1 §61-7B-1. Legislative intent.

- 2 It is the intention of the Legislature in the enactment of
- 3 this article to clarify that any federal law which attempts to ban
- 4 a semi-automatic firearm or to limit the size of a magazine of a
- 5 firearm or other limitation on firearms in this state shall be
- 6 unenforceable in West Virginia in order to protect the rights of
- 7 sportsmen and sportswomen and further protect and preserve the
- 8 tenth amendment rights of the citizens of West Virginia under the
- 9 Constitution of the United States of America.

- penalties.
- 12 (a) No public officer or employee of the state, a county or
- 13 municipality or dealer selling any firearm in this state may
- 14 enforce or attempt to enforce any act, law, statute, rule or
- 15 regulation of the United States government relating to a personal
- 16 firearm, firearm accessory or ammunition that is owned or
- 17 manufactured commercially or privately in West Virginia and that
- 18 remains exclusively within the borders of West Virginia.
- 19 (b) Any official, agent or employee of the United States
- 20 government who enforces or attempts to enforce any act, order, law,
- 21 statute, rule or regulation of the United States government upon a
- 22 personal firearm, a firearm accessory or ammunition that is owned
- 23 or manufactured commercially or privately in West Virginia and that
- 24 remains exclusively within the borders of West Virginia is guilty

- 15 any magazine of a firearm; or
- 16 (2) Require any firearm, magazine or other firearm accessory

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that any federal law which attempts to ban a semi-automatic firearm or to limit the size of a magazine of a firearm or other limitation on firearms in this state shall be unenforceable in West Virginia. The bill also authorizes the Attorney General to defend West Virginia citizens prosecuted for violation of such a federal law; provides a felony criminal penalty for persons who attempt to enforce such a federal

law; and, provides for an effective date upon passage.
