- 5 another person.
- 6 (b) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section is
- 7 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be
- 8 fined not less than \$250 and not more than \$1,000, or confined in
- 9 jail not more than one year, or both fined and confined.
- 10 (c) For purposes of this section:
- 11 (1) An impersonation is credible if another person would
- 12 reasonably believe, or did reasonably believe, that the defendant
- 13 was or is the person who was impersonated; and
- 14 (2) "Electronic means" includes, but is not limited to,
- 15 opening an e-mail account, registering a website domain name or
- 16 opening an account or profile on a social networking Internet
- 17 website in another person's name.
- 18 (d) This section is supplemental to any other provision of
- 19 law and does not preclude prosecution under any other provision of
- 20 law.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the offense of online impersonation for purposes of harming, intimidating, threatening or defrauding another person.
