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10 A BILL to amend and reenact article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of
11 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the
12 Board of Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to
13 practitioner requirements for accessing the West Virginia
14 controlled substances monitoring program data base.

15 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

16 That article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
17 as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

18 **ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO**
19 **PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

20 **§64-9-1. Board of Medicine.**

21 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on the
22 twenty-eighth day of August, two thousand twelve, authorized under
23 the authority of section five-a, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of
24 this code, modified by the Board of Medicine to meet the objections

1 of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the
2 State Register on the sixth day of December, two thousand twelve,
3 relating to the Board of Medicine (practitioner requirements for
4 accessing the West Virginia controlled substances monitoring
5 program data base, [11 CSR 10](#)), is authorized.

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7 NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of
8 Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Practitioner
9 Requirements for Accessing the West Virginia Controlled Substances
10 Monitoring Program Data Base.

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12 This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and
13 underscoring have been omitted.
