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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by	
11	adding thereto a new section, designated §18-9A-5a; and to	
12	amend and reenact §18A-4-15 of said code, all relating to	
13	permitting a county superintendent, subject to the approval of	
14	the county board, to hire three service personnel workers on	
15	a full-time basis as itinerants to meet the day-to-day need	
16	for substitutes in the service personnel area; providing that	
17	the itinerants shall not count against the county in the	
18	calculation of the school aid formula; and providing a	
19	provision should the hiring of the three full time substitutes	
20	be insufficient to meet the need for substitute service	
21	personnel on any given day.	

22 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended 24 by adding thereto a new section, designated \$18-9A-5a; and that

1 \$18A-4-15 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as
2 follows:

3 CHAPTER 18. EDUCATION.

4 ARTICLE 9A. PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPPORT.

5 §18-9A-5a. Hiring of substitute service personnel on full-time
6 basis.

7 <u>The county superintendent, subject to the approval of the</u> 8 <u>county board, may hire three service personnel workers from the</u> 9 <u>substitute list, based on seniority, on a full-time basis as</u> 10 <u>itinerants to meet the day-to-day need for substitutes in the</u> 11 <u>service personnel areas. These three itinerants are not counted</u> 12 <u>against the county in the calculation of the school aid formula.</u>

13 CHAPTER 18A. SCHOOL PERSONNEL.

14 ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.

15 §18A-4-15. Employment of service personnel substitutes.

16 <u>(a) If the full-time substitutes hired in section five-a,</u> 17 <u>article nine-a, chapter eighteen of this code are insufficient to</u> 18 <u>meet the need for substitute service personnel on any given day the</u> 19 provisions of this section are to be followed.

20 (a) (b) The county board shall employ and the county 21 superintendent, subject to the approval of the county board, shall 22 assign substitute service personnel on the basis of seniority to 23 perform any of the following duties:

(1) To fill the temporary absence of another service employee;
 (2) To fill the position of a regular service person as
 3 follows:

4 (A) If the regular service person requests a leave of absence 5 from the county board in writing and is granted the leave in 6 writing by the county board; or

7 (B) If the regular service person is on workers' compensation8 and absent.

9 (C) If an absence pursuant to paragraph (A) or (B) of this 10 subdivision is to extend beyond thirty working days, the county 11 board shall post the position of the absent employee under the 12 procedures set forth in section eight-b of this article. If a 13 substitute service person is employed to fill the position of the 14 absent employee and is employed in the position for twenty or more 15 working days, the substitute service person:

16 (i) Acquires regular employment status with the exception of 17 regular employee job bidding rights;

18 (ii) Does not accrue regular seniority; and

(iii) Is accorded all other rights, privileges and benefits 20 pertaining to the position until the regular employee returns to 21 the position or ceases to be employed by the county board;

(D) If a regular or substitute employee fills a vacancy that is related in any manner to a leave of absence or the absence of an employee on workers' compensation as provided in this section, upon

1 termination of the absence the employee shall be returned to his or 2 her original position or status;

3 (E) A service person may not be:

4 (i) Required to request or to take a leave of absence; or
5 (ii) Deprived of any right or privilege of regular employment
6 status for refusal to request or failure to take a leave of
7 absence;

8 (3) To perform the service of a service person who is 9 authorized to be absent from duties without loss of pay;

10 (4) To temporarily fill a vacancy in a permanent position 11 caused by severance of employment by the resignation, transfer, 12 retirement, permanent disability, dismissal pursuant to section 13 eight, article two of this chapter, or death of the regular service 14 person who had been assigned to the position. Within twenty 15 working days from the commencement of the vacancy, the county board 16 shall fill the vacancy under the procedures set forth in section 17 eight-b of this article and section five, article two of this 18 chapter. The person hired to fill the vacancy shall have and be 19 accorded all rights, privileges and benefits pertaining to the 20 position;

21 (5) To fill the vacancy created by a regular employee's 22 suspension.

