10	A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-6-2 of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to traffic regulations and laws of
12	the road; speed restrictions; and authorizing the Commissioner
13	of Highways to raise the speed limit for cars and one ton
14	trucks on certain portions of Interstate highways.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That \$17C-6-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 6. SPEED RESTRICTIONS.
19	§17C-6-2. Establishment of state speed zones.
20	Whenever the state road commissioner Commissioner of Highways
21	shall determine upon the basis of an engineering and traffic
22	investigation that any speed limit set forth in this article is
23	greater or less than is reasonable or safe under the conditions
24	found to exist at any intersection or other place or upon any part
25	of a highway, said the commissioner may determine and declare a

- 1 reasonable and safe speed limit thereat which shall be effective at
- 2 all times or during hours of daylight or darkness or at such other
- 3 times as may be determined when appropriate signs giving notice
- 4 thereof are erected at such intersection or other place or part of
- 5 the highway.
- 6 The commissioner may raise the speed limit for cars and one
- 7 ton trucks, only, from seventy miles per hour to seventy-five miles
- 8 per hour on those portions of Interstate highways that have a daily
- 9 traffic count, based on annual statistics, of twenty-five thousand
- 10 <u>or less.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Commissioner of Highways to raise the speed limit for cars and one ton trucks on certain portions of Interstate highways.
