1(a) No person may impede, intimidate or interfere with a2member of the Legislature who is engaged in the performance of his3or her official duties or on account of such performance.4(b) Any person who violates subsection (a) of this section is5guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be6fined not more than \$500 or confined in jail for not more than

7 thirty days, or both fined and confined.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make it a crime to interfere with a member of the Legislature while engaged in the performance of his or her official duties. The bill also provides for misdemeanor penalties.
