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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$61-7-6$ and $\$61-7-6a$ of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to allowing a
12	resident of another state to carry a handgun in West Virginia
13	if the person holds a valid permit or license to possess or
14	carry a handgun from the other state.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That $\$61-7-6$ and $\$61-7-6a$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
17	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 7. DANGEROUS WEAPONS.
19	§61-7-6. Exceptions as to prohibitions against carrying concealed
20	deadly weapons.
21	The licensure provisions set forth in this article do not
22	apply to:
23	(1) Any person:
24	(A) Carrying a deadly weapon upon his or her own premises; nor
25	shall anything herein prevent a person from

- 1 (B) Carrying $\frac{any}{a}$ firearm, unloaded, from the place of
- 2 purchase to his or her home, residence or place of business or to
- 3 a place of repair and back to his or her home, residence or place
- 4 of business; nor shall anything herein prohibit a person or
- 5 (C) From possessing a firearm while hunting in a lawful manner
- 6 or while traveling from his or her home, residence or place of
- 7 business to a hunting site and returning to his or her home,
- 8 residence or place of business;
- 9 (2) Any person who is a member of a properly organized
- 10 target-shooting club authorized by law to obtain firearms by
- 11 purchase or requisition from this state or from the United States
- 12 for the purpose of target practice from carrying any pistol, as
- 13 defined in this article, unloaded, from his or her home, residence
- 14 or place of business to a place of target practice and from any
- 15 place of target practice back to his or her home, residence or
- 16 place of business, for using any such weapon at a place of target
- 17 practice in training and improving his or her skill in the use of
- 18 the weapons;
- 19 (3) Any law-enforcement officer or law-enforcement official as
- 20 defined in section one, article twenty-nine, chapter thirty of this
- 21 code;
- 22 (4) Any employee of the West Virginia Division of Corrections
- 23 duly appointed pursuant to the provisions of section five, article
- 24 five, chapter twenty-eight of this code while the employee is on

- 1 duty;
- 2 (5) Any member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the 3 militia of this state while the member is on duty;
- 4 (6) Any circuit judge, including any retired circuit judge 5 designated senior status by the Supreme Court of Appeals of West 6 Virginia, prosecuting attorney, assistant prosecuting attorney or 7 a duly appointed investigator employed by a prosecuting attorney;
- 8 (7) Any resident of another state who holds a valid <u>permit or</u>
 9 license to <u>possess or carry a concealed weapon handgun issued</u> by a
 10 state or a political subdivision which has entered into a
 11 reciprocity agreement with this state, subject to the provisions
 12 and limitations set forth in section six-a of this article;
- 13 (8) Any federal law-enforcement officer or federal police 14 officer authorized to carry a weapon in the performance of the 15 officer's duty; and
- 16 (9) Any Hatfield-McCoy Regional Recreation Authority Ranger 17 while the ranger is on duty.
- 18 **§61-7-6a**. Reciprocity <u>and recognition;</u> out-of-state concealed

 19 handgun permits.
- 20 (a) A holder of a valid out-of-state permit or license to
 21 possess or carry a concealed handgun as issued by another state
 22 with which the State of West Virginia has executed a reciprocity
 23 agreement shall be recognized as is valid in this state for the
 24 carrying of a concealed handgun, if the following conditions are

1 met:

- 2 (1) The permit or license holder is 21 years of age or older;
- 3 (2) The permit or license is in his or her immediate 4 possession; and
- 5 (3) The permit or license holder is not a resident of the 6 State of West Virginia. and
- 7 (4) The State of West Virginia has executed a valid and
- 8 effective reciprocity agreement with the issuing state pertaining
- 9 to the carrying and verification of concealed handgun licenses and
- 10 permits issued in the respective states.
- 11 (b) A holder of a valid permit or license from another state
- 12 who is authorized to carry a concealed handgun in this state
- 13 pursuant to provisions of this section is subject to the same laws
- 14 and restrictions with respect to carrying a concealed handgun as a
- 15 resident of West Virginia who is so permitted, and must carry the
- 16 concealed handgun in compliance with the laws of this state.
- 17 (c) A license or permit from another state is not valid in
- 18 this state if the holder is or becomes prohibited by law the laws
- 19 of this state or the United States from possessing a firearm.
- 20 (d) The West Virginia Attorney General shall seek to enter
- 21 into and may execute reciprocity agreements on behalf of the State
- 22 of West Virginia with states which meet the following standards and
- 23 requirements:
- 24 (1) The standards applied by the other state before issuing a

- 1 concealed handgun license or permit must be similar to or greater
- 2 than the standards imposed by this article;
- 3 (2) This state's law-enforcement officers have continuous
- 4 access to databases on the criminal information network,
- 5 8twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week, to verify the
- 6 continued validity of any license or permit to carry a concealed
- 7 handgun that has been granted by the issuing state;
- 8 (3) The other state agrees to grant the right to carry a
- 9 concealed handgun to residents of West Virginia who have valid
- 10 concealed handgun permits issued pursuant to this article in their
- 11 possession while carrying concealed weapons in that state; and
- 12 (4) The states agree to apprise one another of changes in
- 13 permitting standards and requirements, to provide for a prompt
- 14 reexamination of whether any adopted change in licensing or
- 15 permitting standards negates the states' ability to continue with
- 16 the reciprocity agreement.
- 17 (e) The West Virginia State Police shall maintain a registry
- 18 of states with which the State of West Virginia has entered into
- 19 reciprocity agreements on the criminal information network and make
- 20 the registry available to law-enforcement officers for
- 21 investigative purposes. for the recognition of concealed handgun
- 22 permits issued pursuant to this article.
- $\frac{\text{(f)}}{\text{(e)}}$ Every twelve months after the effective date of this
- 24 section, the West Virginia Attorney General shall make written

- 1 inquiry of the concealed handgun licensing or permitting
- 2 authorities in each other state as to: (i) Whether a West Virginia
- 3 resident may carry a concealed handgun in their state based upon
- 4 having a valid West Virginia concealed handgun permit; and (ii)
- 5 whether a West Virginia resident may carry a concealed handgun in
- 6 that state based upon having a valid West Virginia concealed
- 7 handgun permit, pursuant to the laws of that state or by the
- 8 execution of a valid reciprocity agreement between the states.
- 9 (g) (f) The West Virginia State Police shall make available to
- 10 the public a list of states which have entered into reciprocity
- 11 agreements with the State of West Virginia.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide full faith and credit to nonresidents who have permits or licenses to carry handguns in their states.