(A) If the suspension is for more than thirty working days,24 the county board shall post the position of the suspended employee

1 under the procedures set forth in section eight-b of this article.
2 (B) If a substitute service person is employed to fill the
3 suspended employee's position, the substitute service person:

4 (i) Acquires regular employment status with the exception of 5 regular employee job-bidding rights;

6 (ii) Does not accrue regular seniority; and

7 (iii) Is accorded all other rights, privileges and benefits 8 pertaining to the position until the termination by the county 9 board becomes final or the suspended employee is returned to 10 employment.

11 (C) If the suspended employee is not returned to his or her 12 job, the county board shall fill the vacancy under the procedures 13 set forth in section eight-b of this article and section five, 14 article two of this chapter; and

15 (6) To fill temporarily a vacancy in a newly created position 16 prior to employing a service person on a regular basis pursuant to 17 section eight-b of this article.

18 (b) (c) Service personnel substitutes shall be assigned in the 19 following manner:

(1) The substitute with the greatest length of service time in the vacant category of employment has priority in accepting the assignment throughout the period of the regular service person's absence or until the vacancy is filled on a regular basis pursuant to section eight-b of this article. Length of service time is

1 calculated from the date a substitute service person begins 2 assigned duties as a substitute in a particular category of 3 employment.

4 (2) All service personnel substitutes are employed on a 5 rotating basis according to their lengths of service time until 6 each substitute has had an opportunity to perform similar 7 assignments.

8 (3) Any regular service person employed in the same building 9 or working station and the same classification category of 10 employment as the absent employee shall be given the first 11 opportunity to fill the position of the absent employee on a 12 rotating and seniority basis. In such case the regular service 13 person's position is filled by a substitute service person. A 14 regular service person assigned to fill the position of an absent 15 employee has the opportunity to hold that position throughout the 16 absence. For the purpose of this section only, all regularly 17 employed school bus operators are considered to be employed within 18 the same building or working station.

19 (c) (d) The county board shall return a regular school service 20 person to the same position held prior to any approved leave of 21 absence or period of recovery from injury or illness. The school 22 service person:

(1) Retains all rights, privileges and benefits which had24 accrued at the time of the absence or accrued under any other

1 provision of law during the absence; and

2 (2) Has all rights, privileges and benefits generally accorded3 school service personnel at the time of return to work.

4 (d) (e) The salary of a substitute service person is 5 determined:

6 (1) Based upon his or her years of employment as defined in7 section eight of this article;

8 (2) As provided in the state minimum pay scale set forth in 9 section eight-a of this article; and

10 (3) In accordance with the salary schedule of persons 11 regularly employed in the same position in the county in which he 12 or she is employed.

13 (e) (f) A substitute service person shall execute a written 14 contract with the county board pursuant to section five, article 15 two of this chapter, prior to beginning assigned duties.

16 (f) (g) The following method shall be used to establish a 17 fair, equitable and uniform system for assigning service personnel 18 substitutes to their duties for the first time:

(1) The initial order of assigning newly-employed substitutes of is determined by a random selection system established by the affected substitute employees and approved by the county board; and (2) The initial order is effective only until the substitute service personnel have begun their duties for the first time.

24 (g) (h) A substitute service person who has worked thirty days

1 for a school system has all rights pertaining to suspension, 2 dismissal and contract renewal as are granted to regular service 3 personnel in sections six, seven, eight and eight-a, article two of 4 this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit a county superintendent, subject to the approval of the county board, to hire three service personnel workers from the substitute list, based on seniority, on a full-time basis as itinerants to meet the day-to-day need for substitutes in the service personnel area. The bill provides that the itinerants do not count against the county in the calculation of the school aid formula. The bill also provides a provision should the hiring of the three full time substitutes prove to be insufficient to meet the need for substitute service personnel on any given day.
